# B. Hold Public Hearing and Consider Elementary School Attendance Boundary Adjustments (Dr. Wilson)

The President of the Board will open the public hearing on proposed elementary attendance boundary adjustments which will be effective with the opening of Granite Hill Elementary School in September 1992. Notices announcing this public hearing were sent home with children of the three elementary schools involved on January 15. After citizens have spoken, the President will close the public hearing and Board discussion will commence.

#### Background Information from January 6, 1992 Board Meeting

The District will open Granite Hill Elementary School in September 1992. The opening of a new school provides an opportunity to reduce the size of existing schools, and makes it possible for the District to continue to meet its obligation to provide adequate classroom space for the growing number of children in the community.

No change in the present middle school and high school attendance boundaries is contemplated at this time. Presently middle school boundaries are determined by assigning elementary school attendance areas to one of the two middle schools. The middle school and high school boundaries are identical, i.e., Jurupa Middle School attendance area is the same as Jurupa Valley High School and Mission Middle School attendance area is the same as Rubidoux High School.

As a district, we have referred to this way of determining middle school and high school boundaries based on elementary school boundaries as the "feeder school concept." By maintaining the present middle school and high school boundaries while changing elementary boundaries, the District will move away from the feeder school concept. To do otherwise would require that the middle school and high school boundaries be changed even though enrollment among these schools is presently balanced, and is unnecessary at least until Mira Loma Middle School is completed.

A committee made up of Michelle Johnson, principal of Ina Arbuckle Elementary School; Memo Mendez, principal of West Riverside Elementary School; Ellen Raher, principal of Camino Real Elementary School; Bill Anderson, teacher; and district administrators Kent Campbell, Rollin Edmunds, Benita Roberts, and myself have generated an initial proposal for elementary school attendance boundary adjustments. In generating this initial proposal the committee gave consideration to such issues as:

- 1. Available student capacity.
- 2. Equitable size of schools.
- 3. Natural and manmade boundaries.
- 4. Existing study areas.
- 5. Minimizing the need for busing.
- 6. Socio-economic makeup of schools.
- 7. Ethnic makeup of schools.
- 8. Long-term district growth patterns.

In this hearing, issues or problems may come to light that the committee had not anticipated. Should that be the case, these would then be fully considered by the committee prior to making a final recommendation to the Board.

Several meetings were held with principals of the three schools involved (Glen Avon, Mission Bell and Sunnyslope) to determine the streets that would be affected by the new boundaries. Notices of a public hearing were sent home with all students on Thursday, December 12. It included the streets that would be affected. Listed below, by school, are the streets that will be in the Granite Hill attendance area beginning with the 1992/93 school year.

The committee also examined possible boundaries for Stone Avenue Elementary School to the degree that was necessary in order to be sure that the proposed Granite Hill boundaries would not be affected when Stone Avenue opens. The new Granite Hill boundaries do not alleviate the segregation issue at Ina Arbuckle and West Riverside. In addition, in spite of the committee's best efforts as it examined possible Stone Avenue School boundaries, it was unable to successfully address the segregation issue at these two schools. Board policy calls for the implementation of Magnet schools in such situations. As such, \$100,000 per school will be budgeted for 1992/93 fiscal year for the purpose of implementing Magnet School Programs.

At the January 6 meeting, the Board of Education requested information on the following options.

#### \* C. Certify First Period Interim Report

Since January of 1986, the District has been required to certify its financial stability twice each year. The format required by the State Department of Education is:

- 1) Certification of Financial Position
- 2) J-250 Attendance Detail
- 3) J-251 General Fund Summary
- 4) Cash Flow
- 5) Summary Review

All of these for the First Period Interim Report are included in the supporting documents. The analysis of the financial status of the District indicates that the District will be able to meet its financial obligations for the 1991-92 fiscal year. Therefore, a positive certification has been prepared for signature.

Administration recommends the Board certify that the District will be able to meet its financial obligations for the 1991-92 fiscal year by signing the certification page of the First Period Interim Report.

## D. Award Bid #92/02L, Supply Printing and Xerographic Paper

(Mr. Edmunds)

Specifications were developed by the District for 20-lb. bond, white, printing and xerographic paper. This paper is our standard warehouse stock used by the Print Shop and all District sites. The Notice Inviting Bids was published in the Riverside Press-Enterprise on December 20 and 27, 1991. Bid packets were sent to nine (9) potential suppliers; eight (8) companies submitted bids. The public opening was held on Thursday, January 9, 1992, at 10:00 a.m. in the Education Center Board Room.

