3. Administrative Reports and Written Communications

a. Status of the District and Opening of the 1998-99 School Year (Mrs. Roberts) The traditional school year began August 27, 1998. The Superintendent will report on the opening day and other matters affecting the school district, including enrollment, staffing, budget, facilities, curriculum, and new policies or legislation affecting school district operations. Information only.

b. Consider Nominations for California School Boards Association (CSBA)Directors-at-Large (Mrs. Roberts)

The supporting documents contain information from the California School Boards Association on elections for three CSBA directors-at-large positions for Asian/Pacific Islander, Black, and Hispanic.  The County requires a list of Board members and school district employees authorized to transact various business functions for the school district. There are no changes on the Certification list. Changes on the Authorized Agents list are for the Cafeteria Account, Jurupa and Mission Middle Schools.

 It is recommended the Certification of Signatures and list of Authorized Agents in the supporting documents be approved.
- * 11. Approve Resolution #99/04, Authorization to Conduct Surplus Sale

 Throughout the year, the Warehouse accumulates surplus items from throughout the District which are old, obsolete, non-repairable or uneconomical to repair. A list of such items is included in the supporting documents. Education Code Section 39520 requires that items, whether one or more, having a value in excess of \$2,500 be sold to the highest responsible bidder. Education Code Section 39521-a allows that items, whether one or more, which do not exceed a value of \$2,500 may be sold at private sale without advertising. Section 39521-b allows that any items having previously been offered for sale pursuant to Section 39520, for which no qualified bid was received, may be sold at private sale without advertising; and Section 39521-c allows that property of insufficient value to defray the cost of arranging for a sale may be either donated to a charitable organization or disposed of in the local public dump.

A. Approve Routine Action Items by Consent (Continued)

- * 11. Approve Resolution #99/04, Authorization to Conduct Surplus Sale (Cont'd) (Mr. Edmunds) The Board will remember approving items for surplus sale at its meeting of July 20, 1998. The date scheduled for auction of those surplus items is September 19, 1998. The surplus items shown in the attached supporting documents were not part of the July surplus, and Administration would like authorization to include them in the September 19th auction of surplus items. The list of items included in the supporting documents exceeds \$2,500 in value, and Administration recommends that the Board approve Resolution #99/04, Authorization to Conduct Surplus Sale. Administration further recommends that the Board direct the Director of Purchasing to dispose of unsold items at private sale pursuant to Education Code Section 39521-a and that any item remaining after previous attempts at sale be donated to a recognized charitable organization or disposed of in the local dump pursuant to Education Code 39521-c.
 - 12. Approve Change Order #1 to La Rue Painting for Painting of Six (6) District Sites -Bid #98/12L (Mr. Edmunds)
 At the May 18, 1998 Board Meeting, the Board authorized awarding a contract to La Rue Painting for painting of six (6) District sites Bid #98/12L in the amount of \$81,000. After work had commenced at Jurupa Valley High School, it was determined that an interior hallway, two classrooms, and two offices were in need of re-painting. The contractor has proposed to complete the work for an additional \$5,000.

 Administration recommends that the Board authorize Change Order #1 to La Rue Painting of Norco, California, for painting of six (6) District sites Bid #98/12L in the amount of \$5,000.
- *13. Approve Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Jurupa Valley High (Dr. Mason) Mr. Ralph Martinez, Assistant Principal at Jurupa Valley High School, is requesting permission for the varsity football team to travel to Las Vegas, Nevada to participate in an athletic contest. Approximately fifty-one students will travel to Bonanza High School on Friday, October 9, through Saturday, October 10, 1998. Supervision will be provided by staff members and booster club parents; travel will be by chartered bus, and housing will be at Buffalo Bill's. All costs for this trip will be paid through the Football Trust Account and the Football Booster Club. Administration has indicated that no student will be denied the opportunity to participate in this activity due to the lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents.

 It is recommended that the Board approve the request from Mr. Ralph Martinez to travel to Bonanza High School in Las Vegas, Nevada on Friday, October 9, through Saturday, October 10, 1998, with approximately fifty-one students to participate in an athletic contest.
- *14. Approve Out-of-State Travel Request
 Mr. Neil Mercurius is requesting approval to travel to Nashville, Tennessee on Wednesday,
 October 28, through Saturday, October 31, 1998, to attend the 12th Annual Technology +
 Learning Conference. Mr. Mercurius will attend workshops providing information on
 managing and implementing education technology and new products. He will also be
 offered the opportunity to gain information related to administrative issues with technology,
 classroom-based curriculum applications, funding resources, issues in distance learning,
 staff development strategies, and legal issues with technologies. A copy of the Travel
 Request is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Out-of-State Travel Request from Mr. Neil Mercurius to travel to Nashville, Tennessee to attend the 12th Annual Technology + Learning Conference on Wednesday, October 28 through Saturday, October 31, 1998.

A. Approve Routine Action Items by Consent (Continued)

*15. Adopt the Deletion of Board Policy 6409, Swimming Pool Rules (Dr. Needham) This Policy, which was last revised 6/21/82, lists very specific rules for swimming pool safety, especially regarding the certification and activities of lifeguards. Because it is a list of rules and not a statement of policy, Administration recommends that Board Policy 6409 be deleted from the Board Policy Manual. The California School Board's Association does not have any comparable list of rules for swimming pool use recommended for policy. These rules have been placed in Education Services Procedure 244, Swimming Pool Rules, which is now in place in the Administrative Handbook (copy in supporting documents).

