ANNUAL ORGANIZATION MEETING

- * Last year the Governor had signed AB 3543 which extended the terms of office of the governing board members from the last Friday in November to the first Friday in December. Therefore, each school district shall hold an Annual Organization Meeting from December 6 through December 20, 1991. At the November 18 regular meeting, the Board announced that its annual organization meeting will be combined with the December 16 regular meeting and as such a certification form was sent to the County Office of Education. Other code provisions regarding organization are included in the supporting documents.

ANNUAL ORGANIZATION MEETING (Cont'd)

* 1. **Elect Board President** (Mrs. Burns)

State law requires election of a President. Board policy requires election of a President and Clerk. As immediate past Clerk of the Board, it is suggested that Mrs. Burns conduct an election for President of the Board for the one-year term beginning with this meeting. The elected president should receive the gavel.

* 2. **Elect Clerk** (The President)

The newly elected Board President will conduct an election for Clerk of the Board for the one-year term beginning with this meeting.

3. **Recognition**

The Board members should rearrange their seating to reflect past practice which is the president, clerk, and then other board members in alphabetical order. The Superintendent and Board members may wish to congratulate the new president and clerk.

* 4. **Select Day, Time and Place of Regular Meetings** (Dr. Wilson)

The Board must adopt a schedule of meeting dates, time and location. A recommended meeting schedule based on policy provisions is included in the supporting documents. The schedule calls for regular meetings on the first and third Monday except in August. When the meeting date is a holiday it is scheduled for the next day. It is recommended the Board adopt the calendar of regular meetings shown in the supporting documents as Regulation 9310.

5. **Select Representative for Annual County Committee on School District Organization Election** (Dr. Wilson)

By law the Board is required to select a representative to vote in the Annual County Committee on School District Organization Election. The annual election is usually held in conjunction with a meeting of the Riverside County School Boards Association in the fall of each year. This is the only regular responsibility of the Board representative. Mr. Medina has served as the representative for the past two years.

* 6. **Authorize Agents and Certify Signatures for Business Functions** (Mr. Edmunds)

The County requires a list of Board members and school district employees authorized to transact various business functions for the school district. The current list of authorized agents is included in the supporting documents with the signature certification form. It is recommended the list of Authorized Agents and the authorization provided on the Certification of Signatures form in the supporting documents be approved.

ANNUAL ORGANIZATION MEETING (Cont'd)

* 7. Appoint Liaison Representatives to District Advisory Committees (Dr. Wilson)

Board policy provides for the Board to designate one of its members as a Liaison Representative to each districtwide advisory committee. Such committees may be required by the regulations or guidelines for supplemental projects. For the 1991/92 school year, administration has combined meetings for the Consolidated Application and Bilingual Education District Advisory Committees. The Board should designate a member as Liaison Representative to each of the three Advisory Committees: Combined Consolidated Application and Bilingual Education, and Vocational Education. The chart in the supporting documents includes spaces to fill-in new appointees.

COMMUNICATIONS SESSION

1. Administrative Reports and Written Communications

a. Accept Donation for Rustic Lane Elementary School (Mr. Edmunds)

All donations are given to Jurupa Unified School District with the request that the money or item be used at the designated school.

The Mission Bell Elementary School PTA wishes to donate \$400 to be used to purchase a thermoscan instant thermometer, and \$4,000 to purchase stage curtains and cafeteria window curtains for the school.

Melody Mills, a teacher at Rustic Lane Elementary School, wishes to donate three Fisher Price VHS videos entitled "Terrific Trips" to be used at the school. The approximate value of these tapes is \$30.

Administration recommends acceptance of this donation with a letter of appreciation to be sent.

2. Report of Student Representatives

*** A. Approve Minutes of the December 2, 1991 Regular Meeting**

Recommend approval as printed.

****B. Hold Public Hearing and Consider Elementary School Attendance Boundary Adjustments** (Dr. Wilson)

The President of the Board will open the public hearing on proposed elementary attendance boundary adjustments which will be effective with the opening of Granite Hill Elementary School in September 1992. The Superintendent will comment on the proposed adjustments prior to hearing from members of the audience. After citizens have spoken, the President will close the public hearing and Board discussion will commence.