#### E. Review and Act on Timely School Facility Matters

# 1. Authorize Substitution of Subcontractor on Mira Loma Construction Project (Mr. Edmunds)

K.L. Neff Construction Company, the prime contractor for the construction of Mira Loma Middle School, has requested Board approval to substitute All American Asphalt for Walkers Asphalt Maintenance, Inc., who was the listed asphalt subcontractor on the original bid.

Public Contract Code 4107 prohibits the prime contractor from replacing any subcontractor listed in the original bid except for certain specific reasons, and then only with authority from the awarding body. One of the allowable reasons is if the listed subcontractor fails to execute a written contract. The District sent Walkers Asphalt Maintenance, Inc. a certified letter advising them of the request from K.L. Neff Construction Company. They did not file any written objections within the allowable five (5) days; which, therefore, constitutes their consent to the substitution.

Administration recommends that the Board approve the request from K.L. Neff Construction Company to replace Walkers Asphalt Maintenance, Inc. with All American Asphalt for the asphalt portion of the Mira Loma Middle School Construction Project.

# 2. Authorize Substitution of Subcontractor on Stone Avenue Elementary School Construction Project (Mr. Edmunds)

RJW Construction Company, the prime contractor for the construction of Stone Avenue Elementary School, has requested Board approval to substitute themselves for Sun World Framing Contractor's, Inc., who was the listed framing subcontractor on the original bid.

Public Contract Code 4107 prohibits the prime contractor from replacing any subcontractor listed in the original bid except for certain specific reasons and then only with authority from the awarding body. One of the allowable reasons is if the listed subcontractor becomes bankrupt or insolvent. The District has been notified of a Chapter 7 bankruptcy filing by Sun World Framing Contractor's, Inc. The District sent Sun World Framing a certified letter advising them of the request from RJW Construction Company. They did not file any written objections within the allowable five (5) days; which, therefore, constitutes their consent to the substitution.

Administration recommends that the Board approve the request from RJW Construction Company to replace Sun World Framing Contactor's, Inc. with their own crew for the framing portion of the Stone Avenue Elementary School Construction Project.

#### \* 10. Non-Routine Field Trip/Excursion for Rubidoux High School's FFA (Mrs. Roberts)

Rubidoux High School's FFA is requesting permission for a non-routine field trip to Indio to participate in the National Date Festival on Tuesday, February 18 through Sunday, February 23, 1992. As in the past, students will stay overnight. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in this event due to lack of personal funds. The supporting documents contain the request.

Administration recommends that the Board approve Rubidoux High School's FFA request for a non-routine field trip to Indio on February 18-23, 1992.

#### \* 11. Out-of-State Conference Request for Rubidoux High School Teacher (Mrs. Roberts)

Sandy Ryan, a science teacher at Rubidoux High School, is requesting approval to atcend the Colorado Society of Osteopathic Medicine winter conference to be held in Keystone, Colorado February 22-28, 1992. Ms. Ryan indicates that this is one of the best conferences available, related to health prevention and medicine. Ms. Ryan believes that this conference will be very valuable in her work. As a science teacher, she has attended this conference for the past six years and obtained information to share with the staff regarding AIDS and other communicable diseases. In the course on Human Biology, which was formerly Health Science, she covers such areas as communicable diseases, drugs (prescription and street) and how they react in the human body. In addition, the conference will provide workshops dealing with adolescent behavior and suicide prevention.

The teacher will pay for costs including air fare, lodging and registration. She will also pay for two days of substitute coverage, and the school will pay for the remaining three days.

It is recommended that the Board approve the out-of-state conference request for Ms. Sandy Ryan to attend the Colorado Society of Osteopathic Medicine conference from February 22-28, 1992.

## \* 12. Non-Routine Field Trip Request for Rubidoux High School Swim Team (Mrs. Roberts)

Rubidoux High School's swim coach, Kathy Gentry, is requesting permission for a non-routine field trip for the swim team. The trip is scheduled from Friday, March 6th through Monday, March 9, 1992. The purpose of the field trip is to conduct a retreat for swim team members to develop goals and objectives and plan and organize the upcoming season. The retreat will be held at the Lawler Lodge, in Idyllwild. The swim team members expect to raise the necessary funds; however, no student will be denied participation due to lack of funds.

It is recommended that the Board approve the non-routine student field trip for the Rubidoux High School swim team from March 6-9, 1992 at the Lawler Lodge in Idyllwild.

#### I. Review Routine Information Reports

#### 1. Notification of Grant Award

(Mrs. Roberts)

The district was recently notified that our application to serve additional preschool students was approved by the Office of Child Development. This means that the district will be able to serve approximately 84 new students, ages 3.9 - 5.0 years, during the spring term. This new grant is part of Governor Wilson's early intervention program and will increase the number of Jurupa's preschool classes from 10 to 13.