Administration Recommends that the Board adopt the deletion of Board Policy 6409.

*16. Approve 1998-99 Discipline Committee

The Board of Education annually appoints selected certificated personnel to sit in lieu of the Board of Education at expulsion and readmission administrative hearings. A list of the 1998-99 Discipline Committee members is presented in the supporting documents.

Administration recommends the Board of Education approve the 1998-99 Discipline Committee Panel Members to sit in lieu of the Board of Education at Administrative Hearings.

**17. Adopt Revised "Student Discipline Handbook" (Dr. Needham) Included in the supporting documents for Board members is a copy of the August 1998 revision of the "Student Discipline Handbook." This handbook serves as the district's official Board Policy for matters of student discipline.

Each time the handbook is revised, it is necessary to have the Board adopt the new revision. The revised edition is current with new legislation that pertains to student discipline matters. A copy of this handbook is provided to all certificated staff members per their contract. Additionally, a copy of this handbook is provided to parents whenever a student is recommended for expulsion by a school principal.

Administration recommends adoption of the 1998-99 "Student Discipline Handbook."

B. Approve Schematic Design for New Education Center
On June 15, 1998, the Board reviewed the space planning requirements for housing personnel in a new Education Center to be located on the corner of Pedley and Jurupa Roads. Following a review of this information by the Board and district staff, the architectural firm of Perkins & Will prepared a Schematic Design for the Education Center. Members of the Perkins & Will architectural firm will be present at tonight's Board meeting to review the Schematic Design.

Board members should note that every department has reviewed the plans, and they have been revised accordingly. It will be important during the discussion this evening for Board members to provide input as to their desires for the configuration of the proposed Board Room which is intended as a multi-use facility to house Board and community meetings, staff development, and personnel testing.

After review and discussion, <u>Administration recommends that the Board approve the Schematic Design for the Education Center.</u>

* C. <u>Authorize Submittal of Waiver Regarding SB 1193 (Staff Development and Instructional</u> (Mrs. Roberts)

The new Staff Development legislation contained in the Governor's Budget virtually eliminates Staff Development Days inside the 180 day school calendar. However, since the State Budget was very late in being approved by the Legislature and the Governor, in recognition that school calendars had been approved prior to enactment of budget legislation, the legislation authorizes that any school maintaining pupil free days at the same level between 1997-98 and 1998-99 will be allowed to apply for a waiver for one year only. In subsequent years, this option will not be available and districts may apply for funds to pay for up to three Staff Development Days outside of the regular school calendar.

Board members may recall that when School Level Plans were adopted, Staff Development Days were so noted for each Jurupa school. The list of Staff Development Days planned for the 1998-99 school year is included in the supporting documents. All days have been reviewed by Education Services staff for conformance with the legislation which requires that these days be linked to curricular and instructional matters.

Administration recommends that the Board authorize submittal of a waiver to allow schools to implement Staff Development Day plans for the 1998-99 school year.

D. Adopt Resolution #99/05, Pupil Textbook and Instructional Materials Compliance for Fiscal Years 1997-98 and 1998-99 (Dr. Mason)

The Education Code (E.C.) specifies that the governing boards of school districts are subject to the requirements of E.C. 60119 in order to receive funding for the Pupil Textbooks and Instructional Materials Incentive Program, K-12 and/or funding for instructional materials from any state source in a fiscal year in which the Superintendent of Public Instruction determines that the base revenue limit per average daily attendance (ADA) for each school district will increase by at least one percent from the prior fiscal year. During 1997-98 the base revenue limit per ADA for each school district increased by at least one percent from 1996-97 and it is anticipated that in 1998-99 the base revenue limit per ADA for each school district will increase by at least one percent from 1997-98. This determination was received recently from the California Department of Education, and is in compliance with recent audit procedures.

In 1997-98, the total grades K-8 funding for instructional materials was \$605,521.37 and the total funding for grades 9-12 was \$98,676.41. For the 1998-99 school year, the estimated grades K-8 funding for instructional materials is \$473,136.46 and the total funding for grades 9-12 is \$98,313.74. The proposed 1998-99 State budget contains \$250 million for instructional materials. Details of the Standards-Based Instructional Materials are outlined in AB 2041. The bill provides that funds will be disbursed on a per pupil basis (not including summer school, adult education or ROC/Ps) to school districts, county offices of education and charter schools. Funds must be used for instructional materials that are aligned with state standards in language arts, mathematics, history/social science, or science with priority given to mathematics materials. In addition, \$158.5 million is proposed for the purchase of library materials. Funds will be distributed on a per-ADA basis to purchase library resources including books, periodicals, microforms, AV materials, software and other library resources.

Sufficient funds exist to meet the textbook and instructional materials needs of students consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board.

Administration recommends adoption of Resolution #99/05, Pupil Textbook and Instructional Materials Compliance for Fiscal Years 1997-98 and 1998-99, to certify that the district has complied with the requirements of Education Code 60119(c).

