On August 31, 2000, Administration received a claim against Jurupa Unified School District on behalf of Adam Armstrong. The claim alleges he sustained an injury when he fell off of playground equipment. Administration recommends rejection of the claim, with appropriate notice to the district insurance carrier. (A copy of the claim is available for Board review.)

\* 8. Adopt Resolution #01/09, Appropriations Limit to Article XIIIB of the California State Constitution (Mrs. Lauzon)

In November of 1979, California voters adopted Proposition 4, commonly called the Gann amendment. This amendment was incorporated into the State Constitution as Article XIIIB. It requires all public agencies, including school districts, to compute an appropriations limit each year, based on a formula provided by the State. The District limit changes each year, depending on increases in pupil attendance and the Consumer Price Index.

On September 20, 1999, the Board approved the calculation of the 1999-2000 appropriations limit based on estimated revenue and pupil attendance. At this time, the District is required to submit to the State for recalculation for 1999-2000, based on actual figures, and a calculation for 2000-2001, based on budget projections.

These appropriation limits, also known as the "Gann Limit," have to do with how much tax money the State may appropriate. They do not affect the amount of money the District may spend. The 1999-2000 appropriations for Jurupa Unified School District was recalculated and increased from \$72,833,221 to \$75,069,422; the 2000-2001 appropriations limit for Jurupa Unified School District is \$79,771,274. Calculations are shown in the supporting documents.

Administration recommends the Board Adopt Resolution No. 01/09, Appropriations Limits for 1999-2000 and 2000-2001

### \* B. Adopt at Single Reading Revised Regulation 2440 – Official District Publications

(Dr. Hovey)

Regulation 2440 – Official District Publications: This regulation was revised and updated with input by members of the Superintendent's Extended Cabinet. The official district publications are prepared and distributed by departments as listed.

<u>Administration recommends adoption at single reading of the revised Board Regulation 2440 – Official District Publications.</u>

### C. Act on Recommendations of the Blue Ribbon Committee

(Mr. Edmunds)

On August 29, 2000, the District's Blue Ribbon Committee on facilities met to review updated information on the District's facility planning process. Mr. Jeremy Thorn and Ms. Terry Dien, of Education Research, presented the results of their community facilities research survey. This was essentially the same presentation that was given to the Board on August 7, 2000. The Board may recall that the survey results led to a recommendation to initiate a focused effort to inform the community about the District's facility needs. In addition, Mr. Bob Lavey and Ms. Alexandra Parslow, of Perkins & Will, gave the Committee a brief update of our Master Plan and revised eligibility in the State School Building Program.

After review and discussion of this information, the Blue Ribbon Committee made several recommendations to the Board, as follows:

- 1. Begin an information campaign to educate the community on the District's facility needs. Hire a consultant or public relations agency for this purpose.
- 2. Work toward acquiring land for new school sites.
- 3. Begin program planning for new schools elementary and middle.
- 4. Examine options for short-term housing for students until new schools can be built.

This evening, Mr. Bob Lavey and Ms. Alexandra Parslow, of Perkins & Will, will present to the Board updated information on the Master Plan and eligibility in the State School Building Program, as presented to the Blue Ribbon Committee. Mr. Jeremy Thorn, of Education Research, will then present his Public Information Program Proposal. The proposal is to provide services over a four-month period of time at a cost of \$43,000, plus an estimated cost of \$12,000 for printed material and postage.

After discussion, administration recommends the Board accept the recommendations of the Blue Ribbon Committee and authorize administration to implement them. Administration further recommends the Board authorize retaining Education Research to conduct a public information program.

### \* D. Authorize Submittal of Application for 2000/2001 Class Size Reduction Program

(Mr. Edmunds)

The 2000/2001 school year will be the fifth year of the District's Class Size Reduction Program (CSR). In previous years the District has reduced class sizes in kindergarten, first, and second grades and some third grade classes. Third grade class size reduction will be fully implemented districtwide this school year. The application in the supporting documents is to operate 307 reduced classes with a total estimated enrollment of 5,950 students. Funding for the CSR Program has been increased this year from \$844 to \$871 per student, resulting in a total estimated allocation of \$5,182,450.

Administration recommends the Board authorize submittal of the 2000/2001 Class Size Reduction Program Application.