The District will open Granite Hill Elementary School in September 1992. The opening of a new school provides an opportunity to reduce the size of existing schools, and makes it possible for the District to continue to meet its obligation to provide adequate classroom space for the growing number of children in the community.

No change in the present middle school and high school attendance boundaries is contemplated at this time. Presently middle school boundaries are determined by assigning elementary school attendance areas to one of the two middle schools. The middle school and high school boundaries are identical, i.e., Jurupa Middle School attendance area is the same as Jurupa Valley High School and Mission Middle School attendance area is the same as Rubidoux High School.

As a district, we have referred to this way of determining middle school and high school boundaries based on elementary school boundaries as the "feeder school concept." By maintaining the present middle school and high school boundaries while changing elementary boundaries, the District will move away from the feeder school concept. To do otherwise would require that the middle school and high school boundaries be changed even though enrollment among these schools is presently balanced, and is unnecessary at least until Mira Loma Middle School is completed.

A committee made up of Michelle Johnson, principal of Ina Arbuckle Elementary School; Memo Mendez, principal of West Riverside Elementary School; Ellen Raher, principal of Camino Real Elementary School; Bill Anderson, teacher; and district administrators Kent Campbell, Rollin Edmunds, Benita Roberts, and myself have generated an initial proposal for elementary school attendance boundary adjustments as shown on the map in the supporting documents for Board members. In generating this initial proposal the committee gave consideration to such issues as:

1. Available student capacity.
2. Equitable size of schools.

3. Natural and manmade boundaries.
4. Existing study areas.
5. Minimizing the need for busing.
6. Socio-economic makeup of schools.
7. Ethnic makeup of schools.
8. Long-term district growth patterns.

In this hearing, issues or problems may come to light that the committee had not anticipated. Should that be the case, these would then be fully considered by the committee prior to making a final recommendation to the Board.

Several meetings were held with principals of the three schools involved (Glen Avon, Mission Bell and Sunnyslope) to determine the streets that would be affected by the new boundaries. Notices of a public hearing were sent home with all students on Thursday, December 12. It included the streets that would be affected. Listed below, by school, are the streets that will be in the Granite Hill attendance area beginning with the 1992/93 school year.

The committee also examined possible boundaries for Stone Avenue Elementary School to the degree that was necessary in order to be sure that the proposed Granite Hill boundaries would not be affected when Stone Avenue opens. The new Granite Hill boundaries do not alleviate the segregation issue at Ina Arbuckle and West Riverside. In addition, in spite of the committee's best efforts as it examined possible Stone Avenue School boundaries, it was unable to successfully address the segregation issue at these two schools. Board policy calls for the implementation of Magnet schools in such situations. As such, \$100,000 per school will be budgeted for 1992/93 fiscal year for the purpose of implementing Magnet School Programs. Information only.

C. Consider Implementation of Year-Round Education (Dr. Wilson)

At its December 4, 1991 meeting the State Allocation Board adopted new regulations which permit school districts to meet their Year-Round Education (YRE) commitments by a recalculation of construction square footage eligibility pursuant to YRE formulas. This recalculation reduces eligibility in that it assumes more than 100% capacity for schools.

In meeting with Shelley Caldwell, the Office of Local Assistance representative for Jurupa, it was determined that the Jurupa Unified School District can absorb this reduced eligibility without jeopardizing Project 20, the 2nd Addition to Jurupa Valley High School, and Project 22, the addition to Mira Loma Middle School.

This means that the district can meet its Year-Round Education obligation by authorizing the recalculation of square footage eligibility pursuant to the regulations adopted by the State Allocation Board on December 4, 1991, and specifically Alternative 4.

As such, the district may now implement year-round school on a needs basis as opposed to it being required by the State. In 1992/93, Year-Round Education is not needed in the Jurupa District in order to house all students. However, it will be important to have the YRE Steering Committee complete its work so that as the district continues to grow an appropriate framework for developing Year-Round Education is in place.

Administration recommends the Board approve Alternative 4 as the district's means of remaining an eligible participant in the State Building Program.

