COMMUNICATIONS SESSION

1. Report of Student Representatives

a. Hear Reports from 1999-00 Student Board Members

(Mrs. Roberts)

The Board welcomes Joshua Johnson, Jurupa Valley High, and Crystal Hadden, Rubidoux High, Student Board Members. They may wish to address the Board regarding student achievements, interests, or other matters.

2. Recognition

* a. Adopt Resolutions for Employee Recognition Weeks
Each year, various organizations set aside time for special recognition of specific employee groups. For the past several years, it has been customary to set aside two weeks in May for recognition of the major employee groups.

May 10, 2000 has been declared as "Day of the Teacher," when all public schools in California and educational institutions in California may suitably commemorate and give attention to teachers and their profession. The district will recognize and celebrate in many unique ways at each site, the annual "Day of the Teacher" to express its grateful appreciation to the teachers and other certificated employees including counselors, nurses, speech therapists, and psychologists employed by the district.

May 21-27, 2000 has been set aside as "Classified School Employee Week." During this week, the district will recognize classified employees for their support and care for Jurupa's children through a variety of jobs in the district. The Board and administrative staff wish to personally thank each of the more than 900 full and part-time classified employees for their valuable contribution and commitment to supporting the education of students in the Jurupa Unified School District.

Two resolutions are included in the supporting documents to recognize both employee groups who are especially important in promoting the education of students. Administration recommends that the Board adopt Resolution #00/20, in recognition of "Day of the Teacher, May 10, 2000," and Resolution #00/21, in recognition of "Classified School Employee Week, May 21-27, 2000."

b. Recognize Cinco de Mayo Celebrations

Cinco de Mayo is an important holiday in Mexico and is also celebrated by Mexican-Americans here in the United States. On May 5, 1862 the small Mexican army with only 2,000 men, many without weapons, defeated the French soldiers, over six thousand strong, that had come to take over the tiny town of Puebla, Mexico. 3. Administrative Reports and Written Communications

a. Hear Report from S.C.O.R.E. Team on Stop Truancy Offender Program

(Mrs. Roberts)

This evening, members of the District's S.C.O.R.E. team will be present to provide updated information on the Stop Truancy Offender Program (S.T.O.P.). The S.T.O.P. program was implemented in response to the Riverside County Board of Supervisors curfew ordinance designed to enhance the potential for students' academic achievement and to reduce juvenile crime in local communities. Several studies document the fact that students who are excessively absent suffer losses in educational achievement and are at greater risk of dropping out of school and becoming involved in delinquent behavior. Over the past year, the S.C.O.R.E. team has worked diligently to follow-up with at-risk students and students violating the compulsory attendance law. The team monitors attendance once a student is cited, and they encourage perfect attendance through their one-on-one contact with each student. Information only.

b. Hear Report on AsCent Program

(Dr. Mason)

The AsCent Program is an after school program made possible through a grant from the California State Department of Education. The program is funded for three (3) years at \$145,000 per year through the "After School Learning and Safe Neighborhoods Partnerships Program."

The planning and implementation of the AsCent program involves parents, youth, school administrators, teachers, the Jurupa Area Recreation and Parks District, the YMCA, the YWCA, and PTAs. The program consists of two components:

- An educational and literacy component to provide tutoring or homework assistance in basic academic skills; and
- An educational enrichment component, which may include, but is not limited to, recreation and interpersonal skills activities.

Mr. Paul Jensen, Principal of Adult/Alternative Education, and Diana Fox, project consultant/coordinator, will provide a presentation on the specifics of the program and plans for next year's activities. <u>Information only</u>.

The Digital High School Program is in its fourth and final year, and the Steps Community Day School is being automatically selected to receive a grant for up to \$300 per student based on the 2000/2001 school year CBEDS. The Administrator of the Steps Community Day Program is submitting an application for Certificate of Eligibility to the California State Department for funding for the 2000/2001 school year.

Administration recommends that the Board certify the STEPS Community Day School application for Certificate of Eligibility for Digital High School funding for the 2000/2001 school year.

