4. Administrative Reports and Written Communications

a. Approval of 2007-2008 Budget

(Mrs. Lauzon)

The District recently received confirmation from the Riverside County Office of Education that the District's 2007-2008 adopted budget was approved as submitted. <u>Information Only</u>.

b. Appoint Liaison Representatives to Technology Master Plan Committee (Mrs. Lauzon)

Board Policy 1221.3 provides for the Board to designate one of its members as a Liaison Representative to each districtwide advisory committee. Administration would like to invite 1-2 Board Members to join the district's Technology Master Plan Committee. A Technology Master Plan helps ensure that technology is aligned to serve the academic and administrative needs of the district.

c. Hear Report on JUSD RIF Program

(Mrs. Elzig)

On August 14, 2007, the District received notification from the National Reading Is Fundamental (RIF) office that our proposal to expand the Jurupa Unified School District RIF program was approved. Our current program serves five schools: Ina Arbuckle, Pacific Avenue, Pedley, West Riverside, and Jurupa Middle Schools. With the expansion, we will be adding Stone Avenue and Troth Street Elementary Schools.

c. Hear Report on JUSD RIF Program (continued)

Along with this exciting news, RIF reviewed our program and selected Jurupa Unified School District to partner with Macy's Department Store. Macy's program, Be One For The Books!, enables RIF to broaden its outreach to schools with children who lack adequate access to books. This partnership provides additional funding to local RIF programs and to team local RIF programs and RIF supporters with a Macy's store in their community. In addition to our current RIF funding of \$15,747, Macy's will provide the Jurupa Unified School District RIF program with \$15,284 to purchase quality books for our students.

d. <u>Hear Report on 2006-2007 State and Federal Accountability Results</u> (Mrs. Elzig)

This evening, Ms. Jackie Espinoza, Coordinator of Assessment and Accountability, will provide a presentation on both state and federal accountability results, which will include results and observations from the 2007 Academic Performance Index (API) Growth Report, 2007 Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) Report and 2007-08 Program Improvement (PI) Report. e. Update on Single Gender Classes

(Mrs. Elzig)

Letters were sent to all parents of students who attend Jurupa Middle School and Mission Middle School explaining the single gender classes and offering enrollment in the classes. Several requests have been received and we are in the process of desegregating their data to determine their proper placement. Our hope is to have a minimum of one class, per gender, at each site. <u>Information only.</u>

f. <u>Information on Submittal of English Learner Acquisition and Development Pilot Program Application</u> (Mrs. Elzig)

A pilot program, instituted by the California Department of Education, will provide funding to districts with programs that have been identified as exhibiting best practices regarding topics, including, but not limited to, curriculum, instruction, and staff development for teaching English language learners and promoting English language and academic English acquisition and development. An application was submitted on behalf of Indian Hills, Pacific Avenue, Rustic Lane, West Riverside, Jurupa Middle, Mira Loma Middle, Mission Middle and Rubidoux High School. These schools were identified by the CDE as meeting the eligible criteria. Any funds awarded will be used to further enhance positive practices already in place. A copy of the submitted application is available in the Language Services Department for review. Information only.

* g. <u>Information on High School Testing Schedule and District Assessment Calendar for 2007-2008</u> (Mrs. Elzig)

The testing schedule for 2007-2008 for Jurupa Valley High School, Patriot High School and Rubidoux High School and the district's assessment calendar is included in the supporting documents. <u>Information only.</u>

* h. Report on K-8 Summer Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO) School Report (Mrs. Elzig)

The 20 day summer ELO program for students in grades K-8 ended on Tuesday, August 7, 2007. On Wednesday, the last day for teachers, they completed their standards-based report cards and program evaluations. Summer school records, along with teacher recommendations for students identified for retention, were reviewed by the summer principals along with education services staff prior to notification of parents.

The school attendance summary comprises data for 2,845 students who attended this summer reflecting 189,518 hours of instruction with an average total attendance rate of 85%. Student performance data on minimum standards Criterion-Referenced Tests (CRTs) for grades 2-8 reflect an average percent increase of 6.24 percent in English language arts and 6.87 percent in mathematics. A chart reflecting grade and site level average comparisons is included in the supporting documents.

* h. Report on K-8 Summer Extended Learning Opportunity (ELO) School Report (con't.)