### E. Review and Act on School Facility Matters

(Mr. Edmunds)

Due to frequent changes taking place in facility improvement programs, items which require Board discussion or action may arise between agenda preparation and meeting times. Administration may provide such items as verbal information reports or recommendations for action.

### F. Approve Personnel Matters

### 1. Approve Personnel Report #5

(Mr. Campbell)

Administration recommends approval of Personnel Report #5 as printed subject to corrections and changes resulting from review in Closed Session.

### 2. Approve Variable Term Waiver Request

(Mr. Campbell)

Recent changes in state credentialing laws require that prior to hiring an individual to teach under the authorization of a Variable Term Waiver (Title V, Section 80122), specific individual approval must be granted by the governing board. Usually, this type of waiver is necessary for hard-to-fill positions in shortage areas (examples: Special Education, Bilingual Education, Mathematics or Science) or when an unexpected vacancy occurs in the middle of a school year. In this case, the recommendation is to fill a vacancy for a Resource Specialist at Rubidoux High School. The person being recommended is Mr. Christopher Fowler. Mr. Fowler has been working in the district as a Substitute Teacher for the past year; he earned his Bachelor's degree from California State University, San Bernardino and is currently enrolled in the Special Education Credential program at National University. Recruitment efforts have not identified a stronger candidate.

With these considerations in mind, it is recommended that Mr. Fowler be approved for temporary employment through the end of this school year as a Resource Specialist under the authorization of a Variable Term Waiver.

### G. Review Routine Information Reports

### 1. Hear Report on Status of District Restrooms

(Mr. Edmunds)

At the August 7, 2000 Board Meeting, President Sam Knight requested a report on the status of District restrooms. In late August, the Assistant Superintendent Business Services inspected numerous restroom facilities with Bill Elzig, Director of Maintenance and Operations. The tour focused on older schools, specifically Rubidoux High, Mission Middle, Rustic Lane, Pedley, Troth Street, West Riverside, and Glen Avon. Older restrooms were selected for review because they tend to be more challenging to clean and maintain. Our custodial staff cleans all restrooms on a daily basis, but there are other factors such as lighting, ventilation, paint, condition of tile, and condition of ceiling that affect a restroom's appearance and sense of cleanliness. These factors are more pronounced in older facilities.

The inspection of restrooms at the above sites revealed that, with minor exceptions, District restroom facilities are clean and sanitary. However, it was also apparent that several locations can benefit from an increased level of maintenance. At Rubidoux High School, the restrooms near the Band Room are currently being rehabilitated, including new tile, fixtures, toilet partitions and paint. We are also looking into installing a dropped ceiling and improved lighting. A boys' restroom at Sky Country is receiving similar treatment, and the 600 wing restrooms at Rubidoux High will be rehabbed this year. At other sites, less extensive, but nonetheless important needs were noted, including: replacement lenses for light fixtures, new toilet partitions, dropped ceilings/improved lighting, installation of exhaust fans, paint, new tile, and replacement of plumbing fixtures. These items will be addressed during the coming school year, and in the District's Five-year Deferred Maintenance Plan.

In addition to maintenance considerations, restroom cleanliness is heavily affected by two other factors: supervision and overcrowding. It is extremely difficult to supervise students in restrooms at all times, and student vandalism or mischief can contribute significantly to unclean or unsightly restrooms. In restrooms where there have been chronic problems of this type, principals may have to provide additional supervision until the problem is corrected.

Finally, overcrowding at our schools can make it more difficult to maintain restrooms. With the installation of 40 portables this summer, the District's classroom space is now about 42% portable. While we have installed a few portable restroom facilities to mitigate this impact, for the most part, adding portables to existing campuses places an added burden on core facilities such as restrooms. The District's Master Plan for Facilities identifies the need for additional restroom facilities at most of our campuses. This need must be addressed along with other needs for modernization and new construction as part of a long-range plan to finance the District's facility needs. Information only.