E. Act on District Budget Matters

1. Approve Actual Revenue and Expenditures for 1997/98 (Mr. Edmunds) Part of the process required for the preparation of the 1998/99 budget involved estimating what the total revenue and expenditures would be for 1997/98. This estimate resulted in a projected Ending Balance for 1997/98, which became the Beginning Balance for 1998/99, an important component in budget development. The estimated figures were shown on the J-200 budget document which the Board approved on June 15, 1998.

The 1997/98 fiscal year is now over and all of the actual revenue and expenditure amounts are available. These figures, referred to as the 1997/98 Unaudited Actuals, are included in the supporting documents. The major differences between the budget estimates and the unaudited actuals are as follows:

The difference is comprised of increases in Revenue Limit funding, Lottery, mandated cost reimbursement and donations offset by adjustments for Categorical fund carryover.

Overall expenditures were decreased by \$784,641. This decrease is due to lower than anticipated expenditures for salaries (\$70,673), Block and Site Grants (\$87,767), School Operation Allocation (\$51,099) and Categorical Programs (\$575,102). The Block and Site Grants, School Operation Allocation and Categorical Programs are carried over to be expended in 1998/99.

These adjustments to revenue and expenditures change the 1997/98 Ending Balance as shown below:

The changes discussed above result in an increase in the Total Ending Balance of \$789,244. The unrestricted portion of the Ending Balance increased \$683,823. This reflects an increase of \$138,866 in the carryover balances (Block Grant, Site Grant, Supply Allocation) along with an increase of \$544,957 to the Unrestricted Reserve. The restricted portion of the Ending Balance increased by \$105,421 and offsetting expenditures have been adjusted.

Administration recommends that the Certification of the Actual Revenue and Expenditures be approved by the Board and that the J-201 report, which is included in the supporting documents, be filed with the County Office of Education.

F. Review and Act on Timely School Facility Matters

(Mr. Edmunds)

Due to frequent changes taking place in facility improvement programs, items which require Board discussion or action may arise between agenda preparation and meeting times. Administration may provide such items as verbal information reports or recommendations for action.

G. Act on Personnel Matters

(Mr. Campbell) 1. Approve Personnel Report #4 Administration recommends approval of Personnel Report #4 as printed subject to corrections and changes resulting from review in Closed Session.

(Mr. Campbell) 2. Approve Variable Term Waiver Request Recent changes in state credentialing laws require that prior to hiring an individual to teach under the authorization of a Variable Term Waiver (Title V, Section 80122), specific individual approval must be granted by the governing board. Usually, this type of waiver is necessary for hard-to-fill positions in shortage areas (examples: Special Education, Bilingual Education, Mathematics or Science) or when an unexpected vacancy occurs in the middle of a school year. In this case, the recommendation is to fill vacancies for Special Day Class positions at Mira Loma Middle School and Granite Hill Elementary School, an Adapted PE position, as well as Resource Specialist positions at Rubidoux High School & Jurupa Middle School. These will not be class size reduction assignments.

G. Act on Personnel Matters

2. Approve Variable Term Waiver Request (Continued) (Mr. Campbell) The persons being recommended are Mr. Kent Bukarau, Mr. Joe Ramer, Mr. John Demor, Mr. Eric Hammond, and Mr. Victor Patton. Mr. Kent Bukarau earned his Bachelors degree from Brigham Young University. He has been a resident substitute teacher in our district for the last school year, and has been received well by the teachers and students. Mr. Bukarau will enter a formal teacher education program this year. Mr. Joe Ramer earned his Bachelors degree from National University and is currently enrolled in the Special Education program at National, working toward his teaching credential. Mr. Ramer has also been working with youths at a juvenile placement facility, as well as coaching football at a local high school. Mr. John Demor earned his Bachelors degree in Physical Education from Wayne State University, and his Masters Degree in Physical Education from Azusa Pacific University. He is currently in a credential program at Cal Poly Pomona for the Adapted PE credential. Mr. Eric Hammond received his Bachelors degree at Whittier College. He has been working as a teacher at a private Christian high school for the past two years, and is in the process of enrolling in a Special Education program working toward his special education credential. Mr. Victor Patton is a graduate of Cal State Los Angeles and has been working as a Special Day Class teacher for the past 3 years. He is currently pursuing his Masters Degree in Special Education. Recruitment efforts have not identified stronger candidates.

With these considerations in mind, it is recommended that Mr. Kent Bukarau, Mr. Joe Ramer, Mr. John Demor, Mr. Victor Patton and Mr. Eric Hammond be approved for temporary employment through the end of this school year as Special Day Class Teachers, Adapted PE Teacher and Resource Specialists, under the authorization of a Variable Term Waiver.

3. Approve Applications for Renewal of Variable Term Waiver Authorizations (Mr. Campbell) Several of our Special Education Teachers worked last year under the Authorization of a Variable Term Waiver (Title V, Section 80122). Each of these teachers has made the required progress toward completion of his/her credential and each has performed very well in the classroom in a hard-to-fill position in a shortage area. Credentialing laws require that specific approval be granted by the governing board for the renewal of waivers. Each teacher, while working under the waiver, will continue to work toward completion of all of the credential requirements. The teachers are: Laila Baltgalvis (Resource Specialist), Joe Beloni (Resource Specialist), Gary Evans (Resource Specialist), Shelley Garth (Language, Speech & Hearing Specialist), Freddie Goss (Special Day Class), Art Huerta (Resource Specialist), Nathan Martin (Special Day Class), Marcia Rivero (Resource Specialist), Kevin White (Special Day Class), and Cynthia Wilson (Special Day Class).