The program evaluations reflect overall support for the summer program and the staff that work so hard to manage and implement the program. This year, we changed the staff development from a whole group event to a site-based training model which teachers felt was more effective and personalized. However, we received requests to re-review the standards alignment and content rigor of the instructional materials which we will do this fall in order to determine the necessity to purchase additional content materials for next year. The daily implementation, teacher support, and student incentives provided by the Teachers on Special Assignment who managed the program were appreciated and recognized at all sites. i. Report from Ad Hoc Athletic GPA Committee

(Mrs. Elzig)

At the July 2, 2007 Board meeting, administration was directed to establish an Ad Hoc Committee to review the current GPA standards for athletic eligibility. The first meeting of the committee was held on August 8, 2007. Present were Board members, Dawn Brewer and Mary Burns, high school principals, athletic directors, head coaches, and parents. The committee discussed current district practice in regards to CIF eligibility and assistance provided to students to help them meet the criteria. The next meeting is scheduled for early September to further review the topic. Information Only.

**j. <u>Consider Approval of Presentation of "Hands on Banking" Program to District Students</u> (Mr. Duchon)

At the July 16th Board of Education Meeting, Mr. Chavez requested that the Superintendent contact the Branch Manager of the Wells Fargo Bank at Limonite/Clay and coordinate a presentation to the Board on the Bank's "Hands on Banking" program for students. Ms. JoAnna Gonzales, Branch Manager for Wells Fargo Bank at Limonite/Clay, is here this evening to present the "Hands on Banking" program and answer Board questions. This program is a one hour classroom presentation which highlights money skills students will need in life and how to be a better money manager. Information and a program CD have been provided to the Board under separate cover. Wells Fargo, Limonite/Clay Branch, is requesting that the Board approve making this program available to our schools and allow Wells Fargo, Limonite/Clay Branch, to work with the sites to schedule classroom presentations. The Board may wish, by consensus, to allow Wells Fargo, Limonite/Clay Branch, to work with school sites to schedule classroom presentations on "Hands on Banking."

k. Consider Nomination for CSBA 2007 Outstanding Legislator of the Year(Mr. Duchon)

At the 2007 CSBA Annual Education Conference in December, the California School Boards Association will honor two to four current members of the state Senate and Assembly who work actively to improve our public schools and who exercise leadership in the legislative arena. School Boards are invited to participate in this program by nominating a Senator and/or Assembly Member for CSBA's 2007 Outstanding Legislator of the Year. Nominees must be from Jurupa's legislative district and all nominations must be postmarked by September 7, 2007. The Board may wish to nominate a current legislator for CSBA 2007 Outstanding Legislator of the Year.

*I. Consider Nominations for California School Boards Association Director-at-Large, American Indian and Black (Mr. Duchon)

Included in the supporting documents, is information from the California School Boards Association on elections for two CSBA Director-at-Large positions for American Indian and Black. Nominations for directorships must be made in writing by any member board to the President of CSBA. Each nominating board must certify that the nominee has consented to be nominated at the time of nomination. Each member-at-large so nominated must be a current board member. A biographical sketch must be included with the nomination form, along with two letters of recommendation. The deadline for submitting nominations to CSBA is Friday, September 28, 2007. The election will take place at CSBA's Delegate Assembly meeting in San Diego on November 28-29, 2007. The Board may wish to nominate up to two candidates for the Director-At-Large positions.

*m. <u>Consider Changing the Current Practice of Including Board Members in Management Interviews</u> (Mr. Duchon)

Board Member, Mary Burns, has requested that the current practice of having board members participate in management interviews be placed on the agenda for discussion by the Board. For the past three years, board members have participated in most management interviews. Board Policy 9000 (included in the supporting documents) outlines the role of the Board and the Superintendent in the hiring process. This policy holds the Superintendent, or his designee, responsible for recommending candidates for employment. It holds the Board of Education responsible for electing or rejecting employees recommended by the Superintendent, or his designee. While this board policy does not authorize or prohibit board member participation in management interviews, our current practice may conflict with this policy in that board members become involved in recommending candidates, as well as making final hiring decisions.

*m. <u>Consider Changing the Current Practice of Including Board Members in Management Interviews</u> (continued)

A legal opinion prepared by counsel recognizes some benefits to this practice, including board members being able to collect more information about candidates and therefore, possibly making more informed decisions. The practice also gives board members a greater understanding of the candidate pool and other aspects of the various recruitments. However, the legal opinion cautions that if board members participate on interview panels in any other role than silent observers, it could be problematic from both a liability and a practical standpoint. In addition, the opinion outlines concerns that board members could have a chilling effect on the participation of other panel members, due to the fact that board members ultimately determine the career path of many panelists.

