COMMUNICATIONS SESSION

1. Report of Student Representatives

a. Hear Reports from 1999-00 Student Representatives

(Mrs. Roberts)

The Board welcomes Joshua Johnson, Jurupa Valley High School Student Representative, and Crystal Hadden, Rubidoux High School Student Representative. Student representatives may wish to address the Board regarding student achievements, interests, or other matters.

2. Recognition

a. Recognize Press-Enterprise Scholars (Dr. Mason)

The Press-Enterprise, in cooperation with the University of California, Riverside, annually honors the seniors in Riverside County who have achieved the highest grade point average, along with their citizenship and school activities. Of the one-hundred eighty-two students from Riverside County high schools honored this year, five were from Jurupa Valley High School, four from Rubidoux High School, and one from Nueva Vista High School. Students honored from Jurupa Valley were Brad Lauritzen, Crystal Seeley, Scott Chavez, Tiffany Jones, and Yuka Matsukawa. Students from Rubidoux High School were Linda Hong, Dara Kang, Jocyl Sacramento, and Noah Holzknecht. One student, Claude Foster, represented Nueva Vista. The Board and administration extends their congratulations to these students for their outstanding academic achievement. Information only.

* b. Recognize Golden State Examination Scholars (Dr. Mason)

Seven hundred seventy-six Jurupa Unified students received high honors, honors, or school recognition in the spring, 1999 California incentive program, the Golden State Examinations (GSE), administered in May, 1999. More than 821,500 students from throughout California took part in the first-year algebra, geometry, economics, government/civics, U.S. History, biology, chemistry, Spanish language, and/or second-year coordinated science exams. Four hundred eighty-nine of these students attend Jurupa Valley High School, two hundred fifty-three attend Rubidoux High School, eight attend Jurupa Middle School, seventeen attend Mira Loma Middle School, and nine attend Mission Middle School. A list of the students by category and school is included in the supporting documents.

The purpose of this examination, established by the California Education Reform Act of 1983 (SB 813), is to identify and recognize students with outstanding achievement in first-year algebra, geometry, high school mathematics, economics, government/civics, U.S. History, reading/literature, written composition, biology, chemistry, Spanish language, and/or second-year coordinated science. Students aim for one of three levels of award - high honors, honors, or school recognition. Students who achieve high honors or honors on the GSE receive a certificate of achievement from the state and an insignia on their diplomas. Notice of GSE achievement will also become part of each student's permanent transcript. Information only.

c. Recognize 1999 United Way Campaign (Mr. Mendez)

The United Way of the Inland Valleys has a direct impact on the students and families living within our community. The Boy Scouts, Jurupa YMCA, and Youth Service Center are among the local agencies that receive funding through this worthy organization. Over the years, Jurupa Unified School District employees have been generous with their contributions to the annual campaign of the United Way of the Inland Valleys. Last year, through the efforts of many volunteers, we were able to raise a district-wide contribution of \$30,294. This year's goal is to increase our total contribution by at least 7%.

The theme for this year's campaign is "Help...it's what we do". The kick-off campaign period is from October 25 through November 5, 1999. For many years, the district has received commendations for its strong support of the United Way. We look forward to another successful campaign and to once again show that J.U.S.D. employees care. * d. Adopt Resolution #00/09 "American Education Week"

(Mrs. Roberts)

November 14-20, 1999 has been designated throughout the nation as "American Education Week." This week-long celebration is sponsored by the U. S. Department of Education and 12 national organizations including the National Parent Teachers Association, the American Legion, the National Association of State Boards of Education and the American Association of School Administrators.

The theme of this year's celebration is, "Students Today, Leaders Tomorrow." In announcing this year's "American Education Week" celebration, the U. S. Department of Education has indicated that this is a time for rekindling citizens' interest in local schools--whether or not they have children presently attending them. Today's students are tomorrow's leaders. Today's students are tomorrow's citizens, voters and taxpayers, and today's students will play a major role in shaping the quality of our future.

During "American Education Week," educators take time to help increase public understanding and appreciation of our nation's schools and encourage parents and non-parents to build civic and community pride in support of education.

Administration recommends the Board adopt Resolution #00/09, Supporting the Observance of American Education Week, "Students Today, Leaders Tomorrow," as shown in the supporting documents.

e. Accept Donations

(Mr. Edmunds)

All donations are given to Jurupa Unified School District with the request that the money or item be used at the designated school.

Ms. Karen Bentley, a teacher at Indian Hills Elementary School, wishes to donate a used portable folding wheelchair for use at the school. The approximate value is \$300.00.

Ms. Elizabeth Mendoza, a teacher at Sunnyslope Elementary School, wishes to donate \$100.00, with the request it be used to purchase instructional supplies for her classroom.