With these considerations in mind, it is recommended that the teachers mentioned above be approved for employment this school year as Special Education Teachers or Language, Speech and Hearing Specialist under the authorization of a Variable Term Waiver.

* 4. Ratify Agreement with NEA-J on Evaluation Procedures
A tentative agreement has been reached with the National Education Association-Jurupa on a revised set of evaluation procedures for all certificated unit members. Not only have the elements of evaluation been revised to comply with current law, but also the forms used for evaluation have been expanded, clarified, and amended appropriately for non-teaching unit members. Both the revised Evaluation Procedures Article and the required forms are included in the supporting documents.

G. Act on Personnel Matters (Continued)

- 4. Ratify Agreement with NEA-J on Evaluation Procedures (Continued) (Mr. Campbell) In order to put the new procedures in place for the new school year, both administration and the teachers' union are seeking ratification at this time, rather than waiting until negotiations on the entire contract is completed later this fall. We have been advised by NEA-J leadership that ratification by their members was anticipated prior to tonight's meeting. Assuming that ratification by NEA-J has occurred, it is recommended that the Board ratify the tentative agreement with NEA-J on Evaluation Procedures.
 - 5. Approve District "Committee on Assignments" (Ed. Code Section 44258.7) (Mr. Campbell) On September 6, 1988 the Board approved the establishment of a District "Committee on Assignments." The Committee approves teacher assignments of up to two periods per day in areas where the teacher has special skills or preparation. Recently, the Education Code has increased the maximum number of periods authorized to five, but limited all assignments to elective courses (i.e. No Math, Science, English or Social Science). Because of the change in the Education Code, the Committee should be reauthorized by the Board. Teacher representation on the committee is determined by the President of NEA-J and administrator representation is determined by the Assistant Superintendent of Personnel Services.

It is recommended that the Board approved establishment of a "Committee on Assignments" as provided in Education Code Section 44258.7.

- (Mrs. Roberts) 2. 1998-99 Adopted Budget Approval Administration has received a letter from the Riverside County Office of Education approving the district's 1998-99 Adopted Budget as submitted. The letter is included in the supporting documents. Information only.
 - 3. Hear Report on 1997/98 Scholastic Achievement Test (SAT Scores) (Dr. Mason) Student achievement scores on the SAT and ACT college admissions tests showed modest gains in the Jurupa Unified School District this past year. On the SAT, students averaged 920, the same as last year and up 9 points in comparison to the average scores of the previous 10 years. On the ACT, students averaged 19.2 (down 1.1 points from last year and down 0.1 in comparison to scores reported since 1993). In general, after adjusting for the number of students who took these tests, scores from Jurupa Valley High and Rubidoux High showed no significant or substantial differences.

A total of 306 students (about 37% of the eligible seniors) took the SAT, while 67 students (about 7% of the eligible seniors) took the ACT. These percentages of test takers are up in comparison to the average of test takers during previous years.

Students scored 447 on the SAT verbal component of the test, down 7 points from last year and down 6 points in comparison to the average score of the previous 10 years. Students scored 473 on the mathematics component, up 7 points from last year and up over 15 points in comparison to the average score of the previous 10 years.

In comparison to statewide and national results, fewer Jurupa Unified students took the SAT and ACT tests. Statewide and nationally, 42% and 41% respectively, of the seniors took the SAT. Similarly, 10% and 35% of the California and U.S. students, respectively, took the ACT. On the SAT, California and U.S. scores were 1,013 and 1,017 respectively. On the ACT, California and U.S. scores were 21.2 and 21.0. Information only.

4. Hear Report on Implementation of the County of Riverside Ordinance No. 339.2 Relating to the Control of Curfew and Truancy (Mrs. Roberts)

Recently, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors adopted Ordinance No. 339.2, "Curfew and Truancy of Persons Under the Age of 18 years." Members of the district's S.C.O.R.E. team have been charged with the responsibility of coordinating the process of implementing the Ordinance in Jurupa. They view this program as a collaborative effort to insure that students who should be in school during the day are in attendance. The S.C.O.R.E. team consists of a Deputy District Attorney, a Deputy Sheriff, and a Probation Officer, who will coordinate with the schools and the courts. Patrol deputies assigned to the Jurupa area will determine whether or not a student should be in school, verify the student's school of attendance, and return the student to school. The patrol deputy may issue a citation or a warning. If a citation is issued, the student may be subject to a fine determined by the presiding judge.

In order to emphasize the importance of school attendance, the team designed a "First Offender Program." Students who are issued a citation for the first time will be allowed to enroll in this program and must demonstrate perfect attendance for a period of thirty days, unless an excused absence is recorded, and must participate in community service assigned by the court. The Volunteer Center of Riverside is the agency responsible for the assignment and recording of such hours. During this initial period, the focus will be on high school students. The school district will have responsibility for informing students and parents of the availability of the "First Offender Program." We believe that this effort has the potential of complementing district efforts to increase parent and student awareness of California's compulsory attendance laws. A copy of the Riverside County Ordinance No. 339.2 is included in the supporting documents. Information only.