After discussion, the Board, by consensus, may agree not to participate on interview panels. This would provide the highest level of accountability for the Superintendent.

n. <u>Discuss Feasibility of Utilizing Indian Hills Golf Club Swimming Pool</u> (Mr. Duchon)

Board Member, Michael Rodriguez, and Frank Morales, community member, have requested that the district explore the feasibility of using the swimming pool at Indian Hills Golf Club, until other pools are available.

Staff will provide an update and the Board may wish to discuss this item further.

o. Report on 2006/2007 Saturday School Program

(Mr. Duchon)

Jurupa Unified School District operated the Saturday School Program during the 2006/2007 school year at Rustic Lane and Van Buren Elementary Schools for elementary students and Jurupa Valley High School and the Learning Center for middle and high school students. Mira Loma Middle school students attended Mira Loma Middle School. Students were assigned Saturday School in lieu of suspension and were able to clear truancies and unexcused absences when they attended.

This year, Saturday School cleared 156 days for students who were assigned to Saturday School in lieu of suspension. The amount to be reimbursed to the District for 156 days x \$30.75 per ADA amounts to \$4,797.00. The ADA recovered by using Saturday School for truancies and unexcused absences was 2,014 days x \$30.75 ADA, which amount to \$61,930.50. Information Only.

* 9. Approve Non-Routine Student Field Trip Request

Ms. Melva Morrison, teacher at Jurupa Valley High School, is requesting approval to travel to Ontario on Friday, September 7, 2007 through Saturday, September 8, 2007 with approximately twenty-six (26) students. The purpose of this trip is for the Chamber Singers to rehearse in sectionals and full group, choose student leaders, work on building relationships and get a head start on their performance season, which begins early in the school year. Costs for the trip will be paid through donations. Transportation will be by district vehicle; supervision will be by staff members and parent volunteers and lodging and accommodations will be Ayres Inn and local restaurants. Administration has been assured that no student will be denied an opportunity to participate in this activity due to the lack of funds. A copy of the Non-Routine Student Field Trip Request is included in the supporting documents.

It is recommended that the Board approve the Non-Routine Student Field Trip Request from Ms. Morrison to travel to Ontario with approximately twenty-six (26) Jurupa Valley High School students on Friday, September 7, 2007 through Saturday, September 8, 2007.

*10. Approve 2007-2008 Discipline Committee (Mr. Duchon)
Under the authority of Education Code 48918(d), the Board annually appoints a pool of
active and retired certificated personnel to serve on administrative hearing panels to
conduct expulsion and admission hearings and recommend disciplinary action to the
Board. New panel members are continually needed to keep up with the high volume of
hearings. The 2007-2008 Discipline Committee roster is included in the supporting
documents; new member names have been highlighted.

Administration recommends approval of the 2007-2008 Discipline Committee.

B. <u>Approve Revision of Site Grant Expenditure Plan for Indian Hills Elementary School</u>
(Mrs. Lauzon - 2 minutes)

Indian Hills Elementary School is requesting to revise their 2000-2001 SB1564 and Governor's Award Site Grant to spend the remaining budget balance, \$97.68, on ink cartridges or other necessary materials and supplies. This expenditure revision has been approved by their School Site Council.

Administration recommends approval of the revised Site Grant Expenditure Plan for Indian Hills Elementary School.

C. <u>Approve Purchase of Wrestling Mat for Patriot High School</u> (Mrs. Lauzon - 2 minutes)

Patriot High School is requesting approval to purchase one (1) 42' x 42' wrestling mat for use by its athletes in the upcoming school year. Three quotes were received as follows (includes tax and shipping):

Ken's Sporting Goods\$13,244.55Gopher Sport\$13,842.78BSN Sports\$17,526.83

These items will be purchased from the Measure C and State School Building Funds. Board policy requires purchases in excess of \$12,000.00 be presented to the Board for approval.

Administration recommends the Board approve the purchase of one wrestling mat for Patriot High School from Ken's Sporting Goods in the amount of \$13,244.55 (includes tax and shipping).

