b. Recognize Golden State Examination Scholars

Two hundred seven Jurupa Unified students received high honors or honors recognition in the 1996-97 California incentive program, the Golden State Examinations (GSE), administered in May of 1997. In 1997, more than 664,700 students statewide took part in the first-year algebra, geometry, U.S. history, economics, government/civics, biology, chemistry, second-year coordinated science and written composition exams. Ninety-four of these students attend Jurupa Valley High School, eighty-seven attend Rubidoux High School, ten attend Jurupa Middle School, eight attend Mira Loma Middle and eight attend Mission Middle School.

The purpose of this examination, established by the California Education Reform Act of 1983 (SB813) is to identify and recognize students with outstanding achievement in first-year algebra, geometry, United States history, economics, government/civics, biology, chemistry, second-year coordinated science and written composition. Students aim for one of three levels of award--high honors, honors or school recognition. Students who achieve high honors or honors on the GSE receive a certificate of achievement from the State and an insignia on their diplomas. Notice of GSE achievement also will become part of each student's permanent transcript.

The County form listing Board members and school district employees authorized to transact various business functions for the school district has been changed to specify the type of documents to be signed by the individuals. Throughout the school year, the Business Office monitors and adjusts the District's various budgets with respect to both revenue and expenditures. Changes in revenue result from grant applications, increased funding, adjustments to ADA, apportionment reductions, etc.

The method by which the revenue side of the budget is adjusted is to adopt a Resolution for Expenditure for Excess Funds. In this action the Board approves adding revenue to the budget for various purposes. Since the budget was revised on December 8, 1997, the District has received revenue adjustments in the amount of \$286,912, as identified below. These funds are restricted in their use and offsetting expenditures are budgeted.

* 9. Approve Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) Agreement

(Mrs. Roberts)

This spring, California students will take standardized tests approved by the State Board of Education. Education Code 60643(c) outlines the new standardized testing requirements. After considerable discussion and review, the State Board selected the Stanford 9 Test. Students in grades 2-8 will be tested in the basic skills of reading, spelling, written expression and mathematics and students in grades 9-11 will take tests in reading, writing, mathematics, history-social science and science. In order to fulfill our obligation to test all pupils in grades 2-11 as required by Senate Bill 376, the Board must approve a Standard Agreement with Harcourt Brace, publishers of the Stanford 9 Test. A question and answer document regarding the new STAR program is included in the supporting documents.

Administration recommends that the Board authorize its representatives to enter into a Standard Agreement as required by Education Code Section 60643(c) for the Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) Program with the publishers of the Stanford 9 for the provision of State testing materials and scoring.

The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #98-041 for violation of Education Code 48900 (c & k) for the remainder of the current semester; and that the student be allowed to enroll and participate in the Community Day School, operated at the District Learning Center, for the term of the expulsion order. This case will be referred to the School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE) for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before February 2, 1998.

PRESIDENT KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF TEN (10) COMPAQ COMPUTER SYSTEMS, WITH MONITORS AND NETWORK COMPONENTS, AT A COST NOT TO EXCEED \$35,191.45. MR. TEAGARDEN SECONDED THE MOTION. The Assistant Superintendent stated that the computers being purchased to hook up to the new system are state-of-the-art equipment; they will be paid for out of the General Fund and there will be no problem transferring the computers to a new Education Center building. A VOTE WAS TAKEN WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