2. Hear Report on 1999-2000 Scholastic Achievement Test (SAT) Scores (Mr. Mendez) Scholastic Achievement Test (SAT) scores for the 1999-2000 school year for the Jurupa Unified School District resulted in a combined (verbal and mathematics) district average of 921 points, 4 points higher than last year. The district average on the verbal score increased 3 points from 449 to 452 and 2 points in mathematics from 468 to 470. The overall number of students taking the SAT continues to increase. A total of 323 students, approximately 40% (compared to 36% the previous year) of eligible seniors took the test.

As the chart below indicates, Jurupa Valley High School gained eight points in the verbal section of the test (446 - 98/99 vs. 454 - 99/00) and a greater gain of 17 points in the area of mathematics (463 - 98/99 vs. 480 - 99/00). The figures for Rubidoux High School indicate a slight decrease of three points in the verbal score (452 - 98/99 vs. 449 - 99/00). In the mathematics section RHS scores dropped 14 points (473 - 98/99 vs. 459 - 99/00).

In general, JUSD has maintained the gains made since 1992-93 when the verbal average was 351 compared to 452 in 99/00, and the mathematics average was 415 compared to 470, in 99/00. <u>Information only.</u>



### ATTACHMENT C

### RULES FOR THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS TO THE COUNTY COMMITTEE ON SCHOOL DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

- 1. At the election meeting, a candidate *must be nominated from the floor* by an authorized representative delegate.
- 2. A candidate must be a citizen and, if nominated to represent a Supervisorial district, must reside within that Supervisorial district. A candidate for Member-At-Large may reside anywhere in Riverside County.
- 3. A candidate may be nominated for both a Supervisorial district and for member-at large. However, a candidate who is subsequently elected to both positions must accept the Supervisorial district position.
- 4. A candidate cannot be an employee of the County Office of Education, a school district, or a community college district. However, any member of the governing board of a school district, or community college district, in the same or any other county, who is otherwise eligible, may simultaneously serve as a member of the county committee.
- 5. An authorized representative delegate may cast one vote for each vacant position.

At 7:07 p.m., President Knight called the meeting to order in Public Session. President Knight, Mrs. Adams, Mrs. Burns, Mr. Chavez, Mr. Teagarden President Knight led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Chavez made an inspirational comment.



### COMMUNICATIONS SESSION

INTRODUCE BOARD CANDIDATES FOR NOVEMBER 7 GOVERNING BOARD ELECTION The Superintendent introduced Governing Board candidates for the November 7, 2000 election: Trustee Area 2, Mr. John J. Chavez, Incumbent, and Mr. Thomas Langdale; Trustee Area 4, Ms. Carolyn A. Adams, Incumbent, and Mr. Bob Hernandez.

INTRODUCE NEW INDIAN HILLS PRINCIPAL The Superintendent introduced Ms. Jacqueline Monestero, the new Indian Hills Principal, and thanked her for welcoming the Board at her site.

RECOGNIZE SSP GRANT AWARD FOR JURUPA VALLEY HIGH The Assistant Superintendent Education Services announced that Jurupa Valley High School has been awarded a Specialized Secondary Program grant in the amount of \$35,000 to provide advanced learning opportunities for their students.

RECOGNIZE GRANT AWARD FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL DRUG & VIOLENCE PREVENTION COORDINATORS The Assistant Superintendent Education Services notified the Board of a three-year grant award of \$218,395 for the District to fund Drug and Violence Prevention coordinators at the middle school level. He noted that Ms. Lucinda Sheppy, Administrator of Student and Community Services, will act as the administrator of the grant program and work with coordinators and community partners to design programs and activities to reinforce the importance of a safe, drug-free campus.

RECOGNIZE YOUTH CONNECT GRANT AWARD PARTNERSHIP The Assistant Superintendent Education Services recognized the *Youth Connect* grant award partnership with WestEd to assist at-risk middle school students. He indicated that grant funds will allow WestEd's School and Community Health Research Group to work with the District to implement a program to reduce the number and duration of student suspensions and expulsions.