* D. Approve Purchase of Choir Robes for Patriot High School (Mrs. Lauzon – 2 minutes)

Patriot High School is requesting approval to purchase one hundred and fifty (150) choir robes for use by its students in the upcoming school year. These robes will replace ones that have served Rubidoux High School students for approximately twenty years. The robes selected were chosen to be identical to those used by Rubidoux High School in all aspects, except for the school letters. These robes will be purchased (and are only available) direct from the manufacturer. A copy of the sole source letter is included in the supporting documents. Pricing is as follows (includes tax and shipping):

Collegiate Apparel \$28,441.48

These items will be purchased from the one-time Art, Music and PE Grant. Board policy requires purchases in excess of \$12,000.00 be presented to the Board for approval.

Administration recommends the Board approve the purchase of 150 choir robes for Patriot High School from Collegiate Apparel in the amount of \$28,441.48 (includes tax and shipping).

* E. <u>Approve Purchase of Musician Chairs and Choral Shell for Rubidoux High School</u> (Mrs. Lauzon – 2 minutes)

Rubidoux High School is requesting approval to purchase one hundred and fifty (150) musician chairs and seven (7) sections of acoustical shell for use by its students in the upcoming school year. The chairs and shell were selected to match exactly those in use at Jurupa Valley High School and Patriot High School. These items will be purchased (and are only available) direct from the manufacturer, Wenger Corporation. A copy of the sole source letter is included in the documents. Pricing is as follows (includes tax and shipping):

* E. <u>Approve Purchase of Musician Chairs and Choral Shell for Rubidoux High School</u> (continued)

Wenger Corporation \$42,762.89

These items will be purchased from State School Building and Measure C Funds. Board policy requires purchases in excess of \$12,000.00 be presented to the Board for approval.

Administration recommends the Board approve the purchase of 150 musician chairs and 7 sections of acoustical shell for Rubidoux High School from Wenger Corporation in the amount of \$42,762.89 (includes tax and shipping).

* F. Adopt Resolution #2008/10, Authorization to Conduct Surplus Sale

(Mrs. Lauzon - 2 minutes)

Throughout the year, the warehouse accumulates surplus items throughout the District that are old, obsolete, non-repairable or uneconomical to repair. A list of such items is included in the supporting documents.

Education Code Section 17545 states that the governing board of any school district may sell for cash any personal property belonging to the district if the property is not required for school purposes, or if it should be disposed of for the purpose of replacement, or if it is unsatisfactory or not suitable for school use. The board shall sell the property to the highest responsible bidder. Education Code Section 17546(a) allows that items, whether one or more, which do not exceed a value of \$2,500 may be sold at private sale without advertising. Section 17546(b) allows that any items having previously been offered for sale pursuant to Section 17545, for which no qualified bid was received, may be sold at private sale without advertising; and Section 17546(c) allows that property of insufficient value to defray the cost of arranging for a sale may be either donated to a charitable organization or disposed of in the local public dump.

The list of items included in the supporting documents exceeds \$2,500 in value.

Administration recommends the Board adopt Resolution #2008/10, Authorization to Conduct Surplus Sale. Administration further recommends that the Board direct the Director of Centralized Support Services to dispose of the unsold items pursuant to Education Code Section 17546 either by private sale, donation to a charitable organization or disposed of in the local public dump.

* G. Adopt Resolution No. 2008/11, Authorizing the Temporary Transfer of Funds from the General Fund to the Child Development Fund for the 2007/08 School Year

(Mrs. Lauzon - 2 minutes)

Many categorical programs do not receive their funding up front. State Preschool is one of the programs funded after expenses are incurred. This causes a cash flow problem because there are no other resources in this fund to help out with the ongoing expenses of the program. Education Code 42603 allows the Board of Education to direct monies held in any fund or account to be temporarily transferred to another fund or account of the District for payment of obligations. This resolution would allow the transfer of an amount not to exceed \$200,000 from the District's General Fund (Fund 03) to the Child Development Fund (Fund 12), if necessary. A copy of the resolution is included in the supporting documents.

Administration recommends the adoption of Resolution #2008/11, Authorizing the Temporary Transfer of Funds from the General Fund to the Child Development Fund for the 2007/08 school year.

