a. Review Proposed Selection Process for Provisional Appointment to Fill School Board Vacancy in Trustee Area 1 (Mrs. Roberts)

NOTICE OF PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT

At the July 7, 1997 meeting, the Board approved a provisional appointment to fill the existing vacancy in Trustee Area 1, as provided by Education Code Section 5091. In order to enhance fairness and objectivity in appointing a person to fill a board vacancy, the governing board posted a Public Notice in at least four public places in the district on July 11, 1997: West Riverside Elementary, the Education Center, and the Rubidoux and Glen Avon Branch Libraries, in appropriate news media, and invited the applications of any legally qualified voter of Trustee Area 1 interested in serving on the Board.

Completed applications are being accepted by the Board of Education, Education Center, 3924 Riverview Drive, Riverside, CA 92509 from Monday, July 14, at 8:00 a.m. through Thursday, July 24, 1997 until 4:30 p.m. All candidates will receive a letter from the Board President with a candidate information sheet.

a. Review Proposed Selection Process for Provisional Appointment to Fill School Board Vacancy in Trustee Area 1 (Cont'd) (Mrs. Roberts)

All candidate information sheets and other input will be screened by each board member. Candidates will be invited to make a short verbal statement limited to 3 minutes at a regular meeting on August 4, 1997, at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room, with final selection made by a majority vote of the board members.

By August 5, 1997, the governing board shall post notices of the provisional appointment in at least four public places in the district, and publish a notice pursuant to Government Code Section 6061. The posted and published notices shall contain the full name of the appointee, the date of the appointment, and a statement that unless a petition calling for a public election, containing a sufficient number of signatures, is filed in the office of County Superintendent of Schools within 30 days of the date of the provisional appointment, it shall become an effective appointment.

PROCESS FOR PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT TO FILL VACANCY IN TRUSTEE AREA 1

Schedule.

Thursday, July 24, 1997 - Application period closes at 4:30 p.m. Applications are due in the Superintendent's office.

Friday, July 25, 1997 - Candidates are announced and copies of all applications will be sent to Board members for review.

Monday, August 4, 1997 - Candidates will make their presentations to the Board with a time period for questions. The Board will then make a provisional appointment.

<u>Candidate Presentations</u> - Candidates will be allowed 3 minutes to make a verbal statement. Lots will be drawn to determine order of presentations. Candidates will wait in an adjacent room while each presentation is made.

<u>Selection</u> - Board members will use signed tally forms for all nominating and voting. The Board President and Secretary will announce and record individual nominations/votes.

- (1) Each Board member will nominate 1 candidate from the applicant pool. If a candidate is nominated by 3 or 4 Board members the selection has been made. If no candidate receives at least 3 nominations, those candidates who were not nominated are eliminated.
- (2) Each Board member will vote for 1 of the candidates initially nominated. If a candidate receives 3 or more votes, the selection has been made. Candidate's receiving no votes will be eliminated.
- (3) As may be necessary, the Board will vote 2 additional times. If a candidate receives 3 votes on a ballot, the selection has been made. Any candidate failing to receive a vote on a ballot will be eliminated.
- (4) If a selection has not been made at this point, the Board should discuss whether they wish to continue voting, discuss the remaining nominees before continuing to vote, re-start selection process at Step 1, or defer further voting to a Special Board meeting.

The Board will recall that the District administers two Community Facilities Districts (CFDs). In December, 1990, CFD No. 1 of Jurupa Unified School District sold \$6.9 million dollars of bonds in order to finance school facilities (about \$1.3 million of the total) and water and sewer facilities for the Van Daele and Concordia developments within the CFD boundaries. Community Facilities District No. 2 sold \$1.25 million of bonds in March, 1993, to finance school facilities (\$195,000 of the total), and water and sewer facilities for an adjacent Van Daele development.