The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 1998 through April 30, 1999

Grantor and Grantee agree as follows:

(Letters may be from the same board that submits the nomination.) It is the responsibility of the nominee to secure the two letters of recommendation. The nomination period closes Saturday, October 3; nominations and letters of recommendation postmarked after October 3 will not be accepted.

Upon receipt of a valid nomination, a biographical sketch form will be sent to nominees. Nominees will then have until Friday, October 23 to submit their biographical sketch. The sketch and the two letters of recommendation will be printed in the agenda for the December Delegate Assembly meeting.

Each CSBA director-at-large serves a two-year term on the Board of Directors, with elections held in even-numbered years. The board meets six times per year, five times in Sacramento and once in the city where the annual conference is held. CSBA pays all meeting-related expenses for directors.

As part of CSBA's governance structure, members of the Board of Directors ensure that the association reflects the interests of school districts and county offices of education throughout the state and is responsive to their needs and concerns. Directors serve critical policy, communications and advocacy functions. They adopt the association's mission and goals and annually review progress; they also adopt the association's budget and Standing Rules.

In addition, he reviewed in detail personnel allocations (57% of the total budget) of \$52,416,996; school operation & other allocations (1% of the total budget) of \$1,142,092; restricted funds (28% of the total budget) of \$25,241,402; instruction (2% of the total budget) at \$1,511,926; instructional administration (1% of total budget) at \$836,516; district operations (6% of total budget) at \$5,866,574; district administration/community services/capital outlay/other outgo (5% of total budget) at \$4,592,550, and how this information is reported on the J-201 State required form.

A question and answer period was held for the Board and covered such topics as the effects of Proposition 227 on certificated and classified staffing, and the budget development timeline moving up by one month, to the beginning of February, 1999, due to the complexities of the budget process. The Assistant Superintendent reported that the highlights presented this evening to the Board on the budget development process indicate a formula and restricted program driven system. He noted a very tight 1998-99 budget due to the implementation of the 6th period at the middle school and the new actual attendance accounting system.

The Assistant Superintendent further reviewed each chart in the 1998-99 General Fund Budget. He explained the account numbering code system by site; the identifying color-coordinated restricted program accounting in the table of contents, and he emphasized the primary role of student enrollment projections in the budget development process and how individual school sites take these projections and build their entire school budgets accordingly.



APPROVE C.O. #1, FLOORING REPLACEMENT AT 13 SITES -Motion #18 The Assistant Superintendent Business Services reported that there are a number of minor changes being requested in room specifications for flooring needs at various sites totaling \$3,959.00.

APPROVE N.O.C. FOR PERALTA NETWORK INSTALLATION SERVICES -Motion #19 The Assistant Superintendent Business Services requested routine approval of a Notice of Completion for Network Installation Services at Peralta Elementary School.

PRESIDENT KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE THE NOTICE OF COMPLETION FOR NETWORK INSTALLATION SERVICES FOR PERALTA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PER BID #9002464, #9002466, #9002467, #9002468-CONTRACT #C-10267. MR. TEAGARDEN SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY, 4-0.

AUTHORIZE PURCHASE OF 1 PORTABLE FOR LEARNING CENTER -Motion #20 The Assistant Superintendent Business Services stated that in order to allow for the expansion of the space allowed for the Sheriff's S.C.O.R.E. program to assist students at the Learning Center and districtwide, an additional portable for the Adult Education program is being requested in the amount of \$32,775.00. The portable will be paid for out of Adult Education funds.

PRESIDENT KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF ONE PORTABLE CLASSROOM FOR THE LEARNING CENTER FROM MODTECH, INC. OF PERRIS, CA, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$32,775.00. MR. TEAGARDEN SECONDED THE MOTION. The Assistant Superintendent explained that there is sufficient space and electrical power to accommodate an additional portable at the Learning Center. A VOTE WAS TAKEN WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY, 4-0.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services referred the Board to the hand-carried supporting document for this item, a proposed agreement for the development of a "Districtwide Educational Facilities Master Plan," from the architectural firm of Perkins & Will. He indicated that in order to comply with the State required five-year facilities plan and to receive State funding, growth and facilities needs must be reviewed thoroughly. The Assistant Superintendent explained that existing school sites are at maximum enrollment capacity with the installation of the 75 portable classrooms to implement the Class Size Reduction program. This program implementation, along with recession abatement and the return of local housing construction, has brought the district to a place where a comprehensive plan must be developed to accommodate and finance facility needs to properly house current and projected student enrollment. In addition, he noted the need for significant modernization plans for five of the district's schools that are over thirty years old.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services reviewed the contents of the proposed Master Plan which, if authorized, will take approximately eight months to complete and will include Educational and Facility Goals, Existing Conditions, a Facilities Survey, Enrollment Projections, Area Requirements, Development Options, Cost Estimates, a Growth Plan, Funding, the State School Building Program, and the need to form a Superintendent appointed committee comprised of district staff and parents to review the facility findings and make recommendations to the Superintendent and Board. He summarized the fee structure to complete each phase of the proposed Master Plan, for a total cost estimate of \$115,645.00, to be paid for out of the Developer Fees funding. The Assistant Superintendent noted that some of the information proposed under demographic services may already be available to the district, thus, costs in this area may be reduced.

MR. TEAGARDEN MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT FOR ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES WITH PERKINS & WILL TO PREPARE A FACILITIES MASTER PLAN TO DETERMINE FACILITY NEEDS AND COST ESTIMATES; AND THE FORMATION OF A "BLUE RIBBON" COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL FACILITIES TO REVIEW THE FACILITY **FINANCING STRATEGIES** ASSESS **SURVEY** FINDINGS. RECOMMEND A FACILITIES PLAN TO THE SUPERINTENDENT AND BOARD. PRESIDENT KNIGHT SECONDED THE MOTION. The Assistant Superintendent explained to Mr. Chavez that the last Facilities Master Plan was completed in the mid-1980's, and an updated Facilities Master Plan is now a State requirement. He indicated that although the State does not require as in-depth a Plan as the architectural firm of Perkins & Will will complete, in order to properly plan and control facility needs and financial options, the expertise and assessment of experienced engineers and architects are needed as is confirmed by other comparable school districts who are taking the same approach as well.

The Superintendent stressed the importance of a Facilities Master Plan, not only to properly plan for enrollment growth caused by new housing developments and to avoid overcrowding and double sessions for students, but to provide a comprehensive plan for the district's future over the next ten to twenty years. She stated that the Class Size Reduction program has utilized all growth space at many sites, and with the Board approved guideline not to exceed 650 students at each elementary site, it is important to address the facility needs of housing the district's K-12 students both now and in the future.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services responded to Mr. Chavez, that the cost estimate to complete a Facilities Master Plan is less than the quote received from another architectural firm. Further, he stated that professional services are not included in the bidding process, and since Perkins & Will was previously approved by the Board as the district's architectural firm through an architectural selection process, continuing with this firm for this project is recommended as being in the best interest of the district's needs. A VOTE WAS TAKEN WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY, 4-0.



CALL FOR SPECIAL BOARD MEETING TO REVIEW PROPOSED PROPOSITION 227 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN The Superintendent reported that the district, according to the recently passed Unz Initiative, or Proposition 227, is required to put into place a program for structured English language immersion by the time school begins on August 27. Therefore, she indicated that information is being solicited from various sources and she has conferred with the Assistant Superintendent Education Services since the immediate need is to not only develop a proposed implementation plan, but to also purchase English as a Second Language instructional materials and textbooks, although Spanish language textbooks will be kept for those parents requesting waivers of English immersion and classroom support. The Superintendent noted that although work is underway on the district's proposed Proposition 227 implementation plan, it is not complete, and a Special Board meeting should be scheduled during the week of August 17 for presentation of the plan and a request for approval by the Board, to allow principals, teachers and parents to receive the appropriate information on Proposition 227 implementation prior to the beginning of school. She indicated that the contents of the plan will include legal compliance with the new law, as well as meeting the needs of children. She also noted that the preliminary "Title 5, California Code of Regulations, Division 1, Chapter 11, English Language Education for Immigrant Children, is included in the supporting documents for review. School boards are encouraged to review the regulations and submit comments/suggestions to the State Board of Education by September 10, 1998.

OPEN PUBLIC SESSION

CALL TO ORDER

The Special Meeting of the Jurupa Unified School District Board of Education was called to order by President Knight, at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 18, 1998, in the Board Room at the Education Center, 3924 Riverview Drive, Riverside, California.

HEARING SESSION

PUBLIC VERBAL COMMENTS

President Knight opened the Public Verbal comments session for members of the public to address the Board concerning the Special Meeting on the Proposed Proposition 227 Implementation Plan. There were no comments from the public.

OPENING OF SPECIAL BOARD MEETING

FLAG SALUTE & INSPIRATIONAL COMMENT

President Knight led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance and made an inspirational comment.

HEAR REPORT ON PROPOSED PROPOSITION 227 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN The Superintendent stated that the draft proposal for implementing Proposition 227 distributed to Board members, outlines the requirements of the new law that must be implemented no later than 60 days after its passage or, in the District's case with no year-round schools, August 27, 1998, the first day of school. She stated that without clear guidance from the State Department of Education on Proposition 227 implementation, the district gathered information from other school districts, and together with the expertise and knowledge of the district's Proposition 227 Task Force Members, the district's plan for implementation was developed. The Superintendent noted that although court cases are still pending concerning the Initiative, it is incumbent upon the district to follow the law and interpret State guidelines. She thanked the Assistant Superintendent Education Services, Dr. DeWayne Mason; the Coordinator of Language Services, Ms. Sonia Porter, and the Task Force members for preparing and providing input on the draft plan.



HEAR REPORT ON PROPOSED PROPOSITION 227 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN (CONTINUED) The Assistant Superintendent Education Services outlined the three days of intense meeting discussions that were held to develop the Vision Statement, the plan, the waiver procedure, answers to teachers' most asked questions, and to interpret the meaning of the law, which states that instruction shall be given "overwhelmingly" in English. He stated that by consensus decision, under the leadership of the Coordinator of Language Services, Ms. Sonia Porter, the Director of Curriculum and Instruction, Dr. Ellen Kinnear, and the Director of Research & Categorical Projects, Mr. Memo Mendez, with an appropriate balance of the intent of the law and the best interest of students in mind, a proposed implementation plan was developed.

Ms. Sonia Porter reviewed core definitions established for the terms, "English learners," English language classroom," "English language mainstream classroom," and "sheltered English immersion or structured English immersion." She outlined the methods for determining if a student meets the definition of "English Learner;" she reviewed the "Instructional Program Options for English Learners," and emphasized that the law does not prohibit the use of Spanish in English language classrooms. Ms. Porter referred to the "Waiver Procedure" and waiver form and discussed the conditions for granting such a waiver. Ms. Porter held a question and answer period for the Board, and addressed issues raised by individual Board members concerning the implementation of Proposition 227.

The Superintendent responded to Mr. Chavez' question concerning transportation for students to various sites who wish to participate in traditional bilingual classes at selected schools, noting that this question cannot be addressed until the district has more information on the number of parents selecting this option.

Ms. Porter explained that principals will receive a list of the previously identified limited English proficient students at their respective school sites, in order to best place each student based on test scores and other important factors. She outlined the testing process for current and incoming students for Mrs. Burns, and the requirement for English learners to be taught completely in English for thirty days prior to being placed in a structured English immersion class. Ms. Porter summarized the brochure developed for parents, "Instructional Program Options for Learners of English K-12."

PRESIDENT KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE THE PRELIMINARY IMPLEMENTATION PLAN FOR PROPOSITION 227 COMPLIANCE TO BE INITIATED FOR THE NEW SCHOOL TERM BEGINNING AUGUST 27, 1998. MR. TEAGARDEN SECONDED THE MOTION.

Mr. Chavez stated that if the implementation of English immersion classes is to be successful in teaching students, the District should investigate keeping these classes at twenty or less students, similar to the Class Size Reduction program in grades K-2.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services responded that with a possible 2,000 students in an English immersion program, an additional 33 teachers would be needed (\$1.3 million in additional on-going costs for this expense), as well as additional facilities to house these students. He stated that the current Class Size Reduction program has used all available space for portable classrooms at several sites; therefore, space to house a 20-1 English immersion program is an important issue to consider.

APPROVE PRELIMINARY IMPLEMENTATION PLAN FOR PROPOSITION 227 -Motion #25



APPROVE PRELIMINARY IMPLEMENTATION PLAN FOR PROPOSITION 227 -Motion #25 (CONTINUED) The Superintendent stated that if this is the direction of the Board, to consider a reduced class size for the English immersion program, administration will need to present options for funding such a program through additional funds received from the State; however, funding such a program will cost more than the anticipated COLA funds; therefore, the Board will also need to consider areas for reducing the District's Budget since at last report, the District is currently in a position of deficit spending.

Mr. Chavez requested administration to bring back by January, 1999, a plan and cost analysis for implementing reduced classes for the English immersion program.

Mrs. Burns agreed with Mr. Chavez on the concept of reduced class sizes for the English immersion program; however, she expressed concern that this may cause an unintentional segregation of students. In addition, she spoke in favor of a dual immersion-program or a bilingual magnet program.

Mr. Chavez emphasized the importance of students in the bilingual program to receive the teaching that they need to progress to the next level and to eventually be placed back into mainstream classes.

President Knight thanked the Superintendent, the Assistant Superintendent Education Services, the Education Services staff, and the Superintendent's Cabinet for collecting the information relative to the Unz Initiative, and for addressing questions and concerns regarding its implementation.

A VOTE WAS TAKEN WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

There being no further business, President Knight adjourned the Special Meeting from Public Session at 8:50 p.m.

SWIMMING POOL RULES

The Administration recognizes that, along with health and safety considerations required for the use of any swimming pool facility, regulations of the State Health and Safety Code and state and county health departments also establish certain minimum requirements. It is the responsibility of the Pool Manager to advise and inform the administration of these rules and to ensure that all such rules are followed.

In addition to legal requirements, the following district requirements are established:

- a. No person may enter the pool unless an appropriately certified lifeguard is also present. The lifeguard must have access to all safety equipment and a telephone.
- b. Whenever the pool is in use, one (1) lifeguard must be on duty, present in the pool area, and serving solely as a lifeguard. Such lifeguard shall not be involved in instruction and/or maintenance while s/he is on duty. No student shall be present on the pool deck or in the pool for instructional activities unless both the assigned lifeguard and the supervising instructor are present.
- c. Employees with other position titles are recognized for purposes of this policy as lifeguards when they meet state and district requirements.
- d. Prior to serving as a lifeguard, individuals must have their qualifications verified and recorded by the Director of Classified Personnel. A copy of all required certificates must be given to the pool manager to be kept on file at the pool.
- e. The Pool Manager is responsible for periodically reviewing the necessary basic safety rules for pool users and causing them to be communicated regularly to pool users and employees who work at the pool. Such rules shall be strictly enforced.

ARTICLE IX

EVALUATION PROCEDURES

3 Section 1 - Evaluation Agreement.

4 A. Purpose.

- 1. The goal of the evaluation process is to identify, improve and maintain the quality of services of all unit members and to insure an optimal learning situation for all students of the District. Within this context, evaluation is a cooperative and continuous process aimed at improving and maintaining quality educational programs, while serving as an essential component in each unit member's professional development.
- 2. The procedures in this Article have been developed to assure compliance with relevant Education Code requirements concerning the establishment of a uniform system of evaluation of unit members. The Parties recognize that the evaluation and assessment of unit member performance shall not include the use of publishers' norms established by standardized tests (Education Code section 44662[d]).

20 B. Guidelines and Procedures.

1. By October 15, or if mutually agreeable by November 1, the evaluator and the evaluatee will hold a formal conference to review the evaluation elements listed in this Article and, if appropriate, to make modifications as agreed. If mutual agreement to any modification cannot be reached, the Assistant Superintendent of Education Services and two (2) elected members of the Instructional Council who are not staff members at the work site of the evaluatee, will meet

Comments quoted by the evaluator shall be limited to comments by Administration. Such comments shall be specific and their sources identified.

- No unit member, except those required to do so as 4. Instructional Council members, shall participate in the evaluation procedure of other unit members. No evaluatee 20 will be required to assess his/her own performance. 21

Section 2 - Observations and Observation Conferences. 22

Probationary Unit Member Observations shall be a minimum of two 23 Α. (2) and a maximum of six (6) of at least thirty (30) minutes 24 duration. At least one (1) observation shall be announced two (2) 25 work days in advance. 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The evaluation document shall include recommendations, if necessary, of areas needing improvement in the performance of the unit member. - An evaluation conference shall be held between the evaluatee and the evaluator to discuss the evaluation before the last school day.
 - 2. A written request for an earlier conference may be submitted by either party. Such request must be made within five (5) work days of the receipt of the written evaluation by the unit member. The early conference will then occur within ten (10) work days of receipt of the written evaluation.

The evaluator shall make available a copy of the evaluation and each attached document to the evaluatee either before or at the time of the evaluation conference. The signatures of the evaluatee and evaluator are required on each evaluation report. Such signatures confirm the conference and receipt

of a copy of the evaluation but do not necessarily signify agreement with the substance of the evaluation.

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- Rebuttal. The evaluatee has the right to submit a written rebuttal to the evaluation at any time. Such rebuttal shall become a permanent attachment to the copy of the evaluation in the unit member's personnel file. If such rebuttal is filed within ten (10) work days of the evaluation conference, the evaluation may be modified or corrected accordingly. This process may alter the final evaluation before it is inserted into the personnel file. If a rebuttal to the evaluation has become a part of the personnel file, such evaluation shall be marked "invalid" if subsequent investigation shows that the evaluator's comments were not accurate.
- 14 F. <u>Grievance</u>. If a grievance relating to the evaluation is filed in a
 15 timely manner, evaluation materials shall be withheld from the
 16 personnel file until the grievance process is exhausted. If changes
 17 result from the grievance process, evaluation materials shall be

SUBJECT: 1998-99 Adopted Budget

In accordance with Education Code Section 42127(d), on or before August 15, the county superintendent of schools shall approve or disapprove the adopted budget for each school district within his jurisdiction and transmit to the governing board his recommendations regarding revision of the budget. Our review must include a determination whether the adopted budget:

- complies with the standards and criteria adopted by the state board of education;
- will allow the district to meet its financial obligations during the fiscal year; and
- is consistent with a financial plan that will enable the district to satisfy it's multi-year financial commitments.

Your 1998-99 adopted budget has been approved as submitted. I commend you and your staff for your efforts in the preparation of the budget.

Our analysis included the multi-year financial projections reviewed by the board. The projections indicate that expenditures and other uses will exceed revenues by \$2,155,469 in 1998-99 due to the addition of a new class period at the middle school, and one-time expenditure of carryover funds. The projections indicate that the district will be able to meet its financial obligations and maintain minimum state required reserves in the current and one subsequent fiscal year. These projections are based upon numerous assumptions for attendance, revenues and expenditures. Should these assumptions not materialize as planned, the board will need to adjust the budget plan accordingly.

The information submitted with your adopted budget indicates that salary negotiations have not been settled. Please provide an analysis of the cost of a proposed agreement, including the impact on the current operating budget and multi-year financial projections, at least ten days prior to adoption by the board. Forms developed for this purpose have been forwarded under separate cover.

Our office recommends that the board continue to review updated multi-year financial projections reflecting the most current information available for the district's operational programs, debt service obligations and enrollment and attendance trends. The projections should cover the current and two subsequent fiscal years. This process will assist the board in continuing to provide for the long range financial stability of the district. Please provide our office with a copy of the updated multi-year financial projections, including assumptions, with the submission of your district's First Interim Financial Report and with the disclosure of a proposed collective bargaining agreement.

Not later than 45 days after the Governor signs the Annual Budget Act, school districts are required to make available for public review any revisions in revenues and expenditures that have been made to the budget to reflect the funding provided by the Budget Act. Our office will provide detailed information on the fiscal provisions of the Budget Act to assist you in this process.