Mr. and Mrs. Tony Johnson, residents, wish to donate an Apple Macintosh computer, monitor, and printer, with the request they be used at Peralta Elementary School. The approximate value is \$675.00.

Mr. Ken Smith, on behalf of Western Metal Lath in Riverside, wishes to donate \$250.00, with the request it be used at Mission Middle School. These funds will be used for a student incentive program called MANO (Making Achievement Number One) at the school.

Administration recommends acceptance of these donations with letters of appreciation to be sent.

3. Administrative Reports and Written Communications

a. Hear Report on Assembly Bill 1113: School Safety and Violence Prevention Block Grant (Mrs. Roberts)

On June 30, 1999, the Governor signed Assembly Bill 1113 to provide supplemental funding of approximately \$40.00 per student in grades 8-12 based on 1998-99 enrollment. The intent of the grant is to "allow districts to hire personnel trained in conflict resolution, provide on-campus communication devices, establish staff training programs, establish cooperative arrangements with law enforcement agencies, and develop other programs that contribute to the goal of reducing incidents of violence in schools." Districts receiving these funds must include in their School Safety and Violence Prevention plan that funds would be used to (1) give youth a voice and listen to them; (2) build a capacity to work with youth; (3) expand crime prevention through risk assessment and environmental design, and (4) expand safety training programs for effective prevention and intervention programs.

The Superintendent's Cabinet reviewed suggestions made by the AB 1113 Committee established to include input from principals, teachers, bargaining unit representatives and law enforcement personnel. As a result of the information gathered from this committee, a District proposal for expenditure of the AB 1113 funding was developed to include in the District's application. The final recommendation for the allocation of AB 1113 funds is as follows:

- (1) Additional campus supervision for identified safety concerns.
- (2) Training for the District Crisis Intervention Teams.
- (3) Crisis Prevention/Intervention training for all staff.
- (4) Safety/Violence Prevention Coordination.
- (5) Supplemental funding for additional School Resource Officers at middle schools. This funding will be allocated pending the successful receipt of a joint federal grant by the Riverside County Sheriff's Department and the Jurupa Unified School District.
- (6) Phase-in inside door locking devices and additional communication devices.

The District's School Safety and Violence Prevention application submitted to the California Department of Education on October 29, 1999 contains an expenditure plan responsive to the intent of this legislation. Information only.

* b. Hear Report on Project B.E.A.R. (Building and Encouraging Active Readers) (Mrs. Roberts)

The District is in the process of launching a K-6 Reading Initiative which is titled, "Project Bear" (Building & Encouraging Active Readers). The goal of the initiative is to have every elementary student read at least twenty books from November through April. Students will take a pledge to turn off the television at least one hour per night or one evening per week and engage in reading. Students will be required to keep a log of the books they have read, and the coordinator of the program will be soliciting donations from corporations and businesses throughout our community to purchase high quality children's books for every child completing the twenty book requirement. Each school will be asked to hold a celebration recognizing these students and presenting their books. The timeline for this project is included in the supporting documents. Information only.

Ms. Rachel Williams, teacher at Rubidoux High School, is requesting permission to travel to Atlanta, Georgia on Thursday, November 18 through Sunday, November 21, 1999 with five journalism students. The purpose of the trip is to allow students an opportunity to attend the annual journalism convention and competition. Students will be given an opportunity to participate in workshops to gain experience and knowledge about school newspaper production and journalism as a career. Costs will be paid through fund-raisers; transportation will be by commercial air, and staff members will provide supervision. Administration has indicated that no qualified student will be denied an opportunity to participate in this activity due to the lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Non-Routine Field Trip Request by Ms. Rachel Williams to travel to Atlanta, Georgia with five journalism students on Thursday, November 18 through Sunday, November 21, 1999 to attend the annual journalism convention and competition.

A. Approve Routine Action Items by Consent (Continued)

- * 7. Approve Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Glen Avon Elementary (Dr. Mason)
Ms. Heather Broda, Ms. Julie Herman, and Ms. Tammy Jardine, teachers at Glen Avon Elementary School, are requesting permission to travel to Sea World in San Diego on Wednesday, April 5, 2000 with approximately seventy-two K-3 students. The purpose of the trip is to extend student learning on ocean and ocean animals. This trip meets district standards as they relate to reading, writing, math, oral communication, and science. Travel will be by district vehicles, staff members and parent volunteers will handle the supervision of students, and costs will be paid through PTA donations for field trips. Administration has indicated that no student will be denied the opportunity to participate in this activity due to the lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents. It is recommended that the Board approve the Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Ms. Heather Broda, Ms. Julie Herman, and Ms. Tammy Jardine, teachers at Glen Avon Elementary School, to travel to Sea World in San Diego with approximately seventy-two K-3 students on Wednesday, April 5, 2000 to extend student learning on ocean and ocean animals.
- * 8. Approve 1999/2000 District Advisory Committee Members (Mr. Mendez)
State regulations governing Consolidated Application programs mandate that schools receiving state Compensatory Education Funds consult with parents regarding the planning of programs and the expenditure of funds. In addition, state regulations require that school districts with fifty-one or more limited-English proficient pupils establish an English Language Advisory Committee. Federal Title 1 regulations also require consultation with parents, as do the state regulations for the Gifted and Talented program.