* H. <u>Approve Resolution No. 2008/12, Emergency Renovation of Rubidoux High School Swimming Pool</u> (Mrs. Lauzon – 2 minutes)

In April 2007, CIF notified the district that the Rubidoux High School swimming pool did not meet the minimum depth requirements as outlined in the National Federation of State High School Association (NFHS) Swimming and Diving Rules Book. The rule book states that the minimum water depth from the point of entry must be 4 feet or more. Currently, the pool cannot be used for swim practice or for competition meets. Upon notification by CIF that the pool did not meet the 4' depth requirements, the Maintenance and Operations Department immediately took action to remove the starting blocks/diving platforms.

Public Contract Code 20113 states the district may enter into a contract for the performance of work without advertising for bids in an emergency to permit classes to continue and to avoid danger to life or property. Although Staff did not advertise for bids, three quotes were received for the emergency pool renovation. The quotes will be available for review by the Board.

Staff is requesting permission from the Board to waive Public Contract Code Sections 20110 *et seq* and to award a contract without advertising for bids. It is estimated that the pool renovation will cost \$571,000.00 and will be completed by April 2007.

The renovation costs will be paid out of Developer Fee funds.

Administration recommends the Board approve Resolution No. 2008/12, Emergency Renovation of Rubidoux High School Swimming Pool.

*I. Adopt Resolution #2008/13, Union Pacific Railroad Auto Facility Rail Yard Gate Closure (Mr. Duchon - 5 minutes)

At the July 2nd Board of Education meeting, Mr. Rodriguez requested that the Board consider passing a resolution requesting the closure of the south gate of the Mira Loma Union Pacific Railroad Auto Facility on Galleano-Cantu Ranch Road in order to reduce the health risks associated with exposure to diesel exhaust to students at Jurupa Valley High School. The Center for Community Action and Environmental Justice (CCAEJ) and residents in the area of Jurupa Valley High School have prepared a resolution requesting the closure of the south gate. A copy of the resolution is included in the supporting documents.

Following discussion, the Board may wish to adopt Resolution #2008/13, Union Pacific Railroad Auto Facility Rail Yard Gate Closure.

J. Consider Raising GPA Eligibility Requirements for Student Athletes

(Mr. Duchon – 10 minutes)

At the August 6th Board of Education meeting, Brian Schafer, community member, requested that an agenda item be placed on the September 4th agenda requesting the Board consider raising GPA eligibility requirements for student athletes. Mr. Schafer asked that the new GPA requirements include the following:

- Athletes must maintain a 2.0 GPA in all core subjects.
- Electives may not be considered in the overall GPA.
- Athletes at risk of not attaining a 2.0 GPA in their core subjects are to be provided a program/academic coach to assist them with their academic studies so they may attain a 2.0 GPA in core subjects.
- No probationary period.
- Grade checks will be closely monitored by coaches.
- Policy must be strictly enforced.
- Any person intimidating a teacher to falsely report grades shall be charged under California law for intimidation.
- Policy to become effective upon approval by Board of Education.

The Board may wish to discuss this item or defer discussion and/or action until the Ad Hoc Committee on athlete eligibility reports back to the Board in the fall.

Approve Submittal of the Teacher Recruitment and Retention Program Grant (Mrs. Elzig) The Teacher Recruitment and Retention Program Grant was authorized under Assembly Bill 146 in the Budget Act of 2005. The grant provides funding for improving student learning in low-performing schools. The District received this grant last year and was recently notified that we are eligible again this year. District staff has prepared the grant application, which includes a summary of activities focused on recruitment and retention of highly qualified teachers and principals, and incentives to support student achievement. The grant application is included in the supporting documents.

Administration recommends approval of the Teacher Recruitment and Retention Program Grant Application.

3. Approve Variable Term Waiver Request
Any individual hired to teach under the authorization of a Variable Term Waiver (Title V, Section 80122), must have specific individual approval by the governing board. Usually, this type of waiver is necessary for hard-to-fill positions in shortage areas (examples: Special Education, Bilingual Education, Mathematics or Science) or when an unexpected vacancy occurs in the middle of a school year. In this case, the recommendation is to fill a vacancy for a Speech and Language Pathologist. The person being recommended is Ms. Susan Franck. Ms. Franck earned her bachelor's degree in Communication Disorders, Cum Laude and has been working on her professional preparation program at California State University Northridge for Speech Language Pathologist. Ms. Franck is a former Speech and Language Pathology Assistant for Jurupa USD.

With these considerations in mind, it is recommended that Ms. Susan Franck be approved for temporary employment through the end of this school year as a Speech and Language Pathologist under the authorization of a Variable Term Waiver.