STATUS OF THE DISTRICT & OPENING OF THE 2000/2001 SCHOOL YEAR

The Superintendent reported that with school opening in two days, September 7, 2000, the District anticipates an enrollment of \$19,533 students. She commended the Maintenance Department for working diligently during the summer months to install forty portable classrooms to accommodate students in the class size reduction program and for growth; for completing several painting and concrete projects; for installing new carpeting at sites, and for preparing the entire district for the opening of school. She reviewed that the areas of focus for the 2000-2001 school year are (1) improving reading/language arts instruction at all levels; (2) reducing the achievement gap between English language learners and English proficient students; (3) securing financing for improving and building new facilities; (4) increasing internet connections at all sites; (5) improving the capacity of the student data system to meet the needs of school sites, and (6) meeting API growth targets at every school. In addition, the Superintendent announced that there are several new programs available for middle school students to assist in ensuring their success; K-8 parents will receive a copy of State Standards by grade level, and since this year's ninth grade students are the first class that will be required to take and pass the High School Exit Exam, their parents received a special copy of the State Standards for high school students to help them in understanding the State's expectations for high school course contents.



NOMINATE MR. JOHN J. CHAVEZ FOR CSBA DIRECTOR-AT-LARGE, HISPANIC -Motion #38 The Superintendent announced that there are two California School Boards Association Director-at-Large positions open for nomination: Asian/Pacific Islander and Hispanic. She noted that the CSBA election will take place at the November 29-30, 2000 meeting of the Delegate Assembly in Long Beach; the Board has an opportunity to submit the nomination form by September 28, 2000.

MR. TEAGARDEN NOMINATED MR. JOHN J. CHAVEZ FOR THE CALIFORNIA SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION DIRECTOR-AT-LARGE, HISPANIC, POSITION. PRESIDENT KNIGHT SECONDED THE MOTION. A VOTE WAS TAKEN; THE MOTION CARRIED 3-0: AYE, MR. CHAVEZ, PRESIDENT KNIGHT, MR. TEAGARDEN; ABSTAIN, MRS. ADAMS, MRS. BURNS.

REPORT ON COMMUNITY ACTION PLANNING COMMITTEE The Superintendent noted that as per the request of President Knight at the last meeting, Board members are being provided with copies of material outlining the Riverside County Community Action Planning Committee.

PUBLIC VERBAL COMMENTS:

President Knight opened the Public Verbal Comments session.

TEXTBOOKS - AGENDA ITEM F

Ms. Cynthia Drummond, parent of a student at Ina Arbuckle Elementary, reported that her student has been at Ina Arbuckle in grades K-3 and has not brought home a textbook on any occasion. She indicated that because her student is not assigned a textbook to take home and is only given worksheets, she is not able to help assist her child with homework.

The Superintendent responded that she will investigate the matter and report back concerning the student not having a textbook.

AGENDA ITEM H

Ms. Penny Newman, community member, commended the Board for taking the necessary steps to adopt a resolution supporting an Indoor Air Quality program. She provided a fact sheet on "Safe Schools, Creating Healthy School Environments," and invited a district representative to attend an upcoming conference in San Diego on September 13, 2000, "Indoor Air Quality, Biological Remediation and Control." In addition, Ms. Newman offered to coordinate a visit by EPA staff to provide a walk-through of sites to evaluate Indoor Air Quality needs in the district.

TEXTBOOKS & FIELD TRIP FUNDING

Mr. Pete Edwardson, parent of three children in the district (Van Buren Elementary, Mira Loma Middle, and Jurupa Valley High), reported that none of his children have been allowed to take home their textbooks. He stated that they have been informed, "there are not enough textbooks and students must share a textbook." Mr. Edwardson noted that when his daughter that is now in college attended school in the district, she was given the same message. Mr. Edwardson also made the Board aware of how upset his student was when a field trip to the Museum of Tolerance was cancelled two days prior to the planned date. According to Mr. Edwardson, students were informed that the reason for the cancellation was because the funding was used elsewhere.

President Knight referred Mr. Edwardson's concerns to the Superintendent for follow-up.



BOARD MEMBER **COMMENTS** 

Mrs. Adams thanked administration for providing an outstanding New Teacher Reception on Friday, September 1, 2000. In addition, she expressed her gratitude for the "Finger Tip Facts" brochure that is provided each year.

Mr. Chavez thanked the new Indian Hills Principal, Ms. Jacqueline Monestero, for welcoming the Board to Indian Hills Elementary School. He thanked Board members for nominating him to fill the CSBA Director-at-Larger, Hispanic, position. He commented that he was also pleased to welcome newly hired certificated staff members at the New Teacher Reception.