In order to pay the principal and interest on the outstanding bonds of these CFDs, the Board must adopt two ordinances levying special taxes on parcels of land within the CFDs. District counsel, Dick Anderson, has prepared the ordinances for levying assessment on these parcels. Special Tax Consultant, David Taussig & Associates, has prepared an analysis which determines the rate and method of apportionment of special taxes on the properties. This analysis is summarized in reports called Community Facilities District Administration Report (one for each CFD), which have been provided as supporting documents for Board Members only. The ordinances and tax levy must be submitted to the Tax Assessor by August 10, 1997. It will be necessary for the District to levy special taxes within the CFDs in this manner on an annual basis as part of its responsibility as the lead agency administering the CFDs.

Administration recommends the Board adopt Ordinances Nos. 98/01 and 98/02, Urgency Ordinances Levying Special Taxes to be Collected During Fiscal Year 1997/98 for Payment of Principal and Interest on and Administrative Expenses with Respect to the Bonds of Community Facilities District No. 1 and Community Facilities District No. 2 of Jurupa Unified School District.

* 9. Approve Out-of-State Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Rubidoux High School

(Mrs. Roberts)

Mr. Wayne Cochrun, Teacher at Rubidoux High School, is requesting permission to travel to Payson, Arizona with approximately fifteen (15) students on Thursday, July 31 through Sunday, August 3, 1997. The purpose of the trip is to provide an opportunity for students to participate in a Passing Competition and On-Field Clinic. Students will be housed and fed by host families. Supervision will be provided by staff and parent volunteers and transportation will be by district vehicles; costs will be paid by athletic funds. Administration has indicated that no student will be denied the opportunity to participate in this activity due to the lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Out-of-State Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Mr. Wayne Cochrun to travel to Payson, Arizona with approximately fifteen (15) students on Thursday, July 31 through Sunday, August 3, 1997 to participate in a Passing Competition and On-Field Clinic.

(Mrs. Roberts)

Mr. Vince Rosse, Teacher at Rubidoux High School, is requesting permission to travel to Riverside with approximately twelve (12) yearbook staff members on Friday, August 15 through Saturday, August 16, 1997 for an overnight camp at 2152 Stonefield Place in Riverside. The purpose of the camp is to provide an opportunity for students to begin the process of producing the 1998 yearbook; receive training on ways to work with fellow staff members and editors; develop a calendar of the year's events and page flow for the yearbook; establish position responsibilities and make preparations for the retreat at Lake Arrowhead. Travel will be provided by parents and supervision will be provided by staff members and adult volunteers. All costs will be paid by the yearbook trust account. Administration has indicated that no student has been denied the opportunity to participate in this activity due to the lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Mr. Vince Rosse to travel to Riverside with approximately twelve (12) students on Friday, August 15 through Saturday, August 16, 1997 to participate in an overnight camp training session for the purpose of beginning the process of producing the 1998 yearbook.

* 11. Approve Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Rubidoux High School

(Mrs. Roberts)

Mr. Vince Rosse, Teacher at Rubidoux High School is requesting permission to travel to Lake Arrowhead with approximately twelve (12) students on Monday, August 18 through Friday, August 22, 1997. The purpose of the trip is to attend an annual training camp sponsored by Josten's and will allow students to learn the proper layout of a yearbook and the proper use of graphics. Students will be given an opportunity to participate in workshops designed to teach theme development, computers, photography, leadership and team work. Travel will be by district and personal vehicles, lodging and meals are included in registration costs and supervision will be by staff members and volunteers. Administration has indicated that no student has been denied the opportunity to participate in this activity due to the lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Mr. Vince Rosse to travel to Lake Arrowhead with approximately twelve (12) students on Monday. August 18 through Friday, August 22, 1997 to participate in an annual camp sponsored by Josten's in the design and layout of the yearbook.

B. Authorize Purchase of One (1) Truck for District Warehouse Operations - Bid #98/01L

(Mr. Edmunds)

At the April 21, 1997 Board Meeting, the Board authorized administration to solicit bids for a new District Warehouse delivery truck to be purchased with One-Time Block Grant Funds. The District advertised in the Press-Enterprise on July 3 and July 10, 1997, for bids to supply one (1) Mitsubishi Fuso FH 211 Chassis with a sixteen (16) foot aluminum body. The truck features a hydraulic lift gate with a 60" x 90" platform which will facilitate safer loading and unloading of paper pallets and oversized equipment.