Duties of the Directors-at-Large

Directors-at-Large serve as an effective two-way communication link between the CSBA Board of Directors and representative board members by:

- Serving as Chair of the Student Issues conference groups which were created to address issues related, but not limited to American Indian, Asian/Pacific Islander, Black, and Hispanic students, and county boards.
- Gathering input and information on significant emerging issues from representative board members and communicating the issues/data to CSBA for effective response and/or assistance;
- Supporting and articulating CSBA activities and positions to representative board members;
- Promoting the Association, its services and events to representative board members, encouraging membership and participation;
- Serving as an advocate for public education;
- Encouraging communication and participation between representative board members throughout the state; and
- Communicating directly with representative board members (via letters, meetings, county trustee association events, articles in regional newsletters, visits to board meetings and/or other means as appropriate).

ROLE OF THE BOARD (POWERS AND RESPONSIBILITIES)

The Governing Board is elected by the community to provide leadership and citizen oversight of the district's schools. The Board shall work with the Superintendent to fulfill its major roles, which include:

- 1. Establishing a long-term mission for the district
- Establishing and maintaining an organizational structure for the district, including employment of the Superintendent and adoption of policies, curriculum, the budget and the collective bargaining agreement
- Ensuring accountability to the local community, including personnel, programmatic and fiscal accountability and service as a judicial and appeals body as needed
- 4. Providing community leadership and advocacy at the local, state and national levels on behalf of children, district programs and public education

The Board is authorized to establish and finance any program or activity that is not in conflict with, inconsistent with, or preempted by law. (Education Code 35160)

The Board may delegate any of its duties to the Superintendent or designee but shall be ultimately responsible for the performance of any duties it delegates. (Education Code 35161)

Mission

The Board shall set the direction for the district by adopting a mission statement which defines the district's goals and priorities. The Board shall carry out its mission setting role by identifying the strengths and needs of the district, developing and adopting a process for framing the mission statement, soliciting staff and community input as appropriate, ensuring that the adopted mission statement is implemented, and conducting its periodic review.

Superintendent Employment and Evaluation

The Board shall be solely responsible for employing the Superintendent, who shall be chief executive to the Board, and ensuring that he/she is the best match for the district based on needed abilities, traits and level of knowledge. When selecting a new superintendent, the Board shall ensure a smooth transition period; evaluate the district's current and long-term needs; plan and conduct a process for recruitment, screening and selection; and approve the Superintendent's employment contract. The Board shall regularly evaluate the Superintendent based on an evaluation system and performance objectives established by the Board and Superintendent.



General Hiring and Personnel Accountability

The Board shall adopt wage and salary schedules, and elect or reject employees at the recommendation of the Superintendent or designee. In order to have the best qualified people working at their maximum effectiveness, the Board shall hold the Superintendent responsible for overseeing the district's personnel system, developing effective hiring practices, creating a climate supportive of personnel and providing an effective framework for staff accountability.

Policy Adoption and Monitoring

The Board shall govern the schools by adopting policies and regulations that reflect the district's mission and the mandates of law. The Board shall establish a clear policy development process through which it may deliberate on issues, identify priorities, assign responsibilities, identify goals and courses of action and review policy decisions.

Curriculum Adoption and Program Accountability

While the design and implementation of curriculum is primarily a staff responsibility, the Board's role is to adopt overall educational goals and standards, define the curriculum development process, specify graduation requirements, adopt the developed curriculum and ensure compliance with state and federal laws.

To ensure accountability to the community, the Board shall establish measurable benchmarks to assess the effectiveness of the district's educational programs in producing desired student achievement results.

Budget, Facilities and Fiscal Accountability

The Board shall adopt a sound, responsible budget that supports district goals and priorities. To guide the Superintendent or designee in development of the budget, the Board shall establish a budget calendar, budget process and spending priorities.

Recognizing that school facilities are a long-term obligation that impacts district budgets, the Board shall also ensure that a plan is in place to address the district's facility needs, including the funding, construction and maintenance of school facilities. The Board shall approve facility sites, funding sources and architectural and construction contracts.

The Board recognizes that it is accountable to the community for its budget and facilities decisions and for the district's fiscal integrity. The Board shall use appropriate accountability systems and processes in order to monitor the district's fiscal health.