D. Authorize Solicitation of Bids for Xerographic and Printing Paper

(Mr. Edmunds)

The District stocks xerographic and printing paper in the Warehouse to cover most of the needs of the District Print Shop, schools, and Education Center for use in copiers and other duplicating machines. We always attempt to purchase at the most advantageous price to the District. Our last purchase was made on a quote basis; however, Phil Wilkeson, Director of Purchasing, feels it would be to the District's benefit to solicit bids at this time.

Bids will be solicited based on an annual volume of two (2) carloads of 8½" x 11" 20 lb. bond with split delivery of one (1) carload to be released upon bid award, and one (1) carload to be delivered six (6) months later.

Administration recommends that the Board authorize the Director of Purchasing to advertise for bids for Xerographic and Printing Paper. Request for approval of award will be brought to the Board after the bids are opened.

E. Act on Student Discipline Matters

(Dr. Hendrick)

- ** 1. The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #92/18 for bringing a marijuana-like substance to school and giving some of the substance to another student.
- ** 2. The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #92/19 for throwing a pen striking a student in the eye and punching another student twice which resulted in a fight, and later, without provocation, punched the student on the side of the face.

Approve at informational first reading proposed Policy and Regulation 5112.3, Infectious Diseases. This new policy and regulation were developed in order to provide a procedure by which the admission or continued enrollment of a student with an infectious disease would be determined. The policy statement recognizes two important factors: 1) the responsibility to protect the health of all students, and 2) the responsibility to uphold the right of students to a free and appropriate education. Administration recommends approval at informational first reading of Proposed Policy and Regulation 5112.3, Infectious Diseases.

- * 9. Revised Regulation 1230, Recognized Parent Organizations (Mr. Taylor)

Administration recommends the Board adopt at single reading revised Regulation 1230, Recognized Parent Organizations. This regulation is brought up-to-date on a yearly basis.

- * 10. Revised Regulation 5152, Recognized Student Organizations (Mr. Taylor)

Administration recommends the Board adopt at single reading revised Regulation 5152, Recognized Student Organizations. This regulation is brought up-to-date on a yearly basis.

- * 11. Request for Non-Routine Field Trip for Rubidoux High School (Mrs. Roberts)

Rubidoux High School's Agriculture Advisor, Rhonda Fuller, is requesting permission for an overnight trip in order for three students to attend a leadership conference.

The conference is scheduled Saturday, January 18 through Sunday, January 19, 1992 at the Burbank Airport Hilton. Students are scheduled to arrive by 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 18th and leave on Sunday, January 19th. The students will be transported by district vehicles. Registration costs include materials, meals and lodging.

No student will be excluded from the trip for financial reasons. The district is not expected to pay for any expenses. A copy of the Non-Routine Student Field Trip Request for Approval is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Non-Routine Student Field Trip Request for three Rubidoux High School Agriculture students to attend an overnight conference on January 18 and 19, 1992 at the Burbank Airport Hilton.

H. Review Routine Information Reports

1. Hear Report of Accreditation Process at Jurupa Valley High School

(Mrs. Roberts)

Jurupa Valley High School began operation in September, 1989 accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), under the accreditation of Rubidoux High School.

WASC procedures provide for a Preliminary Accreditation Visit by a two-person team during the year of the first graduating class of a new school. The visit occurred on December 10, 1991. The team consisted of Dr. Robert Blatner, UCLA Professor of Mathematics and Dr. Kay Knepp, Assistant Superintendent of Walnut Valley Unified School District. The one-day visit included inspection of the school facilities, interviews with staff members and a review of school procedures and selected records.

The visiting committee will recommend a term of accreditation for Jurupa Valley High School of up to three years. A full accreditation with a full-scale School Self-Study and a three day visit by a full accreditation team must then be completed by the school during the last year of the Preliminary Accreditation.

The results of the Preliminary Visit and the accreditation award will be presented to the Board as soon as they are received. Information only.

4. Individual School Rules

(Mr. Taylor)

Education Code 35291.5 states that on or before December 1, 1987, and at least every four years thereafter, each public school in accordance with the requirements of this section, shall adopt rules and procedures on school discipline applicable to the school. The school discipline rules and procedures shall be consistent with any applicable policies adopted by the governing board and state statutes governing school discipline. In developing these rules and procedures, each school shall solicit the participation, views, and advice of one representative selected by each of the following groups: parents, teachers, school administrators, school security personnel (if any), and for middle schools and high schools, pupils enrolled in school.