In response to the mandates of these various programs the district has traditionally formed a District Advisory Committee composed of parent representatives from each school site receiving categorical funds. The list of 1999/2000 candidate names submitted by the school sites is included in the supporting documents. Procedures for selecting members and operating such committees are outlined in District Policy 1221.3.

Administration recommends that the Board approve the 1999/2000 members of the District Advisory Committee for the Consolidated Application and English Language Advisory Committee.

- * **B. Certify Jurupa Valley High and Rio Vista Continuation High Site Support of Digital High School Technology Installation Grants** (Mrs. Roberts)
Last summer, the District was notified that Jurupa Valley High and Rio Vista Continuation High Schools are eligible to receive independent grants for up to \$300.00 per pupil to implement the Digital High School program. For several months, the respective principals and selected staff members at both high schools, along with community partners, have been engaged in reviewing the application requirements and the status of technology implementation. In order to receive funding, the local Governing Board must certify that a majority of the certificated staff at each high school have indicated support of participation in the program. The Principal of Jurupa Valley High School and the Principal of Rio Vista Continuation High School submitted separate certifications confirming that a majority of the certificated staff at their sites will support the Digital High School program if funding is made available.

Administration recommends that the Board certify that a majority of the certificated staffs of Rio Vista Continuation High School and Jurupa Valley High School indicate their support for participation in the Digital High School Program.

C. Approve Purchase of Twenty-Three (23) Hewlett Packard Laser Printers (Mr. Edmunds)

The Education Technology Department has requested the purchase of twenty-three (23) Hewlett Packard laser printers. These printers are needed to upgrade existing technology in the District's library plan. Funding for these printers will come from the District's Library Plan. The Purchasing Department obtained quotes from the following vendors:

Board Policy requires that purchases in excess of \$12,000 be presented to the Board for approval. The total cost for the twenty-three Hewlett Packard laser printers is \$33,324.01.

Administration recommends the Board approve the issuance of Purchase Order #20004 to Buy.Com in the amount of \$33,324.01 for the twenty-three (23) Hewlett Packard laser printers.

D. Approve Revision of Site Grant Plan for Peralta Elementary (Mr. Edmunds)

Peralta Elementary School is requesting to revise their Site Grant spending plan. Peralta has applied for E-Rate funding which will be used to purchase items listed on their original Site Grant proposal. This will restore \$7,800.35 to the school's site grant funds, which they would like to reallocate for the purchase of computer equipment and software, audio-visual equipment, and instructional materials.

Administration recommends the Board approve the \$7,800.35 revision to the Peralta Elementary School Site Grant Expenditure Plan.

E. Approve Purchase of One Used 1997 Case Skiploader for the Grounds and Maintenance Departments (Mr. Edmunds)

The Maintenance Department is requesting the purchase of a skiploader. This equipment is used by maintenance workers on a daily basis. In the past, equipment was rented at a monthly rate of \$2,600, for an estimated cost of \$31,200 for fiscal year 1998-99. A skiploader is used for various construction, maintenance, and ground projects such as grading, concrete, asphalt and excavation throughout the District.

The Senior Building Inspector determined that a used 1997 Case Skiploader best suits the District's needs, and is available from Hertz Equipment Rental for \$30,170 including tax. Board Policy requires that purchases in excess of \$12,000 be presented to the Board for approval. Funds from the Maintenance Department budget would pay for the unit.

Administration recommends the Board approve the purchase of one used 1997 Case Skiploader from Hertz Equipment Rental, of Riverside, California, in the amount of \$30,170 including tax for the Grounds and Maintenance Departments.

F. Authorize Award of Bid #00/04L, Purchase One 27-Passenger Bus with Wheelchair Lift

(Mr. Edmunds)

The Transportation Department submitted a request for a bus equipped to handle wheelchairs in order to transport students in the new severely handicapped preschool class at Sunnyslope Elementary School. The District determined that the bus best suited to meet the needs of these students is a 27-passenger bus with a wheelchair lift.

The Purchasing Department delivered bidding documents to three prospective bidders: Sunset Bus Sales, California Bus Sales and Service Center, and A-Z Bus Sales, Inc. Two bids were returned, one from A-Z Bus Sales, Inc. in the amount of \$66,060.76 and one from California Bus Sales and Service Center in the amount of \$68,105.00. The bidding documents require delivery of the bus within 210 days of receipt of the order. A-Z Bus Sales, Inc. returned a bid that included a condition for delivery of the bus within 240 days after receipt of the order. After review and on advice of counsel, Administration recommends that the Board reject this bid as being non-responsive to the bidding documents.

California Bus Sales and Service Center has offered to deliver its proposed bus within 45 days of receipt of the order. The bidding documents allow for liquidated damages of \$100 per day beyond the agreed upon delivery date. California Bus Sales and Service Center has confirmed, in a letter to the District, that they will deliver the bus within the proposed 45 days and will accept the terms of the bidding documents, including the liquidated damages after the 45th day. The cost of the bus will be funded from Medi-Cal reimbursement funds for transportation of severely handicapped students.

Administration recommends the Board authorize award of Bid #00/04L to California Bus Sales and Service Center of Fresno, California, in the amount of \$68,105.00 for the purchase of one 27-passenger bus with a wheelchair lift.

1. Act on Other School Facility Matters

(Mr. Edmunds)

Due to frequent changes taking place in facility improvement programs, items which require Board discussion or action may arise between agenda preparation and meeting times. Administration may provide such items as verbal information reports or recommendations for action.

The Board of Education hereby accepts and adopts as its own the Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law submitted by the Administrative Hearing Panel in each of the following discipline cases:

- ** 1.** The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-006 for violation of Education Code 48900 (b & k) for the remainder of the current semester and the semester following; and that the pupil be referred to the Community Day School, operated at the District Learning Center, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the **S**chool and **C**ommunity **O**ut**R**each Team (SCORE) for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before June 5, 2000.

The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-008 for violation of Education Code 48900 (a2, k & .4) for the remainder of the current semester and the semester following; and that the pupil be referred to the Jurupa Community School, operated by the Riverside County Office of Education, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the **School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE)** for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before June 5, 2000.
- ** 3. The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-009 for violation of Education Code 48900 (c & k) for the remainder of the current semester and the semester following; and that the pupil be referred to the Community Day School, operated at the District Learning Center, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the **School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE)** for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before June 5, 2000.
- ** 4. The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-010 for violation of Education Code 48900 (h, j & k) for the remainder of the current semester and the semester following; and that the pupil be referred to the Jurupa Community School, operated by the Riverside County Office of Education, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the **School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE)** for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before June 5, 2000.

Administration recommends the discipline actions as described and listed above.

- * 1. Approve Personnel Report #8 (Mr. Campbell)

Administration recommends approval of Personnel Report #8 as printed subject to corrections and changes resulting from review in Closed Session.

- * 2. Adopt at First Reading, Revised Regulation 4740, Salary Schedule for Substitute Certificated Employees (Mr. Campbell)

Neighboring school districts have recently increased their daily rate of pay for substitute teachers. In order to remain competitive and to meet our daily needs for substitutes, it is necessary to increase our rates also. Daily rates should be increased by ten dollars.

It is recommended that the Board adopt revised Regulation 4740, Salaries for Substitute Certificated Employees, to reflect a ten dollar increase in each substitute daily rate.

J. Review Routine Information Reports

- * 1. Annual Report on Pesticide Use (Mr. Edmunds)
Business and Non-Instructional Operations Policy 3401 requires an annual report to the Board of Education, citing the kind and amount of pesticide used by location. The supporting documents contain a memo from Steve Dickinson, Supervisor of Grounds, summarizing pesticide use districtwide for the period July 1, 1998 to June 30, 1999.

Daily pesticide use logs by location are on file in the Grounds Supervisor's office. In addition, monthly districtwide use reports are sent to the Riverside County Agricultural Commissioner's Office with a copy going to the California Department of Food and Agriculture Headquarters in Sacramento. Copies are also kept on file in the Grounds Supervisor's office. Material Safety Data Sheets for all pesticides are available in the Grounds Supervisor's office as well. Information only.

2. Announce Schedule to Conduct Board Meetings for the 1999-00 School Year (Mrs. Roberts)
Sites have been selected for regular board meetings for the 1999-00 school year in various areas of the community. A presentation from each school will be scheduled at the beginning of each Board meeting with a relevant student performance, speaker, or other presentation. Information only.

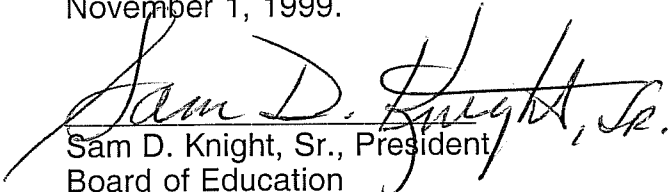

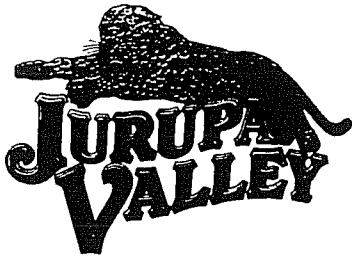