Collective Bargaining

The Board is the legal representative of the district in negotiations with employee representatives. In carrying out the collective bargaining process, the Board shall set goals and guidelines for collective bargaining,



maintain communications throughout the process and approve the negotiated contract.

Judicial and Appeals Body

In addition to establishing complaint procedures that ensure due process and facilitate the satisfactory resolution of issues, the Board may convene to serve as a judicial and appeals body in accordance with the law, Board policies and negotiated agreements. The Board may delegate fact-finding or hearing responsibilities in appropriate cases but remains the final decision-maker in these proceedings.

Community Leadership

The Board shall build and maintain community awareness and support by actively involving parents/guardians, business and other community members in the schools and informing them about district programs, policies and issues.

Recognizing that the level of local, state and national support for education impacts the Board's ability to fulfill its responsibilities, the Board shall engage in advocacy on behalf of district schools.

The Board shall ensure that the district has the capability to respond to emerging issues and a proactive communications plan for issues that are district priorities.

Whereas, staff of the Jurupa Unified School District have received three competitive quotes for the pool renovation and;

Whereas, in order to permit the continuance of classes and in order to avoid danger to life or property the district must renovate the Rubidoux High School pool and;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND DECLARE AS FOLLOWS:

The Jurupa Unified School District, by unanimous vote, declares the work to renovate the Rubidoux High School pool an emergency in order to permit the continuance of classes and to avoid danger to life or property.

Resolution #2008/13 Union Pacific Auto Facility Rail Yard Gate Closure

- WHEREAS, the Union Pacific Auto Facility Rail Yard in which diesel trucks and locomotives operate is a known source of substantial diesel emissions and other toxic air contaminants; and
- WHEREAS, railroad locomotives and trucks are classified as mobile sources of pollution known to emit diesel emissions with toxic air contaminants; and
- WHEREAS, the South Coast Air Quality Management District has found that diesel emissions a known carcinogen are responsible for 70 percent of the cancer risk from air pollution in the South Coast Air Basin; and
- WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency lists diesel exhaust as a toxic air contaminant containing 40 known cancer causing substances; and
- WHEREAS, the South Coast Air Basin is classified as a non-attainment area for failing to meet both the federal ambient air quality eight-hour ozone standard and exceeding the Clean Air Act pollution levels; and
- WHEREAS, emissions from mobile sources contribute to preventing California from achieving these state and federal clean air standards; and
- WHEREAS, recent University of Southern California studies show that children who are exposed to higher levels of mobile source pollution have significant stunted lung development resulting in reduced lung function, with children in the Mira Loma area having the most significant reductions; and
- WHEREAS, the Kaiser Permanente Foundation Hospital Study in the Inland Valleys found a sharp increase in hospitalizations for asthma, chronic obstructive lung disease and pneumonia. Also increased were cardiac problems and death during high pollution days; and
- WHEREAS, proximity to the diesel emission source determines the level of risk to public health studies from the South Coast Air Quality Management District show an increased concentration of diesel emissions within the first 1500 feet from the source result in higher levels of health risks; and
- WHEREAS, the Jurupa Valley High School athletic field is less than 1,500 feet from the Union Pacific Auto Facility and students "who during seasonal sports" use the athletic field on a daily basis and also attend school on a daily basis are being exposed to excessive concentrations of toxic diesel pollution; and



WHEREAS, the residents of Mira Loma and surrounding communities have asked Union Pacific Railroad to close the gate on Galena Street and use the Etiwanda/Harrel Street entrance to the facility. For four years community residents have tried to get the Galena gate closed. Residents have met with Union Pacific representatives as well as state EPA officials without success or a resolution; and

WHEREAS, the recent health risk assessment at the Mira Loma Union Pacific Railroad Auto Facility located next door to Jurupa Valley High School show a significant cancer risk of 1250 to 1 million that students at JVHS and the community are exposed to; and

WHEREAS, the closure of the Galleano-Cantu Ranch Road gate (previously known as Galena) must be part of the mitigation process to lower the health risks to our most vulnerable population, the high school students;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, The Jurupa Unified School District joins with local residents to request the closure of the south gate of the Mira Loma Union Pacific Railroad Auto Facility on Galleano-Cantu Ranch Road (aka Galena) in order to reduce the health risks associated with exposure to diesel exhaust to students at the Jurupa Valley High School.