B. <u>Authorize Purchase of One (1) Truck for District Warehouse Operations - Bid #98/01L</u> (Cont'd)) (Mr. Edmunds)

Administration recommends the Board approve issuance of Purchase Order #97221 to Dieterich International Truck Sales in the amount of \$46,755.95 for the purchase of one truck for District Warehouse Operations.

C. Status of Jurupa Valley Sports Complex Planning

(Mr. Edmunds)

Administration will provide the Board with an oral report concerning the status of the Jurupa Valley Sports Complex planning, as well as the joint use administrative facility concept. Staff was scheduled to meet with EDA staff representatives on Thursday, July 10, and the Jurupa Valley Sports Complex Committee was scheduled to meet on July 15, 1997. The outcome of these meetings, as well as any revisions in the plan design or memorandum of understanding for the sports complex and joint use administrative facility will be brought to the Board for review. The Board should be prepared to provide direction to staff as necessary.

D. Review and Act on Timely School Facility Matters

Approve Issuance of Purchase Order #96981 for the Purchase of Basketball Back Stops
 (Mr. Edmunds)

The Purchasing Department has received a requisition to purchase replacement basketball back stops Districtwide. The total amount of the requisition for back stops and ancillary parts is \$19,141.18. Board policy requires that purchase orders in excess of \$12,000 be board approved prior to purchase of materials.

Administration recommends approval for the issuance of Purchase Order #96981 in the amount of \$19,141.18 to Moore Recreation & Park Equipment of Thousand Oaks, California.

2. Award Bid #98/03 for the Installation of Water Main at Jurupa Valley High School and Approve Issuance of Purchase Order #97240 (Mr. Edmunds)

At the February 20, 1996 Board Meeting, the Board approved an agreement with Jurupa Community Services District for irrigation water at Jurupa Valley High School. In the agreement Jurupa Community Services District was to pay for the cost of capital improvements necessary to activate the well, and Jurupa Unified School District would be responsible for the cost of connecting the well to the school's irrigation system. At the time, Administration estimated the cost to be twenty-two thousand dollars (\$22,000).

D. Review and Act on Timely School Facility Matters (Cont'd)

2. Award Bid #98/03 for the Installation of Water Main at Jurupa Valley High School and Approve Issuance of Purchase Order #97240 (Cont'd) (Mr. Edmunds)

Jurupa Community Services District has completed the improvements of the well and it is now ready for connection and activation. Administration advertised in the Public Notice Section of the Press Enterprise on June 20 and 27, 1997, and delivered bid packages to three (3) prospective bidders for the connection of the well to the irrigation system. A recap of bids received appears below:



EQUIPMENT AND CLASSROOM COMPUTER PROGRAMS; A NEW SOUND SYSTEM VALUED AT \$1,993.37 FROM THE VAN BUREN PTA; \$56.05 FROM THE SIXTH GRADE BOOSTER CLUB TO REIMBURSE THE DONATION ACCOUNT FOR THE END-OF-THE-YEAR FIELD TRIP.

The Superintendent introduced Rubidoux High School teacher, Mrs. Rhonda Fuller, and the five FFA students present to come forward for the announcement of the next donation.

ON BEHALF OF THE DISSOLVING OF THE GOLD NUGGET PROSPECTORS CLUB, INC., MR. & MRS. RAY TEAGARDEN DONATED A \$5,000 CASH DONATION TO THE JURUPA VALLEY FFA/AG. PROGRAM A \$5,000 CASH DONATION, AND OTHER DONATIONS VALUED AT \$40,000 TO INCLUDE A 1995 TRUCK, A GENERATOR AND FUEL TANK, A FOOD FREEZER, A TRAILER HITCH, A P.A. SYSTEM, FOLDING TABLES, A LADDER, A CAMERA, TELEPHONES, A PROPANE HEATER WITH TANK, A LIFTING DOLLY, A C-B WALKIE-TALKIE SET, A METAL DETECTOR AND OTHER MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS FOR THE RUBIDOUX HIGH SCHOOL FFA/AG. DEPARTMENT.

The Superintendent recognized Mr. and Mrs. Teagarden for their generous donation. Ms. Fuller introduced the five FFA/Ag. officers for the 1997/98 school year. She stated that the Rubidoux High School FFA/Ag. Department is excited about this donation and expressed their appreciation to Mr. and Mrs. Teagarden by inviting them to become lifetime FFA honorary members.

Mr. Ray Teagarden outlined the lengthy process involved in making the donation on behalf of the Gold Nugget Prospectors Club, Inc. and its members. The Superintendent noted that she has been working with Mr. Teagarden for over six months to work out the details of the donation. MRS. ADAMS SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ANNOUNCE SCHOOL BOARD VACANCY, TRUSTEE AREA 1 The Superintendent stated that upon returning from vacation, she reviewed a letter from Ms. Holly Hanke, resigning from her Board of Education seat in Trustee Area 1. Her resignation was filed with the County Superintendent of Schools, and was effective June 23, 1997. Ms. Hanke indicated the reason she resigned is to pursue an employment opportunity in another area. In her letter, Ms. Hanke apologized for any inconvenience that her resignation may have caused the Board and the District.



ANNOUNCE SCHOOL BOARD VACANCY, TRUSTEE AREA 1 (CONT'D) Further, the Superintendent reported that she received a letter from Riverside County Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Dale Holmes, included in the supporting documents, acknowledging Ms. Hanke's resignation as being effective June 23, 1997. He indicated that his interpretation of the Education Code was that the District would need to hold an election to fill the vacancy at the November 4, 1997 election. However, it has since become clear that his decision was based on the premise that the Board vacancy would be filled in conjunction with existing expiring terms of other Board members, Education Code 5093(b). The matter has now been clarified that since there are no Board terms expiring for Jurupa Unified School District Board members in November, 1997; therefore, the County Superintendent contacted the Superintendent today and provided a hand-carried letter (copies were distributed to Board members and the Press) to this evening's meeting indicating that the Board now has two options: (1) request that the County Superintendent maintain the "Order of Election" for November 4, 1997, or (2) immediately notify him in writing, by July 8, of the Board's decision to make a provisional appointment. If the second option is selected, a provisional appointment must occur by August 22, sixty days from the date of the receipt of the resignation.

DECLARE EMERGENCY MEASURE: ADD TO AGENDA ITEM 2A -OPTION FOR PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT -Motion #2 The Superintendent outlined the timeline and details involved in a provisional appointment as well as discussing the various costs for the District to hold an election. She indicated that at this time, since new information was received today, the Board has the right to declare that an emergency exists, and in the form of a motion, add to Agenda Item 2a., the option of a provisional appointment.

MR. KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD DECLARE THAT AN EMERGENCY EXISTS, AND ADD A DECISION OPTION TO AGENDA ITEM 2A: A PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT, OR TO MAINTAIN THE ELECTION ORDER. MRS. ADAMS SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

SELECT PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT TO FILL TRUSTEE AREA 1 VACANCY -Motion #3 The Board discussed both options, a provisional appointment or to maintain the election order, and after a question and answer review with the Superintendent, the following factors emerged: the range in cost for an election was estimated at from \$42,000 to \$82,000; for either option, the person elected or appointed will serve until November, 1998, the end of Ms. Hanke's term; signatures in the form of a petition from 499 registered voters could be used to challenge a provisional appointment; the Superintendent will review previous provisional appointment data on file, if this option is selected, to develop timelines and the application and selection process.

Based on the cost effectiveness of a provisional appointment, the Board reached consensus in favor of a provisional appointment. The Superintendent noted that more than likely, interested individuals will be invited to submit applications during the next two weeks, with statements presented in public session at the regularly scheduled meeting on August 4, 1997, with an additional meeting the following week if needed; thereby adhering to the August 22, 1997 deadline.

MRS. ADAMS MOVED THE BOARD MAKE A PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENT TO FILL THE VACANCY IN TRUSTEE AREA 1. MR. KNIGHT SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY. The Superintendent noted that she will inform the County Superintendent of Schools tomorrow, July 8, in writing, to rescind his "Order of Election."



APPROVE RES. #98/03, 95/5 INITIATIVE
-Motion #4

The Superintendent noted that at a previous Board meeting, President Chavez requested that information be placed on the Agenda regarding UTLA's 95/5 Initiative. She explained that the reason so many groups are in opposition to this particular Initiative, is that it removes local governing boards' options as to how they structure school district operations. The Superintendent indicated that CSBA's Fact Sheet is included in the supporting documents concerning the Initiative along with a resolution for the Board's consideration opposing "95/5."

MR. KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE RESOLUTION #98/03, OPPOSING THE 95/5 INITIATIVE. MRS. BURNS SECONDED THE MOTION. President Chavez reported that at the Delegate Assembly meeting last December, this topic was discussed at length, and the Initiative would be particularly detrimental to small districts throughout the State. He indicated that he has a copy of the Initiative in its entirety, and there are numerous groups opposing this measure. A VOTE WAS TAKEN WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

PUBLIC VERBAL COMMENTS

Mr. Ray Teagarden spoke in support of the Board's decision to make a provisional appointment to fill the vacancy in Trustee Area 1 in order to save the district the cost of an election.

BOARD MEMBER REPORTS & COMMENTS Each Board member individually thanked Mr. and Mrs. Ray Teagarden for their generous donation to the FFA/Ag. Departments at the comprehensive high schools.

Mr. Knight commented that "parents do make a difference in the total community," and he offered words of thanks to all who support the district through donations in order to enhance the educational process for youth.

President Chavez submitted correspondence from the Youth Service Center concerning their substance abuse counseling services provided; CSBA material to place on the Agenda for the Board to nominate a 1997 Outstanding Legislator of the Year, with an August 8 deadline, and Gage Middle School computer information for Mr. Neil Mercurius, Administrator of Instructional Technology, to review.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services noted to President Chavez that the next meeting with Supervisor Tavaglione concerning the Sports Complex is scheduled for July 15 at 5:00 p.m.; location to be determined.

President Chavez noted that he plans to attend the following meetings: the Jurupa Community Leadership Council meeting to discuss the needs of youth in the Jurupa area, and an RCSBA meeting; he invited Board member, Mrs. Carolyn Adams, to be his guest at the second meeting.

The Superintendent noted that Mr. Knight's family was featured and recognized in a recent Inland Empire magazine.

There were five sites that were involved in the extensive Program Quality Review Process, and their school level plans have much more extensive revisions.

STATUS REPORT - SPORTS COMPLEX

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services noted for the Board that as per their direction at the last Board meeting, he met with the Jurupa Community Services District (JCSD), the Jurupa Area Recreation and Park District (JARPD) and the County Redevelopment Agency concerning the proposed Sports Complex to discuss the district's role and the Board's major points of concern/interest as outlined on the Board Agenda. Since there is interest on the part of the district is the joint-use administrative facility on the Jurupa and Pedley Roads property, discussion focused primarily on ideas related to this topic. The JARPD and JCSD are interested in exploring the concept as well. The following considerations were presented: a 40,000 sq. ft. building.; additional parking on an infrequently used portion of the Jurupa Middle School field; construction of new joint-use baseball fields in the southeast corner of the Jurupa Middle School field, with financial commitments to be discussed at a later time. The Assistant Superintendent indicated that he spoke with Mr. Walt Lancaster, Principal of Jurupa Middle, and confirmed that the portion of the Jurupa Middle School field under consideration for the joint-use facility is indeed not a primary area for student usage. He explained that at the next planned meeting, he needs to convey to the agency representatives whether the Board remains interested in pursuing conceptual plans for the joint-use facility, as described above.

Following a lengthy discussion, the Board reached consensus that the Assistant Superintendent Business Services will convey to the Economic Development Agency at their next meeting that the Board does have specific interest in the conceptual ideas for a joint-use administrative facility, with the understanding that detailed drawing configurations and proposed financial commitments are forthcoming, and will include the consideration of possibly utilizing a portion of the Jurupa Middle School field for parking that receives infrequent student use, and constructing a new joint-use ball field at Jurupa Middle School.

MR. KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD ADOPT THE "DECLARATION OF NEED FOR FULLY QUALIFIED EDUCATORS" FOR 1997-98. MRS. ADAMS SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ADOPT 1996-97 & 1997-98 SALARY SCHEDULES FOR MANAGEMENT EMPLOYEES -Motion #11 The Assistant Superintendent Personnel Services brought forward a similar salary schedule and health and welfare benefits recommendation for 1996-97 and 1997-98 for the 67 employees not represented by either collective bargaining unit: a 2.5% salary increase effective May 1, 1997, and a 2.7% increase effective July 1, 1997, along with an additional increase for 13 of the 67 management employees as listed on the salary schedules in the supporting documents.

MRS. ADAMS MOVED THE BOARD INCREASE THE CURRENT MANAGEMENT SALARY SCHEDULES (REGULATIONS #4340, 4440 AND 4540) BY 2.5% EFFECTIVE MAY 1, 1997 AND BY 2.7% EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1997 AS SHOWN IN THE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS. MR. KNIGHT SECONDED THE MOTION. The Assistant Superintendent Personnel Services explained to President Chavez that CSEA is aware of the settlement with NEA-J and they have their own negotiating team working with the district in this area. A VOTE WAS TAKEN WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

INCREASE HEALTH & WELFARE BENEFIT CONTRIBUTION FOR MANAGEMENT EMPLOYEES -Motion #12

MRS. ADAMS MOVED THE BOARD INCREASE THE MAXIMUM DISTRICT CONTRIBUTION FOR HEALTH AND WELFARE BENEFITS TO \$4,400 FOR EACH FULL-TIME MANAGEMENT EMPLOYEE FOR THE 1997-98 SCHOOL YEAR. MR. KNIGHT SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

APPROVE VARIABLE TERM WAIVER RENEWALS FOR 8 TEACHERS -Motion #13 The Assistant Superintendent Personnel Services stated that the following eight special education teachers working under a variable term waiver and currently enrolled in a program toward earning their certificated special education credentials, are in need of the renewal of their variable term waivers: Mr. Freddie Goss, Mr. Kevin White, Ms. Laila Baltgalvis, Mr. Gary Evans, Mr. Doug Hath, Ms. Marcia Rivero, Ms. Arlene Stevens and Ms. Shelly Garth.

MR. KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE FOR EMPLOYMENT FOR THIS SCHOOL YEAR THE EIGHT TEACHERS, SPECIAL EDUCATION OR LANGUAGE, SPEECH AND HEARING SPECIALIST, AS LISTED ON THE AGENDA, UNDER THE AUTHORIZATION OF A VARIABLE TERM WAIVER. MRS. ADAMS SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

APPROVE 1997-98 CBEST WAIVERS FOR SUBSTITUTE TEACHERS' -Motion #14 The Assistant Superintendent Personnel Services stated that last year the Commission on Teacher Credentialing sent to districts around the State, language allowing, by board action, to waive the CBEST requirement for up to one year as a provision to provide for the shortage of substitute teachers caused by the Class Size Reduction Program. He noted that the district has taken advantage of this waiver with good results, and requested the Board's approval for the use of the variable term CBEST waivers for the 1997-98 school year according to the CTA language.

MRS. ADAMS MOVED THE BOARD DECLARE THAT TEACHERS WERE HIRED FROM THE DISTRICT SUBSTITUTE POOL TO IMPLEMENT CLASS SIZE REDUCTION AND, AS A CONSEQUENCE OF THIS ACTION, THE DISTRICT IS UNABLE TO RECRUIT SUBSTITUTES WHO HAVE HAD AN OPPORTUNITY TO TAKE AND PASS THE CALIFORNIA BASIC EDUCATIONAL SKILLS TEST (CBEST). THE DISTRICT ANTICIPATES EMPLOYING FIFTY SUBSTITUTES ON VARIABLE TERM CBEST WAIVERS. MRS. BURNS SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ORDINANCE NO. 98/01

AN URGENCY ORDINANCE LEVYING SPECIAL TAXES TO BE COLLECTED DURING FISCAL YEAR 1997-98 FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON AND ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES WITH RESPECT TO THE BONDS OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 1 OF JURUPA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF JURUPA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

School District (the "Board") levy special taxes pursuant to Sections 53340 and 53358 of the Government Code for the payment of the principal of and interest on the outstanding bonds of Community Facilities District No. 1 of Jurupa Unified School District, County of Riverside, State of California (the "District"), and for the payment of administrative expenses incurred in connection with the levy and collection of said special taxes and the payment of such principal and interest.

Section 2. Levy of Special Taxes. Special taxes shall be and are hereby levied for the fiscal year 1997-98 on all parcels of real property within the District and within Improvement Area No. 1 and Improvement Area No. 2 thereof which are subject to taxation, which are identified in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" attached hereto, and in the amount set forth for each such parcel in said Exhibits "A" and "B". Pursuant to said Sections 53340 and 53358, such special taxes shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem property taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure, sale, and lien priority in case of delinquency as is provided for ad valorem taxes.

Section 3. Transmittal to County. The Clerk of the Board of Education shall immediately following adoption of this ordinance transmit a copy hereof to the Board of Supervisors

and the County Auditor of the County of Riverside together with a request that the special taxes as levied hereby be collected on the tax bills for the parcels identified in Exhibits "A" and "B" hereto, along with the ordinary ad valorem property taxes to be levied on and collected from the owners of said parcels.

Section 4. <u>Authorization to Publish Ordinance</u>. The President of the Board of Education shall sign this ordinance and the Clerk shall attest thereto and shall, within fifteen days of its adoption, cause it or a summary of it to be published in a newspaper circulated in Jurupa Unified School District.

Section 5. Urgency and Effective Date. This ordinance is an urgency ordinance relating to taxes for the usual and current expenses of the District, i.e., the levy of special taxes to pay the principal of and interest on the outstanding bonds of the District. Accordingly, pursuant to Sections 36937 of the Government Code, this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 98/02

AN URGENCY ORDINANCE LEVYING SPECIAL TAXES TO BE COLLECTED DURING FISCAL YEAR 1997-98 FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON AND ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES WITH RESPECT TO THE BONDS OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2 OF IURUPA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF JURUPA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Findings. It is necessary that the Board of Education of Jurupa Unified School District (the "Board") levy special taxes pursuant to Sections 53340 and 53358 of the Government Code for the payment of the principal of and interest on the outstanding bonds of Community Facilities District No. 2 of Jurupa Unified School District, County of Riverside, State of California (the "District"), and for the payment of administrative expenses incurred in connection with the levy and collection of said special taxes and the payment of such principal and interest.

Section 2. Levy of Special Taxes. Special taxes shall be and are hereby levied for the fiscal year 1996-97 on all parcels of real property within the District which are subject to taxation, which are identified in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, and in the amount set forth for each such parcel in said Exhibit "A". Pursuant to said Sections 53340 and 53358, such special taxes shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem property taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure, sale, and lien priority in case of delinquency as is provided for ad valorem taxes.

Section 3. Transmittal to County. The Clerk of the Board of Education shall immediately following adoption of this ordinance transmit a copy hereof to the Board of Supervisors and the County Auditor of the County of Riverside together with a request that the special taxes as



levied hereby be collected on the tax bills for the parcels identified in Exhibit "A" hereto, along with the ordinary ad valorem property taxes to be levied on and collected from the owners of said parcels.

Section 4. <u>Authorization to Publish Ordinance</u>. The President of the Board of Education shall sign this ordinance and the Clerk shall attest thereto and shall, within fifteen days of its adoption, cause it or a summary of it to be published in a newspaper circulated in Jurupa Unified School District.

Section 5. Urgency and Effective Date. This ordinance is an urgency ordinance relating to taxes for the usual and current expenses of the District, i.e., the levy of special taxes to pay the principal of and interest on the outstanding bonds of the District. Accordingly, pursuant to Sections 36937 of the Government Code, this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
