CITIZENS'
ADVISORY
COMMITTEE

Rose. Mr. Gardner composed a letter of invitation for members on a Citizens' Advisory Committee. A mailing list of all clubs and organizations was secured and the letter of invitation was sent to each of these groups. To date, 9 persons have been appointed by their organizations to serve on the Citizens' Advisory Committee. An organizational meeting of this committee was discussed and Mr. Gardner was authorized to call such a meeting when he had sufficient membership to get the Committee's work under way.

DUTIES OF
CITIZENS'
ADVISORY
COMMITTEE

2. A discussion was held on the duties of a Citizens' Advisory Committee. It was suggested that the board present the problems to the Committee and they, in turn, would investigate and report to the board their findings. The board is also to investigate the problems as well. Mr. Gardner suggested several areas in which the committee could work. After some discussion, it was decided that the Citizens' Advisory Committee could be of most service in its initial assignment working on the bond elections.

BOND
ELECTION

3. Considerable discussion was conducted relative to proposals to be submitted to the electorate. Several statements were made from the audience including statements by school administrators which confirmed opinions that a combination of bond proposals should be submitted for a vote at one time. This combination would consist of bond assumption, local bonds, and state aid proposals. The board gave careful consideration to all opinions expressed and searched diligently for any disagreement with the idea of submitting the three proposals to a vote. Everyone in the audience seemed to concur that the board should take action submitting the three proposals at one election. Therefore, it was moved by Mr. Hughes and seconded by Mr. Gardner that an election be held for bond assumption, \$3,000,000 for local bonds and \$5,000,000 for state aid. This election is to be consolidated with the trustee election on April 16, 1963.

PREPARE
DOCUMENTS

4. Mr. Gardner mentioned the necessary documents to be prepared for signatures for conducting an election. Dr. Stallings was directed to prepare the necessary papers for board signatures.

PURCHASING
POLICY

5. After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Hughes and seconded by Mr. Gardner that the Proposed Purchasing Policy, Items A-1 through 7 only of the General Policy be accepted.

6. It was moved by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Hughes that expenses of \$30.18 for supplies be approved.

1. It was moved by Mr. Pentland and seconded by Mr. Johnson that travel expenses incurred by the board investigating the background of superintendent applicants be approved.

Mr. Frank Vogel suggested that the superintendent and principals of the schools in the Jurupa Unified School District make their residence in the Jurupa area with reasonable time be given for the move. He also suggested that the West Riverside School name be changed to the Ernie Miller School.

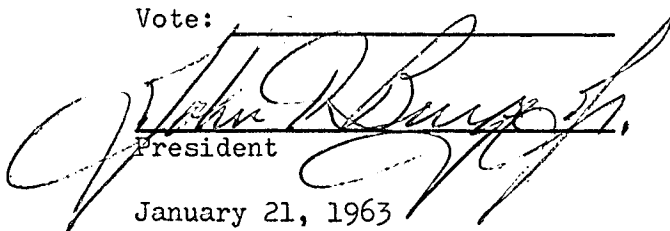
The board returned to a regular meeting from the adjourned Executive Session at 11:00 p.m. President Burge adjourned the meeting at 11:05 p.m.

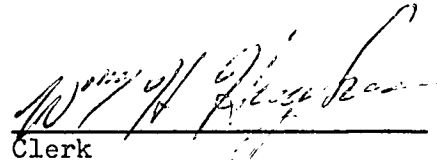