6. Approve Travel and Related Expenses for CSBA Delegate Assembly, May 6-8, 2000

(Mrs. Roberts)

At the last Board meeting, Mr. John Chavez noted that for the past 3-5 years he has paid for his own travel and other related expenses to serve as a CSBA delegate. Mr. Chavez requested that for this upcoming CSBA Delegate Assembly meeting May 6-8, 2000 that travel and other related expenses be borne by the school district. The approximate cost of attendance at this meeting is \$600.00 including air fare.

It is recommended that the Board approve travel and related expenses for the CSBA Delegate Assembly for Mr. John Chavez May 6-8, 2000 in Sacramento, CA.

7. Approve Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Rubidoux High (Dr. Mason) Ms. Diane Parker, teacher at Rubidoux High School, is requesting approval to travel to San Luis Obispo on Friday, May 5 through Saturday, May 6, 2000 with approximately five (5) students to participate in the State FFA "Best Informed Greenhand" competition. Transportation will be provided by district vehicle, staff members will provide supervision, and accommodations will be at the Best Western Hotel in Pismo Beach. Administration has indicated that no eligible student will be denied an opportunity to participate in this field trip due to lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Ms. Diane Parker to travel to San Luis Obispo with approximately five (5) students on Friday, May 5 through Saturday, May 6, 2000 to participate in the State FFA "Best Informed Greenhand" competition.

8. Approve Non-Routine Field Trip Request from Sky Country

(Dr. Mason)

Ms. Susan Funston and Mr. Charles Lantz, teachers at Sky Country Elementary School, are requesting approval to travel to San Diego with approximately twenty-seven (27) GATE students on Wednesday, May 10 through Thursday, May 11, 2000. The purpose of the trip is to provide students with a culminating activity on Oceanography. Staff members will provide supervision, transportation will be by district vehicles, and accommodations and meals are provided by the Sea World Educational Package. Administration has indicated that no eligible student will be denied an opportunity to participate in this field trip due to lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Non-Routine Field Trip Request by Ms. Susan Funston and Mr. Charles Lantz to travel to San Diego on Wednesday, May 10 through Thursday, May 11, 2000 with approximately twenty-seven (27) students to participate in a culminating activity on Oceanography.

B. Hear and Approve Date, Time, and Place for Special Study Session of the Board to Update the District's Strategic Plan and District Goals

The District's Strategic Plan is six years old and is in need of review and revision. In order to facilitate our long-range planning, members of the Superintendent's Cabinet suggested that Thursday, June 22, 2000 be set aside for the Board, administrative staff, and representatives from the certificated and classified bargaining units to work together on updating our Strategic Plan including our District goals and objectives. The proposed meeting location is the Multi-Purpose Room at Mira Loma Middle School and will begin at 8:00 a.m. and end at approximately 3:30 p.m. After discussion, administration recommends that the Board approve a Special Study Session on June 22, 2000 at Mira Loma Middle School to update the District's Strategic Plan and District goals.

* C. <u>Approve Intent to Participate in the Community-Based English Tutoring (CBET) Program for 2000/2002</u> (Dr. Mason)

Board members will recall, Proposition 227 provides \$50 million dollars each year, for ten years, to local education agencies wishing to participate in the Community-Based English Tutoring Program (CBET).

The Jurupa Unified School District received \$315,100 for the 1999-2000 school year. The funding enabled the district to expand services provided through adult education and incorporate additional tutoring components along with districtwide workshops. Efforts also included summer school programs with special emphasis on working with parents of entering kindergarten students.

In order to participate during the 2000-2001 school year, the district must file a Notification of Intent to Participate in the 2000-2001 CBET Program and submit it to the State Department of Education no later than June 30, 2000. The district is requesting approval to submit the Intent to Participate. A copy of the form is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the request to complete the Notification of Intent to Participate in the 2000-2001 CBET Program form and submit it to the State Department of Education prior to June 30, 2000.

D. Approve 2000 Mandated, Core Academic, and Special Education Summer School **Program** (Dr. Mason)

The State of California provides funding which allows school districts to provide summer school instruction for students in Grades 2-9 who have been retained or who are at-risk of retention, as well as students in Grades 7-12 who are not making sufficient progress towards passing the High School Exit Exam.

