PROPOSED CERTIFICATED SALARY SCHEDULE Dr. Hummel introduced Mr. Bill Vernon, chairman of the certificated salary committee for a report on the proposed certificated salary schedule. Mr. Vernon named his committee members, and approximately one hour was spent in presenting the certificated salary proposal.

Mr. Hughes thanked Mr. Vernon for his fine presentation and the committee for their efforts and the time given to working out so complete a schedule. He stated the report would be taken under advisement until the costs and budget could be refined.

SUMMER SCHOOL

Dr. Norton and Mr. Rowe reported briefly on the summer school program. Tentative dates were announced as July 1 through August 12 inclusive.

PUPIL PERSONNEL REPORT Mrs. Kutch, Coordinator Pupil Personnel, reported on progress being made with the Pupil Personnel program. She recommended use of the Riverside City elementary and secondary cummulative record forms. This would afford students of the Jurupa Unified District a comprehensive integrated record of their progress from kindergarten through 12th grade.

ASS'T PRINCIPAL CANDIDATES Dr. Hummel reported that the screening of candidates for Assistant Principal had been narrowed down to three outside applicants and four inside applicants. Interview appointments had been set up for the week of April 22 and 29.

EMPLOYEES AND SALARIES Dr. Hummel advised the Board he and Dr. Norton are working with Riverside City on the matter of personnel and salaries; that opportunity will be given those desiring re-assignment or those who wish to move from elementary to secondary if suitable replacements can be found.

TRANSPORTATION REPORT

Mr. Larsen reported to the Board his findings on the transportation problem, announcing that Mr. Miller and he had toured the district making bus survey and determining the need as to transporting students at secondary level. He reported on the cost of new buses as compared to contracting for bus service.

ARCHITECT RECOMMENDATION Dr. Hummel reported a recommendation on architectural firms will be available at the next regular board meeting.

CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE Mr. Hughes again thanked and praised the Citizens' Advisory Committee and Mr. Correll, chairman, for the work and effort expended on the bond election. It was announced that the next meeting of the Citizens' Advisory Committee would be held April 24, 1963, 7:30 p.m. at the Glen Avon School

BOARD POLICIES

Dr. Hummel reported on the development of Board Policies. It was suggested that they be developed on the basis of "first things first", and that plans could be discussed at some of the breakfast meetings. The first breakfast meeting was set for Tuesday morning, April 30, 1963, 6:30 a.m. Denny's Coffee Shop.

DINNER MEETING FOR BOARD MEMBERS 5/24/63 Dr. Hummel announced that board members had been invited through Dr. Stallings, County Schools Office, to a dinner meeting arranged by County Schools Office in connection with the County Board of Education and the Riverside County Trustees Association which will be held on May 24, 1963, 6:30 p.m. at the Royal Scott Restaurant. The speaker will be Dr. Lloyd Nelson, from the University of Southern California, and his topic will be "What's A Good Board Meeting?"

CANVASS OF VOTES

Dr. Hummel read the requirements as stipulated by the County Counsel regarding the canvass of votes for the bond elections. A motion was made by Mr. Johnson to accept the results of the canvass of votes for the Assumption of Bonds, the Approval of Local Bonds, and the Approval of State Apportionment. Mr. Gardner seconded the motion.

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of JURUPA UNIFIED

A RESOLUTION OF THE JURUPA UNIFIED BOARD OF TRUSTEES REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE TO PERMIT THE COUNTY CLERK OF SAID COUNTY TO RENDER SPECIFIED SERVICES TO THE JURUPA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF A CONSOLIDATED SPECIAL ASSUMPTION, SPECIAL SCHOOL BOND, AND SPECIAL STATE APPORTIONMENT ELECTION TO BE HELD IN SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT ON APRIL 16, 1963.

WHEREAS, a special bond election is to be held in the Jurupa Unified School District on April 16, 1963; and

WHEREAS, in the course of conduct of said election and in relation thereto it will be necessary to obtain ballots, supply sets, election equipment and material relating thereto; equip polling places; make delivery of election supplies; arrange facilities for their return to some central point and prepare the returns for the official canvass; and it will facilitate the conduct of said election if the County Clerk of the County of Riverside will provide the services and facilities outlined above; and

WHEREAS, all necessary expense in performing these services and providing these facilities shall be paid by the Jurupa Unified School District;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE Jurupa Unified Board of Trustees does hereby RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER, as follows:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the provisions of Section 22003 of the Elections Code of the State of California, this Board of Trustees hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of said County to permit the County Clerk to prepare and furnish to said School District, for use in conducting said election to be held on April 16, 1963, official ballots, election supply sets, election equipment and material relating thereto, arrange for the delivery and return of said ballots, supply sets and equipment and provide facilities for the unofficial canvass preparatory for the official canvass to be conducted by this board on the date set by law following the election.

SECTION 2. That said School District shall reimburse said County for services performed when the work is completed and upon presentation to the District of a properly approved bill.