Recruit, Retain and Support Highly Qualified Teachers

Background/Needs Assessment

Overall teacher retention rates have historically been high in the District. We currently have a number of effective programs in place that have encouraged and supported new teachers who are not fully-credentialed. Despite these efforts, challenges still exist in staffing math, science, and some special education positions with highly qualified, fully-credentialed teachers. There is a need to increase the number of highly qualified teachers by June of 2007. This priority will extend to increasing the number of fully-credentialed teachers assigned to low-performing schools.



Recommended Activities

- 1. Support teachers in meeting the highly qualified criteria of NCLB through reimbursement of select coursework connected to test preparation and testing costs.
- 2. Provide a signing bonus of \$2,000 to highly qualified, fully-credentialed teachers hired to teach English, math, science, or special education in a low-performing (decile 1-3) school during the 2007-2008 school year. The signing bonus will be disbursed after the first contracted month of service. It is anticipated that approximately 30 teachers will qualify for this bonus.
- 3. Provide a signing bonus of \$1,000 to highly qualified, fully credentialed teachers hired to teach in a low-performing (decile 1-3) school during the 2007-2008 school year. The signing bonus will be disbursed after the first contracted month of service. It is anticipated that approximately 30 teachers will qualify for this bonus
- 4. Provide a stipend of \$2,000 for teachers who receive National Board Certification and teach in low-performing school. It is anticipated that approximately 10 teachers will qualify for this bonus.

Recruit, Retain, and Support Highly Skilled Principals

Background/Needs Assessment

In the past few years, we have experienced a high turn-over rate in school principals. Specifically, 14 of our 23, or 60% of our current principals, have served in the position for less than five years. There is a need to support new administrators and encourage highly skilled administrators to work in low-performing (decile 1-3) schools. There is a continuing need to recruit highly skilled principals.

Recommended Activities

- 1. Provide a signing bonus of \$3,500 to highly skilled principals hired to serve in a low-performing (decile 1-3) school during the 2007-2008 school year. The signing bonus will be disbursed after the first contracted month of service.
- 2. Provide a transfer bonus of \$3,500 to highly skilled principals transferred to low-performing (decile 1-3) schools to serve during the 2007-2008 school year.
- 3. Provide a \$3,000 stipend to principals assigned to low-performing (decile 1-3) schools if the school moves out of decile 1-3 by June of 2007.
- 4. Provide a \$3,000 stipend to veteran principals selected to mentor/coach new principals during the 2007-2008 school year.

School-Wide Incentive for Low-Performing Schools

Background/Needs Assessment

Collaboration between teachers, support staff and the principals is closely linked to meeting achievement goals. In addition, it is important to include parents and



students in our focus on student achievement. We believe the concept of a school-wide incentive benefits all stakeholders in the school community.

Recommended Activities

- 1. School sites in deciles 1-3 would receive a school-wide incentive of \$3,000 for accomplishing one or more of the following criteria:
 - ▶ Movement out of Decile 1-3
 - ▶ Meeting yearly API/AYP targets
 - ▶ Increase Similar School Ranking

Principals would meet with the School Site Councils at each site to decide how to use the incentive and observe all legal/compliance guidelines.

Professional Development and Activities to Increase Collaboration and Improve Student Academic Outcomes.

Background/Needs Assessment

Principals meet at varying times through the year for professional development. Each school site in our district provides release time for collaboration for all teachers. There is a need to set aside time before the 2007-2008 school year begins for a retreat/staff development for principals.

Recommended Activities

- 1. Site and District administrators will meet for a two days inservice training in the fall of 2008. The purpose of this staff development will be to increase collaboration by:
 - a. Sharing "best practices"
 - b. Reviewing student work
 - c. Analyzing and comparing testing data
 - d. Reviewing teacher observations and the new "walk about" technology

In addition, consultants will present staff development to enhance collaboration and teamwork and improve student achievement.



Please find herewith a schedule for the renovation of the above referenced pool. It should be ready for use in early January. A budget for the cost to renovate the pool, about \$360,000 – you should note that I was unable to get a call back from a fiberglass company so I am removing the existing waterproofer and replacing it with plaster. Secondly all of the plping is being replaced based on the inadequacy of the existing system. Parts of the deck are also to be removed and replaced to allow for access to the pool plping. I have also attached a quick engineering hydraulics estimate so that I could determine the cost of equipment such as pumps and filters. Please call with any questions.