President Knight stated that he is looking forward to working with his colleagues on the Governing Board this year; he thanked the Superintendent for setting a positive tone for the District and for focusing on ways to support the educational process along with classified and certificated staff. He commended members of the public for sharing their concerns with the Board and allowing administration to provide follow-up.

HOLD PUBLIC HEARING ON THE DISTRICT'S

PROPOSAL FOR **NEGOTIATIONS WITH CSEA** 

The Assistant Superintendent Personnel Services indicated that the Board must conduct a public hearing on its response proposal to the California School Employees' Association. President Knight formally opened the public hearing on the District's proposal for Negotiations with CSEA. There were no comments from the public; the hearing was formally closed.

APPROVE ACTUAL REVENUE AND EXPENDITURES -Motion #41 The Assistant Superintendent Business Services stated that as the Board is aware, final revenue and expenditures are not available when the District's Budget is adopted each year. However, he noted that by mid-August, the District has completed year-end totals to report to the Riverside County Office of Education. The Assistant Superintendent provided a summary of the major differences between budget estimates and unaudited actuals for the 1999/2000 school year as follows: a \$222,655 decrease in revenue; a \$392,345 decrease in expenditures; an increase of \$153,603 in the Total Ending Balance Unrestricted and an increase in the Total Restricted Ending Balance of \$16,087. He requested the Board's certification of actual revenue and expenditures.

PRESIDENT KNIGHT MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE THAT THE CERTIFICATION OF THE ACTUAL REVENUE AND EXPENDITURES AND THE J-201 REPORT INCLUDED IN THE SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS BE FILED WITH THE RIVERSIDE COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION. MR. TEAGARDEN SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

APPROVE 2000-2001 ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM OFFERINGS -Motion #42 The Assistant Superintendent Education Services stated that the supporting documents contain the list of courses offered through the Adult Education program for the 2000-2001 school year, noting the day, time, and location of each class.

MRS. BURNS MOVED THE BOARD APPROVE THE 2000-2001 ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM OFFERINGS. MR. TEAGARDEN SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ADOPT RES. #01/04, PARTICIPATE IN REEP BENEFITS PARTNERSHIP -Motion #43 The Assistant Superintendent Business Services reported that Resolution #01/04 is a result of discussions in the negotiations process with the Certificated Bargaining Unit. The Unit requested that the District join the Riverside County Employer/Employee Partnership for Benefits and adopt a resolution in support of this health insurance purchasing coalition.

MR. TEAGARDEN MOVED THE BOARD ADOPT RESOLUTION #01/04, RESOLUTION TO PARTICIPATE IN RIVERSIDE COUNTY EMPLOYER/EMPLOYEE PARTNERSHIP FOR BENEFITS. MR. CHAVEZ SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ADOPT RES. #01/05, PUPIL TEXTBOOK AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS INCENTIVE PROGRAMS, GRADES K-12 -Motion #44 The Assistant Superintendent Education Services requested the Board's certification that the District meets the requirements of Education Code 60119 in terms of textbooks or instructional materials for each pupil in the district pursuant to the curriculum framework adopted by the state board.

The Superintendent stated that the California School Boards Association has recommended that local school boards consider information on two Propositions that will appear on the November ballot. Proposition 38 would provide \$4,000 per student vouchers for use at private or religious schools, and Proposition 39 would change the vote requirement for passage of local bonds from two-thirds to 55 percent. She noted that CSBA has taken an opposed position to Proposition 38 and a support position on Proposition 39, and provided in the supporting documents is an analysis by the Legislative Analyst's Office of both Propositions as well.

MR. TEAGARDEN MOVED THE BOARD ADOPT RESOLUTION #01/06, OPPOSING THE PASSAGE OF PROPOSITION 38, AND RESOLUTION #01/07, SUPPORTING THE PASSAGE OF PROPOSITION 39. MRS. ADAMS SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

ADOPT RES. #01/08, SUPPORTING INDOOR AIR QUALITY -Motion #46 The Assistant Superintendent Business Services reviewed that at the last Board meeting, Mrs. Burns presented information on compliance with Indoor Air Quality requirements. In addition, she requested that the Board consider adopting a resolution addressing and supporting IAQ issues.