The State preschool program operates on a reimbursement formula and the district is eligible to receive up to \$210,063 for start-up and program implementation costs. Information only.

#### 3. Non-Public School Placements

(Dr. Hendrick)

The District is responsible for serving all handicapped children who are at least three years of age but not over twenty-two years of age under the Education of All Handicapped Children Act of 1975 (PL 94-142). When no appropriate public school placement is available either within the local school district or the County Office of Education, then it is necessary to place these pupils in a non-public school. The law requires that we advise the Board of such placements.

This month, we have placed 1 Severely Emotionally Disturbed (SED) pupil at Advocate School. This is a district pupil; the cost is \$89 per day; 70% of this cost, or approximate \$62.00/day will be refunded by the State. We have placed 2 Severely Handicapped Preschool pupils at Children's Center. These pupils are from our district; the cost is \$41.80 per day; 70% of the cost, or approximately \$29.26/day will be refunded by the State. We have also placed 2 Severely Emotionally Disturbed pupils at Sommerset School. These students are district pupils; the cost is \$94.50 per day; 70% of this cost, or approximately \$66.43 will be refunded by the State.

#### \* 4. 1991/92 Administrator-Teacher Ratio Report

(Mr. Campbell)

Included in the supporting documents for the Board's information is the "1991-92 Employee Ratio Summary Certification Document." For comparative purposes, the 1988-89 document is also provided. Significant information relative to these documents includes:

- (A) The Education Code provides for a ratio of 8 administrative employees to each 100 teachers in unified districts. The current allowance for JUSD is 50.38 administrators. We have 29.25. We are 21.13 administrators (42%) below our allowance.
- (B) The District's Administrator-Teacher ratio has dropped from 7.4 in 1988 to 4.6 in 1991. This is a 38% reduction in the ratio of administrators to teachers in the past four years.

#### I. Review Routine Information Reports

- \* 4. 1991/92 Administrator-Teacher Ratio Report (Cont'd)
  - (C) The number of administrators has been reduced from 40 to 29.25 over the past four years even though three new schools have been opened. This is a  $\frac{27\$}{1000}$  reduction in the number of administrators.
  - (D) The number of teachers has increased by 15.6% over the past four years (544.7 to 629.8) to match a corresponding increase in student enrollment.
  - (E) Administrative salary expenditures were reduced \$339,043 in the past year. This is a 16.6% reduction just since last year.

#### COMMUNICATIONS SESSION

RECOGNIZE CITIZEN OF THE YEAR

Sgt. Frank Cohens, recognized Chief Master President Barnes instructor for the Air Force Junior ROTC at Rubidoux High School, who was selected 1991 Citizen of the Year by the West Riverside County Businessmen's Association (WRCBA). This was the second consecutive year that an employee of Jurupa Unified School District was honored. Last year Mrs. Betty Folsom, who is now a Specialist in Substance Abuse Programs at the Riverside County Office of Education, was a recipient.

President Barnes observed that Chief Master Sgt. Cohens was the first non-resident to receive this honor in the Jurupa community over a 20 year history of WRCBA. Co-Citizen of the Year was Linda Thompson, who chaired the Jurupa Community Rodeo.

Mr. Kal Porter, the district's architect, expressed appreciation to administrators and principals for participating in the extensive planning process to design Mira Loma Middle School. Mr. Porter commended Neff Construction Company for its cooperation to build a beautiful and functional middle school that will house approximately 900 students. Construction of the \$8 million project has started with grading of the property on Steve Street in Mira Loma. The middle school is expected to be completed by September 1993.

Mr. Porter reviewed a master plan of the school. A major decision in the planning was to have students circulate among the buildings through at least two major outside walkways or corridors. The public would access the multipurpose room in the same manner without disrupting classrooms. Wind conditions in the area were also taken into consideration for locating buildings. The ultimate master plan will have four classroom buildings around a central court with a field house and multipurpose room on one side, and library and science buildings on the other side. The administrative office will be located in the middle section. More active areas such as physical education and shop will be in the back section. The field house which is open sided with a high roof will serve sport activities as well as provide an outside eating area. Visitor and faculty parking and a bus area will be spread out. Additional parking, play paving, and turf area are planned for the back. Mr. Porter noted that the first phase will not include all classroom buildings or portables for temporary housing. However, the first addition to Mira Loma Middle School for more classroom buildings has been approved and will be financed by the State when money is available. Mr. Porter concluded that Mira Loma Middle School will be an impressive enhancement to the Jurupa District. President Barnes thanked Mr. Porter for a very informative report.