Each school has met this requirement. Individual school rules are available in the Director of Education Services' office for review. Information only.

Responsibility of Governing Board

In accordance with the Education Code, the governing board of each school district shall hold an Annual Organization Meeting. In a year in which a regular election for governing board members is conducted, the meeting shall be held on a day within a 15-day period that commences with the date upon which a governing board member elected at that election takes office. Annual Organizational Meetings, in years in which no such regular election for governing board members is conducted, shall be held during the same 15-day period on the calendar. **This year, the dates are December 6 through December 20, 1991.** Unless otherwise provided by rule of the governing board, the day and time of the Annual Organizational Meeting shall be selected by the board at its regular meeting held immediately prior to the first day of such 15-day period, and the board shall notify the County Superintendent of Schools of the day and time selected. The clerk of the board shall, within 15 days prior to the date of the Annual Organizational Meeting, notify in writing all members and members-elect of the date and time selected. If the board fails to select a day and time for the annual meeting, the County Superintendent of Schools shall designate, within the 15-day period, the day and time of the meeting. (E.C. Section 35143)

The term of office for newly elected board begins **Friday, December 6, 1991.** The Oath of Office must be administered on or after that date; the Oath form is enclosed for your use.

County Board of Education

Organization Session

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Community College District

At the Annual Organizational Meeting, the governing board of a community college district shall organize by electing a president from its members and a secretary (E.C. Section 72125).

City and Unified School District

At the Annual Organizational Meeting, each city board of education shall organize by electing a president from its members (E.C. Section 35143). Whenever a unified school district has within its boundaries a chartered city with a population of more than 8,000 or whenever the average daily attendance of a unified school district is 1,500 or more, for all purposes the district shall be deemed a city school district governed by a city board of education, and the governing board thereof shall be deemed a city board of education (E.C. Section 5206). The board of education of a unified school district that meets the standards of Education Code section 5206 is required to elect a president at the Annual Organizational Meeting. A unified school district with five board members that does not meet the standards of Education Code Section 5206 would be required to elect a president and a clerk (E.C. Section 35022, 35143, and 5206).

High School District

At the Annual Organizational Meeting, the governing board of each high school district, union high school district, and joint union high school district shall organize by electing a president from its members and a clerk (E.C. Section 35143).

Elementary School District

At the Annual Organizational Meeting, the governing board of an elementary school district with five or more board members shall elect a president and a clerk from among its members (E.C. Section 35022 and 35143). At the Annual Organization Meeting, the governing board of an elementary school district with less than five board members is required to elect one of its members clerk of the district (E.C. Section 35143).

Selection of Representative to Vote in the Annual County Committee on School District Organization Election

The governing board of each school district of every kind or class shall annually, at its initial meeting, select one of its members as its representative, who shall have one vote for each member to be elected to the county committee. The secretary or clerk of the district shall furnish the County Superintendent of Schools with a certificate naming the representative selected by

the board (E.C. Section 35023) (72403 community college district).

After the Annual Organizational Meeting, please COMPLETE AND RETURN TO RICHARD ROBERTS, NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 27, 1991, the attached form relating to the election of the governing board president and clerk, the members elected to represent the school district at the annual election of members of the county committee, and the date, time and place of regular meetings.

For your convenience, we have enclosed a copy of Sec/State Form LP/SB-405 Rev. 4/88, "Statement of Facts Roster of Public Agencies Filing" amendment to be filed with the Secretary of State within ten days after any change of facts required to be stated pursuant to Government Code Section 53051(a). PRESIDENT RUANE MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 18, 1991 REGULAR MEETING AS CORRECTED ON PAGE 65, CLOSED SESSION TO READ: FOUR BOARD MEMBERS WERE PRESENT AND MR. MEDINA WAS ABSENT. MR. BARNES SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services noted that Phase II, architect's working drawings, were agendized for the State Allocation Board's December 4 meeting. The district should receive approval without allocation for \$237,000 to cover working drawings, and architect and plan check fees. This would put the district in line for construction funding should a new state bond pass in June or November 1992. The district has already paid the architect \$56,000 for Phase II working drawings and would begin payments from the general fund toward \$156,000 in architect fees and \$25,000 in plan check fees beginning in the 1992 fiscal year. If architectural fees were not advanced for this project, it would be delayed at least two years. A long delay would require the addition of more portables at an extra cost of about \$92,000 which would not be reimbursed to the district. Another point was that portables were not adequate to house particular instructional programs such as science labs. The Assistant Superintendent also noted that some landscaping work was connected with Project 20 that would reduce dust and sand which impacts the classrooms and swimming pool. One other advantage would be that furniture and equipment money appropriated for this project would address needs in the classrooms.