E. Approve Purchase of Substitute Teacher Calling System

(Mr. Edmunds)

The Personnel Department has requested the purchase of a substitute teacher calling system to automate the employee absence reporting and substitute placement process. The system has the potential of saving time, effort, and money. Many districts, including all but one of our ten benchmark districts, as well as the Riverside County Office of Education, have implemented such an automated system to report absences and place substitutes. Because the system is operational 24 hours a day, receiving and making calls, the District would be able to better compete for available substitutes with neighboring districts that share our substitute pool. The system will not only assign appropriately qualified substitutes, it will facilitate monitoring of employee attendance, substitute utilization, and absence trends. The Personnel Department has researched substitute calling equipment and determined that CRS, Inc. has the system that best suits the needs of the District.

Administration recommends the Board approve the issuance of Purchase Order #22938 to CRS, Inc. of Dallas, Texas in the amount of \$28,159.43 (including tax) for the purchase of a substitute teacher calling system.

F. Approve Revision of Site Grant Expenditure Plan for Stone Avenue (Mr. Edmunds) Stone Avenue Elementary School is requesting to revise their Site Grant spending plan to cover the cost to install new telephones with voice mail in all classrooms. The cost for this installation is \$6,976.85. This expenditure revision has been approved by their School Site Council.

Administration recommends approval of the revised Site Grant Expenditure Plan for Stone Avenue Elementary School.

G. Review and Act on Timely School Facility Matters

- - I. Carpet needs to be replaced at eleven sites due to age, wear, and tear. The sites are Sky Country, Sunnyslope, Troth Street, Van Buren and West Riverside Elementary Schools; Jurupa Middle, Mira Loma Middle, and Mission Middle Schools; and Nueva Vista Continuation, Jurupa Valley, and Rubidoux High Schools. The estimated cost is \$203,000.

- II. Painting at nine sites, both exterior and interior, due to age and deterioration of the paint. The sites are Granite Hill, Pacific Avenue, Pedley, and Van Buren Elementary Schools; Mission Middle School; Jurupa Valley, Nueva Vista Continuation, and Rubidoux High Schools; and MOT. The estimated cost is \$308,000
- III. Asphalt maintenance work at various schools would include patching and routine sealing of the asphalt surface. The asphalt maintenance work would be performed at Glen Avon, Ina Arbuckle, Mission Bell, Pacific Avenue, Rustic Lane, Sky Country, Troth Street, and West Riverside Elementary Schools; Mission Middle School; Jurupa Valley High School; the current Education Center, IMC and MOT. The estimated cost is \$350,000.
- IV. The 600-wing at Rubidoux High School and the office, multi-purpose room, and rooms 1-7 at Rustic Lane Elementary School are in need of new roofing because of age and numerous leaks. The estimated cost is \$97,000.
- V. Mission Middle School needs to have 60 doors replaced due to their age and deterioration. Camino Real and Sunnyslope Elementary Schools are in need of new doors as well because the original doors are not repairable and need to be replaced with regular standard wood doors with standard locks, hardware, etc. The estimated cost is \$61,000.
- VI. Resurfacing of the swimming pool at Jurupa Valley High School is needed due to peeling and deterioration of the finish coat. This will be funded from the General Fund at an estimated cost of \$35,000.

Administration recommends the Board approve the six projects listed above, and authorize Administration to advertise for bids as required by Public Contract Code 20111.

2. Approve Replacement of Furnace Unit at Rustic Lane Elementary School (Mr. Edmunds) The gas-fired furnace in the Rustic Lane Elementary School multi-purpose room has become inoperable and unrepairable due to a cracked fire block. The unit needs to be replaced, and the Senior Building Inspector has determined that the most appropriate unit is a 12.5-ton gas/electric heating and air conditioning unit. Funding for this unit will come from State Deferred Maintenance funds. Quotations were solicited from the following three vendors:

Castillo Heating and Air Conditioning\$13,250.00John R. Haines Heating and Air Conditioning\$15,650.00Airite Heating and Air Conditioning\$16,754.00

Board Policy requires that purchases in excess of \$12,000 be presented to the Board for approval. Administration recommends the Board approve the issuance of Purchase Order #23050 to Castillo Heating & Air Conditioning in the amount of \$13,250.00 (including tax) for the purchase of one 12.5-ton heating/air conditioning unit.

3. Approve Solicitation of Bids for Furniture and Equipment for New Education Center

(Mr. Edmunds)

As part of the new Education Center project, there is a budget set aside for new furniture and equipment. The cost of the furniture and equipment will exceed the bidding limits and will require solicitation of formal bids. The architect's maximum estimate for the furniture and equipment is \$595,541.00, which was based on the full retail value of the goods. By bidding the project, Administration hopes to bring the cost in at a substantially reduced amount. Funding is provided by the COPs issued for the construction of the Education Center project. Administration recommends the Board approve the solicitation of bids for furniture and equipment for the new Education Center.

G. Review and Act on Timely School Facility Matters (Continued)

4. Review and Act on Other Timely School Facility Matters

Due to frequent changes taking place in facility improvement programs, items which require
Board discussion or action may arise between agenda preparation and meeting times.

Administration may provide such items as verbal information reports or recommendations for action.

H. Act on Student Discipline Cases

(Mrs. Roberts)

The Board of Education hereby accepts and adopts as its own the Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law submitted by the Administrative Hearing Panel in each of the following discipline cases:

EXPULSIONS:

- 1. The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-064 for violation of Education Code 48900 (b, c & k) for the remainder of the current semester and through a summer school program; and that the pupil be referred to the Community Day School, operated at the District Learning Center, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE) for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before September 5, 2000.
- The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-065 for violation of Education Code 48900 (c & k) for the remainder of the current semester and through a summer school program; and that the pupil be referred to the Community Day School, operated at the District Learning Center, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE) for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before September 5, 2000.
- * 3. The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-066 for violation of Education Code 48900 (c & k) for the remainder of the current semester and the semester following; and that the pupil be referred to the Jurupa Community School, operated by the Riverside County Office of Education, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE) for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before January 16, 2001.
 - 4. The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-068 for violation of Education Code 48900 (i, k & .2) for the remainder of the current semester and the semester following; and that the pupil be referred to the Community Day School, operated at the District Learning Center, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE) for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before January 16, 2001.

SUSPENDED EXPULSION REVOKED:

- 5. The Administrative Hearing Panel recommends the expulsion of the pupil in Discipline Case #00-022 for violation of Education Code 48917 (d) for the remainder of the current semester and that the pupil be referred to the Community Day School, operated at the District Learning Center, for the period of the expulsion. This case will be referred to the School and Community OutREach Team (SCORE) for follow-up. This case shall be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before September 5, 2000.
 - Administration recommends the discipline actions as described and listed above.

I. Review and Approve Request for Board Member Conference Expenses to be Paid by District (Mrs. Roberts)

For the past five years the Board, in recognition of prior years' difficult financial times, elected to have the District pay only registration fees for its Board members attending conferences or other Board development activities. At the last meeting, Mr. John Chavez requested that an amount be set aside in the District's 2000-2001 Budget for each member for Board development and committee participation.

Three Riverside County districts were contacted to determine how each handles conference and meeting expenses for Board members. The Alvord Unified School District places approximately \$3,000 per Board member in their Budget for conference expenses; the Moreno Valley Unified School District allows approximately \$4,000 per Board member for conference expenses, and the Hemet Unified School District allows \$2,000 per Board member. Expenditure of these funds varies by Board member and one may expend more than others in a given year.

Following review and discussion, the Board may wish to approve Board conference expenses for the 2000/2001 Budget.

* J. Approve Personnel Report #19

(Mr. Campbell)

Administration recommends approval of Personnel Report #19 as printed subject to corrections and changes resulting from review in Closed Session.

K. Review Routine Information Reports

HEAR REPORT ON JVHS PARTNERSHIP ACADEMIES

Jurupa Valley Principal, Ms. Jan Moorehouse, provided introductory remarks concerning Ms. Victoria Kelly and Mr. Joel Parker, academy teachers at Jurupa Valley High. Ms. Kelly and Mr. Parker presented information on Jurupa Valley's Partnership Academies, the Academy of Agriscience and Technology and the Construction and Engineering Academy respectively. Both teachers individually indicated that the academies are school-within-a-school programs to assist at-risk students in grades 10 through 12. They noted that with the help of business partners and a rigorous mentor program, students receive individualized attention to stay "connected" and on-task academically. Grant funds support a portion of the programs and students enrolled must take one technical course as well as three academic courses to remain in the program. A review of successes for the 1998-99 school year indicate that student attendance increased, and average GPA's for students enrolled in the academies was 2.59 for 10th grade students and 2.81 for 11th Students applying for academy programs must demonstrate their grade students. serious intent to become successful in the coursework assigned. Assistance from business partners is an added feature of the academy programs; they provide students with an opportunity to job shadow and learn entry-level skills in a variety of businesses in order to advance to a management position. Students also listen to guest speakers, attend field trips, participate in paid internship positions and become a part of the academy team. Many graduates of the program have also gone on to attend four-year universities and two-year college programs. Board members received copies of materials concerning career academies and their positive effects for at-risk students.

RECESS

At 8:48 p.m., President Knight called for a brief recess; at 8:53 p.m., President Knight reconvened the meeting.



HEAR REPORT ON ENGLISH LEARNERS' PROGRAM Ms. Sonia Porter, Language Services Coordinator for the past five years, reported that for this school year, there are 4,593 English learners, a 9.7% increase over last year's English learner enrollment. She noted that the majority of English language learners speak Spanish; however, there are 22 other languages represented in the District's schools. Ms. Porter reviewed the three options for parents to select for their English learners: (Option 1) the Mainstream English Program, (Option 2) the Structured English Immersion Program, and (Option 3) the Bilingual Spanish Program. She noted that currently, there are no parents in the district requesting Option 3. Ms. Porter commented that the goal of the English Learner program is to assist students in developing English language skills effectively and efficiently as possible with a high level of achievement in English. She referred to "English Language Development Profiles" for grades K-12 to assess students' mastery of standards. Ms. Porter remarked that currently, there are 211 authorized teachers in the District with proper certification to teach English learners with an additional 60 teachers currently enrolled in district training to receive the certification.

Ms. Porter stated that an additional component of the English learner program is to be selected periodically to participate in the California Department of Education's Comité process to monitor and review program compliance. She indicated that Jurupa was recently notified that they will be involved in Comité this year. Therefore, she explained that a District Task Force was developed to include two Board members, President Knight and Mr. Chavez, and a number of meetings will be held with teachers and principals to conduct a self-study and verify state and federal compliance requirements at each site. Following the self-study, a report will be provided to the California Department of Education in the fall to include on-site visits to verify the findings of the self-review. Ms. Porter remarked that the District anticipates being successful in the Comité process and ensuring that English learners are successful.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT - STATUS OF VISION SCREENING TRAILER The Assistant Superintendent Business Services reported to Mr. Chavez concerning his question at the last Board meeting regarding the status of the Vision Trailer used by many of the school sites. He indicated that the trailer, after many years of use, deteriorated to such a state that it was not feasible to move it from site to site to test students. Therefore, the Assistant Superintendent noted that the Vision Trailer was sold at the January 18, 2000 surplus sale.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

President Knight opened the Public Verbal Comments session; there were no comments from the public.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Board members individually thanked Camino Real Elementary Principal, Mr. Andew Huben, and Ms. Deborah Prutsman and her kindergarten class, for welcoming the Board and providing an outstanding program.

As a member of the CSBA Delegate Assembly, Mr. Chavez submitted the First Draft of the 2001-2002 Policy Platform Proposed Platform Amendments for Board members review and comments. He noted that he will be attending the Delegate Assembly meeting in May as he has for the past 8-9 years; however, for the past 3-5 years he has been paying for his own housing and travel expenses incurred to attend these meetings. He asked that on the next Agenda, the Board consider paying for housing and travel expenses for the CSBA Delegate Assembly meeting in May, and additionally, that the Board consider placing in the 2000-2001 Budget funds for Board development and training.



BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS (CONTINUED) Mrs. Burns was pleased to announce that on April 14, 250 of Jurupa's finest students, including Ms. Crystal Hadden, visited the Jurupa Mountains Cultural Center to assist with a service project for the Center's wheelchair access to the garden. She commented that students lifted "tons of block" to help clear the way for the project to proceed and she extended her sincere thanks for their positive, cheerful attitude while carrying out their service.

Mrs. Adams welcomed the student representatives as soon to be seated members with the Board as preferential voters. She issued a reminder that Public Schools Week begins April 24 and she plans to visit schools to see their various programs.

President Knight commented that student ambassadors have been doing an outstanding job of providing reports on various activities at their respective school sites and he is looking forward to a Nueva Vista student joining the Student Board Members with a representative from their school beginning with the 2000-2001 school year. He shared with Board members documents he and Mr. Chavez received at the April 5, 2000 Comité meeting held at the Riverside County Office of Education. He noted that speakers at the meeting did an excellent job of presenting their materials, and he thanked Ms. Sonia Porter for her report on the Comité process.

OF FRESNO, CALIFORNIA, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$99,611.64 (INCLUDING TAX) FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE TWO BUSES. MRS. ADAMS SECONDED THE MOTION.

Mrs. Burns asked whether the fuel source for the two buses will be regular or diesel fuel? The Assistant Superintendent responded that it is his understanding that one of the buses will require diesel fuel and one of the buses will use gasoline. However, he noted that although the Purchasing Department has placed as their priority buses using gasoline fuel, based on the immediacy of the need only a diesel fueled bus was available for the second bus purchase. The Assistant Superintendent indicated to Mrs. Burns that he did not know whether it was possible to convert the diesel fueled bus at a later date; however, if the second bus order is cancelled students will be delayed another 2-6 months before transportation services are provided.

Mrs. Burns requested a separation of the vote to support the purchase of the gasoline fueled bus and oppose the purchase of the diesel fueled bus. She noted that her desire to separate the two purchases is based on her stand of supporting health issues for students.

MR. TEAGARDEN RESCINDED THE MOTION TO APPROVE THE ISSUANCE OF PURCHASE ORDER #22809 TO CALIFORNIA BUS SALES & SERVICES CENTER, INC. OF FRESNO, CALIFORNIA, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$99,611.64 (INCLUDING TAX) FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE TWO BUSES. MRS. ADAMS RESCINDED HER SECOND OF THE MOTION as well.

MR. TEAGARDEN MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF A DIESEL FUELED BUS. MR. CHAVEZ SECONDED THE MOTION.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services explained to Student Board Member Joshua Johnson that the smaller 12-passenger bus is more versatile and is used to transport special education students requiring door-to-door service. He remarked that at this time there are students that have been waiting for transportation services for approximately 30 days; the Purchasing Department has made every effort to make alternate contacts to address the transportation needs; therefore, the companies selected for this purchase are based on their capability of a two week delivery date.

The Superintendent noted that if additional information is needed concerning the purchase of the two buses, the item may be removed and returned at the next meeting. Mrs. Adams suggested purchasing the one bus that uses gasoline fuel, while postponing the other purchase until another gasoline fueled bus can be located. Student Board Member Crystal Hadden suggested the possibility of buying the diesel fueled bus, using it until the end of the year, and selling it later.

Mrs. Burns noted that she remained firm in her position that to purchase a bus using diesel fuel that cannot be converted at a later date to compressed natural gas goes against the district's stance of moving away from buses that use diesel fuel.



APPROVE PURCHASE OF 2 GASOLINE FUELED BUSES -Motion #189 (CONTINUED) PREFERENTIAL VOTES WERE CAST BY STUDENT BOARD MEMBERS: AYE, MS. HADDEN, NAYE, MR. JOHNSON. A VOTE WAS TAKEN BY THE BOARD: AYE, MR. CHAVEZ, MR. TEAGARDEN; NAYE, MRS. ADAMS, MRS. BURNS. PRESIDENT KNIGHT. THE MOTION WAS DEFEATED.

MR. TEAGARDEN MOVED THE BOARD AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF ONE GASOLINE FUELED BUS. MRS. BURNS SECONDED THE MOTION.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services emphasized that based on the survey of every available source, there is only one gasoline fueled bus available without a lengthy waiting period.

MR. TEAGARDEN AND MRS. BURNS RESCINDED THEIR MOTION AND SECOND RESPECTIVELY, as they wished to approve a motion to purchase two gasoline fueled buses.

MR. TEAGARDEN MOVED THE BOARD AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF TWO GASOLINE FUELED BUSES. MRS. BURNS SECONDED THE MOTION. PREFERENTIAL VOTES WERE CAST BY STUDENT BOARD MEMBERS: AYE, MS. HADDEN, MR. JOHNSON. A VOTE WAS TAKEN BY THE BOARD WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

Mrs. Burns thanked the Board for recognizing her position of opposing diesel-fueled buses for the purpose of supporting the health of children.

APPROVE EDA COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR NEW EDUCATION CENTER AND JURUPA VALLEY HIGH PROJECTS -Motion #190 The Assistant Superintendent Business Services indicated that an agreement is needed to formalize Supervisor Tavaglione's prior commitment to provide a portion of the funds needed for a riding arena for Jurupa Valley High (\$25,000); off-site improvements for the new Education Center (\$400,000), and landscaping costs for the District's property at Jurupa Valley High (\$50,000) between the existing fence line north to Galena Street. A major provision in the agreement is that the district will maintain the landscaped area by Jurupa Valley High.

MR. TEAGARDEN MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE THE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGENCY FOR THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE AND THE JURUPA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR THE EDUCATION CENTER AND JURUPA VALLEY HIGH PROJECTS. MR. CHAVEZ SECONDED THE MOTION.

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services responded to Mrs. Burns that a specified bus turn around is not included in the project; however, the agreement does include re-routing buses along the east end of the high school to enhance student safety.

Student Board Member Joshua Johnson noted that Jurupa Valley FFA students are excited that the Jurupa Valley arena project is coming before the Board for approval, and he requested a copy of the arena drawing once it is completed.

PREFERENTIAL VOTES WERE CAST BY STUDENT BOARD MEMBERS: AYE, MS. HADDEN, AYE, MR. JOHNSON. A VOTE WAS TAKEN BY THE BOARD WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.



AUTHORIZE SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR JVHS LANDSCAPING IMPROVEMENTS -Motion #191

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services stated that in order to meet the Economic Development Agency's desire to move forward immediately on the landscaping project at Jurupa Valley High School, he is requesting, as the Superintendent's Designee, to accept the low bid for the project subject to ratification by the Board at the May 15, 2000 meeting. MR. CHAVEZ MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE THE SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR LANDSCAPING IMPROVEMENTS AT JURUPA VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZE THE SUPERINTENDENT OR DESIGNEE TO AWARD A CONTRACT TO THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER, SUBJECT TO RATIFICATION BY THE BOARD. APPROVE PURCHASE OF 39 PORTABLES -Motion #192

The Assistant Superintendent Business Services reported that the 39 portables requested include 12 portables for growth; 23 portables for the Class Size Reduction program; three portables for the Rancho Vista program, and one portable for the staff lounge at Pedley Elementary for a total cost of \$1,242,623. He noted that the State's facility funding program for the 23 Class Size Reduction portables is different this year; funds will be reimbursed following the purchase of the portables, rather than the State providing funding prior to purchase as has been the case in the past. Assistant Superintendent indicated that the State anticipates funding availability for Class Size Reduction portables at \$40,000 per portable; however, he commented that the cost of installation is approximately the same amount, \$40,000 per portable, with the balance paid for through the use of Developer Fees and the General Fund, for a total project cost of approximately \$2.5 million. 

We have received and reviewed your 1999-2000 Second Interim Financial Report. The governing board has made a positive certification that the district will be able to meet its financial obligations for the current and two subsequent fiscal years. We have notified the California Department of Education of your district's positive certification. I commend you and your staff for your efforts in the preparation of these reports.

Our analysis of the report included the multi-year financial projections approved by the board. The report indicates expenditures and other uses will exceed revenues by \$2,391,250 in the current fiscal year due to one-time expenditure of carryover funds. Although deficit spending is projected to continue at a reduced level in the subsequent fiscal year, the multi-year financial projections indicate that the district will be able to meet its financial obligations and maintain minimum state required reserves in the 2000-2001 and 2001-2002 fiscal years.

The report indicates that classified salary negotiations have not been concluded for the current fiscal year. Government Code Section 3547.5 requires that the major provisions of a proposed collective bargaining agreement, including the projected cost of the agreement, be disclosed at a public meeting prior to governing board approval. Please provide a copy of this information to our office ten days prior to board approval.

Our office recommends that the board continue to review updated multi-year financial projections which reflect current and anticipated changes in the district's operational programs, debt service obligations and/or enrollment and attendance trends. This process will assist the board in providing for the long-range financial stability of the district. Please provide our office with a copy of updated multi-year financial projections, including assumptions, with the submission of your 2000-2001 Adopted Budget and with the disclosure of a proposed classified collective bargaining agreement.