STATUS REPORT ON SELECTION OF ARCHITECT FOR NEW EDUCATION CENTER

The Superintendent reported that over the past several months, discussion by the Board included the possibility of a partnership with other local governmental agencies to build a new Education Center. Further discussion led to the authorization for administration to either select an architect or a design-build contractor using existing district Redevelopment revenue and building the administrative facility independently. Mr. Teagarden was appointed to serve as the Board's representative to serve on the committee to interview and select an architectural firm.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services explained that with the help of Tilden Coil Constructors, Inc., a questionnaire was developed for the interview process, and five architectural firms were identified and interviewed by the committee on November 19 and 20, 1997 based on references from other school districts. The choice was narrowed to two firms, the HMC Group, Inc., and Perkins and Will. Following visits to both firms, Perkins and Will was selected as the architect to build the new Education Center. At the recommendation of the district's attorney, the district will draft two contracts, one for Tilden-Coil, as Construction Manager, and one for Perkins and Will, as the architect. The district will work closely with both firms to develop a set of biddable drawings within the budgetary constraints. In addition, the Assistant Superintendent reported that meetings will be held with Perkins and Will to develop plans to install the next set of Class Size Reduction portables arriving in late April or May.

Standardized Testing and Reporting Program - STAR

Questions and Answers about the STAR program for Educators

Senate Bill 376, approved by the Legislature and the Governor, established a new mandated statewide testing program called the Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) Program. Additionally, the State Board of Education has approved emergency regulations to implement the STAR program.

What is the STAR Program?

Senate Bill 376 requires that all public school districts use a single standardized test, designated by the State Board of Education, to test each pupil in grades 2-11 by May 15 of each year, beginning with the 1997-98 year (including students enrolled in opportunity, continuation, independent study, community day, charter, placed in nonpublic schools, home or hospital programs, and schools operated by a County Office of Education. Students enrolled in private and parochial schools are not included.). The publisher and the school district shall provide two makeup days for the testing of previously absent pupils no later than May 25. Pupils in grades 2-8 will be tested in the basic skills of reading, spelling, written expression, and mathematics. Pupils in grades 9-11 will be tested in reading, writing, mathematics, history-social science, and science. The designated test will be nationally norm-referenced and will provide individual pupil scores that will be reported in writing to schools and the parents of each pupil tested. The State Department of Education and the designated publisher shall make the grade, school, school district, and state results available on the Internet by June 30 of each year.

What is a nationally norm-referenced achievement test?

When publishers develop a new norm-referenced achievement test, it is first administered to a sample of students across the country that represents the national student population. We can compare student performance on standardized tests to that of other students (i.e., in the norm group) to see how a student's score ranked among others who have taken the same test under the same conditions. Does the student score higher than most? Lower? Somewhere in the middle? Specifically, percentile rank scores tell us what percent of the norm group a student with any given raw score outscored. For example, a student with a percentile rank of 65 outscored 65 percent of the students on whom the test was normed. We must constantly remind ourselves of the limitation of these types of tests. They are usually limited to multiple-choice questions and only assess a small fraction of what students are expected to know and be able to do. They provide a "snapshot" of student performance at one time during the school year. Schools and parents will be provided with other types of scores in addition to national percentile ranks.

What test did the State Board of Education designate?

On November 14, 1997, the State Board of Education designated the Stanford Achievement Test, Ninth Edition, Form T, published by Harcourt Brace Educational Measurement (HBEM), for use in the STAR Program. Form T is a secure version of the Stanford 9 customized by the publisher and never sold to individual school districts in California.

What type of test security procedures will be used?

The designated district and school site STAR coordinators will need to sign a STAR Security Agreement. All individuals including administrators, teachers, and aides who will have access to the test materials will need to sign a STAR Security Affidavit requiring them to keep the test items confidential. Test materials will need to be returned to the publisher for scoring no later than June 1. Harcourt Brace will use both a universal bar code imprinted on each test booklet and a test booklet weighing technique to determine whether all test booklets have been returned for all grade levels (2-11). Districts will not be able to keep the reusable booklets at grades 4-11

What are the tests on the Stanford 9 complete battery that students are required to take?

Word study skills (grade 2 only), reading vocabulary, reading comprehension, math problem solving, math procedures, language, and spelling are required in grades 2 through 8. In grades 9 through 11, reading vocabulary, reading comprehension, math problem solving, math procedures, language, science, and social studies are required. The test booklet will be clearly marked to indicate which components are mandated by STAR.

Will students be allowed to use a calculator on the mathematics test?

The State Board of Education unanimously passed a motion not to allow the use of calculators in the STAR program. The Stanford 9 does not have separate calculator norms since studies conducted by HBEM showed no differences in scores between students using calculators on the math tests and students who did not use calculators.

Will students in third grade mark their answers on a separate answer sheet like pupils in grades 4-11?

Second and third grade students will mark their answers directly in the consumable test booklet.

Will a district pay extra for administering the science, social studies, listening, or study skills tests if used in grades 2-8?

All tests included in the test booklet may be administered at no additional cost. While the results of all subtests taken will be reported to schools and parents, only the



results of the required test areas will be reported on the Internet.

Are study skills and spelling part of the standard high school test booklet?

Districts may give study skills and spelling at no additional cost.

What are the requirements for testing students who are limited English proficient?

Under the STAR program, each school district shall administer to each of its pupils in grades 2 to 11, inclusive, the achievement test in English designated by the State Board of Education (i.e., Stanford 9, Form T). In addition to the designated test, pupils of limited English proficiency who are enrolled in any grades 2 to 11, inclusive, shall be required to take a test in their primary language if such a test is available, if less than 12 months have elapsed after their initial enrollment in any public school in the state. The twelve month period should be counted from the date of a student's initial enrollment. The actual amount of time the student has spent enrolled or their instructional program is not part of the determination. At the school district's option, pupils of limited English proficiency who are enrolled in any of grades 2 to 11, inclusive, may take a second achievement test in their primary language. The State Board of Education was not required to designate the primary language test. This decision will be left to individual school districts. Two examples of recently published norm-referenced achievement tests in Spanish include the Aprenda 2 (Harcourt Brace, 1996) and the Supera (CTB/McGraw-Hill, 1997). Districts will have the option to administer the primary language test to LEP students prior to taking the Stanford 9.

What special education students are exempted from testing?

Only those students whose IEPS specifically state that they are "exempted" from standardized achievement tests are exempted from taking the test for the STAR program. May a student in special education take only one section of the test, such as math?

If the IEP specifically exempts the student from all standardized testing that requires reading, it would be possible to test the student in math computation. Districts should rely on the Individual Educational Plan (IEP), which should specify carefully the student's exemption.

What testing accommodations may be used with students in special education?

Large print and Braille editions of Stanford 9 are available from Harcourt Brace and will be ordered along with the district's standard order. Special education students shall be tested and adaptations and accommodations may be made. Adaptations and accommodations include, but are not limited to, extended time or the use of a reader or scribe, in addition to Braille or large print. The reading section of any test shall not be read, interpreted, or translated to any pupil. Out-of-level testing is not considered an accommodation.

May a district use out-of-level testing with limited English proficient students or special

education students for whom the level specified for their grade might not be appropriate?

The results from testing students out-of-level cannot be readily interpreted, and any scores that might be derived are neither valid nor reliable. Districts are therefore discouraged from testing students out-of-level. If students are tested out-of-level, districts must make provisions to prevent inappropriate interpretations or uses of the results.

Is there a testing "window"?

The State Board of Education has established a testing "window" that extends from March 15, 1998 until May 14, 1998.

How will schools that have year-round or multitrack schedules be able to test all of their students during the testing window?

For the 1997-98 school year, testing cannot begin until March 15. In subsequent years districts may apply to begin testing as early as the fourth week of February, provided certain district size and calendar considerations are met.

What student data will districts need to report for each student?

- -Birth date
- -Grade level
- -Gender and Ethnicity
- -Home Language and Language fluency
- -Adaptations/accomodations
- -Amount of time in district and in school
- -Parent highest education level
- -Special program participation

(including free/reduce price lunch program)

- -Instructional calendar
- -Instructional setting

Following the completion of the testing in the district, what information will the district need to submit to the State Department of Education in order to obtain an apportionment?

- -Number administered test, by grade
- -Number LEP students
- -Number administered primary language test, by grade (less than 12 months and more than 12 months)
- -Number exempted per parent request
- -Number exempted per IEP

How much will the district be apportioned under the STAR program?

The State Board of Education has set the level for the total apportionment per pupil tested. That total, \$6.65, includes: \$4.10+tax to the publisher for each pupil tested; and the remainder for each pupil tested for district-required activities. The district portion includes allocations for: mailing reports to parents, transportation within the district, staff training, district and site coordinator expenses, and other contingencies. Districts wishing to arrange with the publisher for pre-identified ("pre-slugged") answer documents will receive an additional \$0.15 per pupil tested.



The \$4.10+tax per pupil to the publisher includes: all test materials, including scannable test booklets for grades 2 and 3; Braille and large print test materials where needed; notation on non-standard administration; electronic data to district (disk or tape); wrong/right erasure analysis; answer document storage for a total of four months; a second set of student reports for placement in student cumulative records; and all other materials, scoring, paper and electronic reports, production, packaging, shipping, security, and other aspects which the publisher has agreed to supply. However, districts arranging for pre-identified ("preslugged") answer documents will need to pay the publisher \$0.30 per pupil. In order to receive an apportionment, the designated test (Stanford 9, Form T) must be scored by the publisher.

Districts that order supplemental materials and do not use them at the rate of 90% (of enrollment + supplement) will pay the publisher for excess materials ordered at the rate of \$.90/test for grades 4-11; \$1.30/test for grades two and three.

What will be the district apportionment for the primary language test? Will the cost to the district for the primary language test(s) be the same as for the designated test?

The district will be apportioned \$6.65 for each student tested with a primary language test, whether it is required or optional. Unlike the designated test, for which the State Board of Education has determined the amount to be paid to the publisher for each test administered (\$4.10+tax), the cost of a primary language test may be negotiated by each district.

What test preparation materials may be used? The recently established emergency regulations state: "Except for materials specifically included within the designated achievement test or primary language test, no program or materials shall be used by any school district or employee of a school district that are specifically formulated or intended to prepare pupils for the designated achievement test or the primary language test." Administering the Stanford 9, Form S as a practice test or the use of "Scoring High on the Stanford 9" would be prohibited. Districts may use materials that are not specific to the designated test such as "Scoring High on Reading, Language, or Mathematics (SRA-McGraw-Hill)" that are intended to prepare students for the format of any standardized test.

Can districts obtain test materials such as the Stanford 9, Form S so that teachers can see what the test is like?

Districts are strongly discouraged from purchasing Stanford 9, Form S for such use. Districts that have already purchased the test and have used it in previous years are reminded that all test materials are considered secure. Any violations of test security, for any form of any nationally formed test, may subject the district to sanctions from the test publisher. Stanford 9, Form S is in use in other states and a breach of security would potentially lead to a damage award against the district.

Will districts be reimbursed for the test preparation materials that they can purchase? Test preparation materials are not among the costs related to testing that will be included in the district's apportionment.

Does a district send individual student reports of both the primary language test and the Stanford 9 to the parents of students who take both test?

Regulations adopted by the State Board of Education specify that parents of students taking the Stanford 9 and parents of students taking a primary language test are to receive a written report of the individual student's test results within 20 working days of the time the district receives the test results from the test publisher(s). If the reports are received in the district after school is out, the district will mail the reports.

Can parents withdraw their students from testing?

Students whose parents provide a written request that their children not be tested shall be exempted from taking the test. Districts may not solicit parents to request this exemption. Districts may notify parents of the opt out provision; however, notification is not required.

Will inservice sessions about the STAR program be provided to school districts?

In cooperation with County Offices of Education, HBEM will conduct inservices about the Stanford 9. The session for the Riverside County Office of Education is tentatively scheduled for February 3, 1998. More details will follow.