President Ruane agreed that there is a need for the 2nd Addition at Jurupa Valley High School. However, administration has indicated the budget crisis may be worse next year. Mrs. Ruane favored paying \$56,000 for Phase II because the district owed it, but she was not in favor of spending another \$156,000 in architect fees and \$25,000 in plan check fees for a total of \$181,000 for Phase III. If a bond election were to fail the district would be obligated to cover the costs of the project. This would mean more cutbacks in programs, libraries, etc. Mrs. Ruane felt it was more important to maintain the district's programs and personnel than to fund the 2nd Addition at this time. Another concern was that a new elementary school will not open until next fall because of a shortage of funds. Mrs. Ruane stated there was too much uncertainty whether a bond election would pass to provide funds for the addition and she was not a gambler.

In response to Mr. Barnes question on enrollment projections for Jurupa Valley High School, the Assistant Superintendent Business Services said he expected growth over the next few years to surpass the projections. Without the 2nd Addition, more portable classrooms will be required. The campus has six portables now with capacity for another four after which the district will run out of electrical capacity. That area of the campus was designed to construct a permanent building.

Mr. Barnes noted that he would vote in favor of Project 20 because both high schools should be built-out rather than invest in a third high school. This may allow the district to concentrate on advancing quality programs. The district has been successful in relying on statewide bond issues in the past. However, some other alternatives may be available in the next couple of years. Mr. Chavez agreed that the district has been very fortunate with its building program and the state's support. The district should provide permanent facilities for future high school students instead of using money from the general fund for portables.

In response to Mr. Chavez' question, the Assistant Superintendent replied that the motion links the projects so that when funds were available they can be constructed at one time.

The Governing Board recognizes its dual responsibility to protect the health of students from risks posed by infectious diseases such as: tuberculosis, HIV infection and/or AIDS, hepatitis, CMV disease or poliomyelitis, and to uphold the right of students to a free and appropriate education.

For purposes of this policy, infectious diseases shall include all those listed by the State Department of Health Services and the County Health Department.

The Board encourages parents/guardians to inform the Superintendent or designee if their child has an infectious disease so that any such child will have access to appropriate district programs and services. The Superintendent or designee may convene a review panel to make recommendations regarding appropriate programs and services for such a student and shall consider the panel's recommendation when making the final decision.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all of the student's rights to confidentiality are strictly observed in accordance with law. In all instances, confidential information shall not be released without parental consent.

The Superintendent or designee shall request that parents/guardians sign a release form to provide confidential medical information and records to the review panel.

The admission of a student with an infectious disease shall be determined by the Superintendent or designee according to standard procedures as stated in Regulation 5112.3. The Superintendent, the Superintendent's designee, or district medical consultant shall consult with the student's parent/guardian and, as appropriate, with the student's physician and/or the County Health Department.

Students with infectious diseases are entitled to the rights and services accorded to other students. They may attend their regular school and classroom with appropriate medical clearance, barring any special circumstances.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES

As indicated in Board Policy 5112.3, a pupil with an infectious disease may be admitted to district classes contingent upon an evaluation of the situation conducted in accordance with these procedures. All of these procedures must be followed before such a pupil is allowed to attend classes at any school in the Jurupa Unified School District:

1. The parent of a pupil suspected of having an infectious disease shall submit a formal written request to the Superintendent's Designee for the pupil to attend classes in the Jurupa Unified School District.
2. The parent shall provide the Superintendent's Designee with written authorization for the District and the County Health Officer to obtain medical information from the pupil's physician and any other source of medical, psychological, or educational information that may be required in order to reach a decision regarding the pupil's enrollment.
3. The parent shall provide the Superintendent's Designee with written authorization that permits administration to reveal to the student's teacher(s) the nature of his/her illness and/or results of any blood test or any other essential laboratory test in the event the pupil is permitted enrollment in the District.
4. The parent shall provide the Superintendent's Designee with a written statement obtained from the pupil's physician indicating that admittance of the pupil to the schools of the District poses no risk to the pupil with the suspected infectious disease, to his/her classmates, or to members of the school staff who may come in contact with the pupil. Included in the physician's statement shall be any information regarding the presence of oozing lesions, running sores, or any other possible sources of infection.
5. The parent shall provide the Superintendent's Designee with a written statement obtained from the County Health Officer indicating that the pupil's admission to the schools of the District poses no risk to the pupil with the suspected infectious disease, to his/her classmates, or to members of the school staff who may come in contact with the pupil.
6. The Superintendent's Designee may obtain written statements and/or reports from appropriate school staff, as well as any other individuals having knowledge of this pupil, regarding the pupil's behavior, neurological and psychological development, and the expected type of interaction with others in the school setting. Particular emphasis shall be placed on such reports that provide information regarding the pupil's ability to maintain control of bodily secretions, or the possible existence of unusual behaviors such as biting, vomiting, or the like.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES

7. The Superintendent's Designee shall review all of the information gathered in these procedures and submit a recommendation to the Superintendent to support or deny admission of the pupil to classes in the District.
8. The Superintendent may choose to refer the matter to a committee that may be composed of the following:
 - a) the pupil's physician,
 - b) a District-appointed medical consultant,
 - c) a member of the County Department of Health,
 - d) a school staff member familiar with the pupil's previous behavior,
 - e) the Superintendent or a designee.

This committee shall develop a recommendation that will address whether or not the pupil should be allowed to attend classes at a school in the District.

9. The Superintendent, utilizing all of the materials and information gathered in the procedures outlined above, shall make a decision regarding admission of the pupil to classes in the District.
10. If the Superintendent decides not to admit the pupil to District classes, then an alternative educational offering shall be presented.

1.0 Remarks on the Year-Round Education Committee's Charge

Dr. John Wilson thanked everyone for the time they are devoting to participate on the Year-Round Education Steering Committee. He also alerted the committee to the potential change in the rules regarding implementation of year-round education. The State Allocation Board will meet on December 4 and may make a decision which would allow the district to delay the implementation of year-round education and give the committee additional time to develop its recommendations.

2.0 Consensus Decision Making

Mrs. Roberts reviewed the list of ground rules for the committee's operation developed at the November 14th meeting. She gave the following explanation of the consensus decision making process:

- Each person agrees that he/she can accept and live with the decision.
- May not be person's first choice but he/she can live with it.
- Decision does not violate anything he/she firmly values or believes in.
- Group should not move forward until consensus is reached.

3.0 Review and Agree on Criteria for Student Calendar Selection

The committee reviewed the criteria for selecting a student calendar established at the November 14th meeting. Mr. Campbell suggested that the Committee consider including consideration of surrounding districts' calendars as an additional criterion. It was also suggested that all programs for all children should be included; this was meant to include special needs children.

Mr. Lee Scott gave a brief overview of an informal survey he had conducted at three school sites in the Los Angeles Unified School District regarding the 90/30 calendar. He had talked with parents and staff members regarding this calendar, most did not view it favorably.

Members prioritized the calendar selection criteria as follows:

Down Time for Maintenance	11
No Prolonged Instruction Blocks	10
All Programs For All Students	10

Retain Traditional Vacations	0
Provision for Intersession	0

A discussion was held on the priorities and how a calendar operates. Holly Gunette asked if different track assignment are more expensive than others. Dr. Zykowski explained that the cost depends largely on priorities, such as the cost for additional personnel. Cathy Barnett asked if going on year-round meant the district received more money from attendance. Rollin Edmunds, Assistant Superintendent Business Services, explained that this is true; however, there are additional costs for utilities, personnel working a longer year.

A chart was devised and the top five priorities were analyzed as to the desirability of each calendar option, as shown below:
