SUBJECT: Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures

Types of Complaints

The district shall use the following procedures to investigate and resolve complaints when the complainant alleges that any of the following has occurred:

- 1 Textbooks and instructional materials
 - a. A student, including an English learner, does not have standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials or state- or district-adopted textbooks or other required instructional materials to use in class.
 - b. A student does not have access to textbooks or instructional materials to use at home or after school.
 - c. Textbooks or instructional materials are in poor or unusable condition, have missing pages, or are unreadable due to damage.
- 2. Teacher vacancy or misassignment
 - a. A semester begins and a teacher vacancy exists.
 - b. A teacher who lacks credentials or training to teach English learners is assigned to teach a class with more than 20 percent English learner students in the class.
 - c. A teacher is assigned to teach a class for which the teacher lacks subject matter competency.

Vacancy means a position to which a single designated certificated employee has not been assigned at the beginning of the year for an entire year or, if the position is for a one-semester course, a position to which a single designated certificated employee has not been assigned at the beginning of the semester for an entire semester.

Beginning of the year or semester means the first day classes necessary to serve all the students enrolled are established with a single designated certificated employee assigned for the duration of the class, but not later than 20 working days after the first day students attend classes for that semester.

Misassignment means the placement of a certificated employee in a teaching or services position for which the employee does not hold a legally recognized certificate or credential or the placement of a certificated employee in a teaching or services position that the employee is not otherwise authorized by statute to hold.

Forms and Notices

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the district's complaint form contains a space to indicate whether the complainant desires a response to his/her complaint and specifies the location for filing a complaint. A complainant may add as much text to explain the complaint as he/she wishes.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that a notice is posted in each classroom in each school containing the components specified in Education Code 35186.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

For the fifteenth year, the Jurupa Unified School District is implementing its open enrollment policy for schools within the district. Our sixteen elementary, three middle schools, and three comprehensive high schools offer a variety of programs designed to meet the needs of children and their families. There are situations which make it desirable for a family to select a school outside of the attendance area designated for their residence. As such, we offer this transfer opportunity through the Open Enrollment process.

Although we are experiencing enrollment growth at most of our schools, once again this year parents may choose to have their child(ren) attend a school other than the school of residence, provided there is space. After reviewing data on projected enrollment for the new school year, the District staff determines how many transfer spaces are available at each school. You may find that some schools are unable to accommodate new students because of student growth; others have a few spaces, while others can accommodate a number of transfer requests. If there are more requests for transfers to a particular school than available spaces, district policy requires the use of a random selection procedure.

If you wish to have your child continue to attend the school serving your residence, you do not need to notify the school. Students currently attending a school on an open enrollment transfer need not complete a new application for the 2008-2009 school year unless they are moving up to the 7th or 9th grade, and the school of residence is different than the school which they wish to attend. If you wish your child to attend a school other than the one he/she is currently attending, please follow the instructions on page three.

Your involvement in your child's education is one of the most critical factors in his/her school success. I urge you to visit your child's school and talk to the staff; volunteer when you have time and join the PTA or other parent organization.

BEFORE YOU APPLY, PLEASE CONSIDER:

Parents who wish incoming kindergartners to attend the same transfer school as other siblings must apply for a transfer.

New 7th and 9th graders who wish to attend a school other than the school of residence must apply for a transfer.

If you are anticipating a move which will change your school of residence, and you wish your child to remain at the present school, you must apply for a transfer.

Secondary students may receive transfers during Open Enrollment; however, it is difficult to obtain a transfer in September because of schedules, and possible credit loss.

MEETING RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS: (Education Code 48204)

Students shall have complied with the residency requirements for school attendance provided he or she:

- a. is living with a parent/guardian or caregiver within the district, or
- b. is an emancipated minor living in the district, or
- c. is living in a licensed foster home, family home, state hospital, or licensed children's institution within the district, or
- d. is granted an interdistrict transfer based on the parent/guardian being employed within the boundaries of the school district.

Program Options in the District:

A variety of programs are available in the Jurupa Unified School District. A description of each program is provided below. The directory pages that follow, list which programs are offered at each school site.

<u>Special Education</u> – Language and speech services and some specialized academic instruction are available at each school for students with exceptional needs. Enrollment in these classes will be based on the student's Individualized Education Program plan and space availability.

School Improvement – This state-funded program supports and guides schoolwide improvements to help meet the needs of all students and is offered at all elementary and middle schools.

<u>Title I/EIA</u> – These state and federally-funded programs serve grades kindergarten through eighth for students who need additional academic support in the areas of reading, language, or math and are available at specific schools.

<u>Structured English Immersion Program</u> – English language learners (ELL) receive direct instruction and materials in a Structured English Immersion Program that includes content-based English Language Development (ELD). This English language development is given primary language support by authorized teachers and/or tutors.

English Language Mainstream (ELM) – Provides instruction in English only, and is based on grade-level state standards. Students continue to receive additional and appropriate instruction in order to meet the requirements to be reclassified as fluent English proficient (FEP). This program is recommended for all English Language learners whose overall English proficiency level is Early Advanced or Advanced.

Alternative Bilingual Program (ALT) – A bilingual program for English language acquisition for pupils in which much or all of the instruction, textbooks, and teaching materials are in the child's native language. There must be 20 students per grade level, per school in order to comply with this request. Parents have the right to request a Parent Exception Waiver for the Alternative Program and must visit the school site to make the request.

<u>Gifted and Talented Education (GATE)</u> – This program serves eligible students in grades kindergarten through twelve at each school, who have been identified as gifted and talented.

 $\underline{\text{Title IV}}$ - These federal funds assist each school (K-12) to provide prevention of drug, alcohol, and tobacco use, early intervention, referral or rehabilitation as necessary.

<u>Title VI</u> Innovative– These federal funds assist the school in purchasing library books and instructional materials and also provide counseling through the Carolyn E. Wylie Center at the middle schools and high schools. Crisis counseling, classroom presentations, and conflict management is available to students one day a week.

<u>Class-Size Reduction</u> – This state program for grades K-3 allows all elementary school to reduce class size to 20 pupils per classroom.

Instrumental Music/Elementary - Three instrumental music teachers provide band instruction at each elementary school, each week.

10th Grade Counseling – This state program provides funds to assist in providing counseling and guidance services to high school students.

Academy of Language & Culture – Students in the newcomer's program receive intensive English Language Development instruction, academic instruction in their primary language, and they learn about a new culture, while continuing to value their own. The program is designed for students to participate in it for a maximum of two years.

Dual Language Immersion – This is a unique educational program designed to develop bilingualism and biliteracy in English and Spanish.

Resolution #2008/23 Yellow Ribbon Week - Violence Prevention and Awareness January 21-25, 2008

WHEREAS, Jurupa Unified School District celebrates January 21-25, 2008 as Yellow Ribbon Week for Youth Violence Prevention and Awareness; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of Yellow Ribbon Week is for students, parents, teachers, other school personnel, and community members to demonstrate their commitment to safe schools and is in recognition of pupils who have lost their lives as a result of school violence; and

WHEREAS, Yellow Ribbon Week allows schools/districts to highlight the importance of safe school environments and to recognize the value of conflict resolution, acceptance of diversity, youth engagement, and family involvement as a strategy for creating violence-free schools and communities; and

WHEREAS, violence remains the leading killer of youth in California; and

WHEREAS, according to the California Healthy Kids Survey for the 2006-2007 school year, 28% of Jurupa Unified School District secondary students have been harassed at school and 11% of 7th and 15% for 9th and 11th grade students report carrying a weapon on a school campus; and

WHEREAS, in 2006-2007, only 22% of 7th grade students, 14% of 9th grade students and 13% of 11th grade students in Jurupa Unified School District reported feeling very safe at school; and

WHEREAS, despite high profile tragedies that have recently occurred on campuses across the nation, our schools continue to be among the safest places for our children and youth; and

WHEREAS, the Riverside County Board of Education continues to implement violence prevention programs and activities that support school districts under the provisions of the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act (Title IV), and AB 1113 School Safety and Violence Prevention Act;

WHEREAS, Connect to Achieve supports the implementation of an asset-building framework that combines school safety and academic achievement to address barriers to learning, and

WHEREAS, the Yellow Ribbon Week celebration provides schools and communities with an opportunity to show their dedication to education and safe school efforts; and

WHEREAS, we support "Search Institute's 40 Developmental Assets" and "Too Good for Drugs and Too Good for Violence" as a conceptual framework for promoting healthy children and adolescents; and



WHEREAS, one category of these assets, i.e., Social Competencies, encourages positive characteristics in youth in the following areas: planning and decision making, interpersonal competence, resistance skills and peaceful conflict resolution; and

WHEREAS, research shows that "as assets rise in number, decreases occur in many high-risk behavior patterns"; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jurupa Unified School District Board of Education does hereby support January 21-25, 2008 as Yellow Ribbon Week-Violence Prevention and Awareness and encourages all schools, community businesses and organizations to wear yellow ribbons and/or promote programs and activities that develop positive leadership and pro-social behavior among youth, making a visible statement and commitment to healthy, safe schools and communities in which to raise healthy children and youth.

Limits of Board Members Authority

The Governing Board is the unit of authority over the district. It has broad but clearly limited powers. The exercise of its authority is restricted to the functions required or permitted by law, and then only when it acts in a legally constituted meeting.

The Board member has no individual authority. Individually, the Board member may not commit the district to any policy, act or expenditure. The Board member cannot do business with the district served, nor should the Board member have an interest in any contract with the school district. The Board member represents and acts for the community as a whole and does not represent any factional segment of the community.

Individual members of the Board, by virtue of holding office, shall not exercise any administrative responsibility with respect to the schools or command the services of any school employee. Individual Board members shall submit requests for information to the Superintendent. At his/her discretion, the Superintendent may refer the request to the entire Board for consideration. If approved, the Superintendent or designee shall perform any necessary research associated with the request and report to the Board at a future meeting.

Obligations of Board Members

Board members should hold the education of children and youth above any partisan principle, group interest, or personal interest.

Board members should understand their role and the programs offered by the district. They should study all agenda materials before the meeting, participate in the discussion of items which come before the Board, vote on motions and resolutions, and abstain only for compelling reasons.

Board members shall refer Board-related correspondence to the Superintendent or designee for forwarding to the Board or for placement on the Board's agenda.

Board members and persons elected to the Board are responsible for complying with the requirements of the state's open meeting laws prior to and after assuming office.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide a copy of the Brown Act to each Board member and to anyone who is elected to the Board.

This item will provide an opportunity for citizens to make suggestions or identify concerns about matters affecting the school district. Topics raised under this item may, at the direction of the Board, be included as separate items in future agendas.

Any member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent with supporting documents and information, if any, at least thirteen days before the scheduled meeting date. The Superintendent or designee shall decide whether a request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and whether an item is appropriate for discussion in open or closed session.

Any Board member may submit an item for the Board agenda any time before the agenda is posted. Items submitted less than thirteen days before the scheduled meeting date may be postponed to a later meeting.

Any Board action that involves borrowing \$100,000 or more shall be discussed, considered and deliberated upon as a separate item of business on the meeting agenda. (Government Code 53635.7)

All public communications with the Board are subject to requirements of relevant Board policies and administrative regulations.

Consent Items

In order to promote efficient meetings, the Board may act upon more than one item by a single vote through the use of a consent agenda. Consent items are items of a routine nature or items for which no Board discussion is anticipated and for which the Superintendent recommends approval.

In accordance with law, the public has a right to comment on any consent item. At the request of any member of the Board, any item on the consent agenda shall be removed and given individual consideration for action as a regular agenda item.

Board Member Preparation

A copy of the agenda shall be forwarded to each Board member at least three days before each regular meeting, together with minutes to be approved, copies of communications, reports from committees, staff, citizens and others, and other available documents pertinent to the meeting. The agenda will be posted in a public place at least 72 hours before each meeting.

Each Regular Meeting Agenda will include in the Communication Session an item entitled Public Verbal Comments. This item will provide an opportunity for citizens to make suggestions or identify concerns about matters affecting the school district. Topics raised under this item may, at the direction of the Board, be included as separate items in future agendas.

***Note: AB 3035 (Ch. 300, Statutes of 2002) amended Government Code 54954.2 to require that the agenda include information regarding how, when and to whom a person may request a disability-related accommodation or modification in order to participate in the meeting. See BB 9320 - Meetings and Notices. ***

Note: The following paragraph should be modified to reflect district practice as to when and to whom such a request should be made.


The agenda shall specify that an individual who requires disability-related accommodations or modifications including auxiliary aids and services in order to participate in the Board meeting should contact the Superintendent or designee in writing.

Agenda Preparation

***Note: Education Code 35145.5 mandates the Board to adopt reasonable regulations which ensure that members of the public can place matters directly related to school district business on the agenda of Board meetings. ***

Note: The following section, including the timelines, should be revised to reflect district practice. Districts are free to establish their own timelines for placing an item on the agenda, taking into account staff time and resources, as long as the established timeline is a reasonable one.

The Superintendent, as Secretary to the Board, in consultation with the Board president,





shall prepare the agenda for each regular and special meeting.

(cf. 9121 - President) (cf. 9122 - Secretary)

Any member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent with supporting documents and information, if any, at least thirteen days before the scheduled meeting date. The Superintendent or designee shall decide whether a request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and whether an item is appropriate for discussion in open or closed session.

Any Board member may submit an item for the Board agenda any time before the agenda is posted. Items submitted less than thirteen days before the scheduled meeting date may be postponed to a later meeting.

All such items submitted by either a Board member or member of the public shall be placed on the Board Agenda for discussion. If the Board deems that it would like to consider the item for action, it shall be placed on a future agenda as an action item.

The Board president and Superintendent shall decide whether a request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. Items not within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board may not be placed on the agenda. In addition, the Board president and Superintendent shall determine if the item is merely a request for information or whether the issue is covered by an existing policy or administrative regulation before placing the item on the agenda.

The Board president and Superintendent shall decide whether an agenda item is appropriate for discussion in open or closed session, and whether the item should be an action item, informational item or consent item.

Note: The following section, including the timelines, are CSBA suggested language, as per Government Code 54954.2.

When an item properly posted for a regular meeting is continued to a subsequent meeting, it may not be on the agenda of the subsequent meeting if the subsequent meeting occurs within five days. The Board shall publicly identify the item before discussing it. (Government Code 54954.2)

Any Board action that involves borrowing \$100,000 or more shall be discussed, considered and deliberated upon as a separate item of business on the meeting agenda. (Government Code 53635.7)

When special meetings are called, the Superintendent and president shall make every effort to distribute the agenda and support materials to Board members as soon as possible.

Board members shall review agenda materials before each meeting. Individual members may confer directly with the Superintendent or designee to request additional information on agenda items.

L Pa.5 ***Note: Pursuant to Government Code 54954.1, as amended by AB 3035 (Ch. 300, Statutes of 2002), upon request, the agenda and supporting documentation must be made available in appropriate alternative formats to persons with a disability, as required under the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 USC 12132). 

MEETING CONDUCT

Meeting Procedures

All Governing Board meetings shall begin on time and shall be guided by an agenda prepared and delivered in advance to all Board members and to other persons upon request.

Meetings of the Board of Education shall be conducted informally, and the President is privileged to vote on every motion and may make a motion should s/he desire. With this exception, the presiding officer may invoke Robert's Rule of Order.

Voting shall be by roll call only when a dissenting vote or abstention is voiced, or when it is legally required.

The Board believes that late night meetings deter public participation, can affect the Board's decision-making ability, and can be a burden to staff. At 11:00 p.m., the Board President shall announce the time. The President will then bring forth such agenda items that need immediate attention so as to complete all necessary business before 12:00 midnight, except in urgency instances where all Board members present agree to continue the meeting. Consideration of remaining agenda items will be deferred to the next regular Board meeting, an adjourned meeting or a special meeting.

Quorum

A majority of the number of filled positions on the Board constitutes a quorum. (Education Code 5095, 35165)

Unless otherwise provided by law, affirmative votes by a majority of all the membership of the Board are required to approve any action under consideration, regardless of the number of members present. (Education Code 35164)

Abstentions

The Board believes that when no conflict of interest requires abstention, its members have a duty to vote on issues before them. When a member abstains, his/her abstention shall be considered to concur with the action taken by the majority of those who vote, whether affirmatively or negatively.

Public Participation

In order to conduct district business in an orderly and efficient manner, the Board requires that public presentations to the Board comply with the following procedures:

1. The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board either before or during the Board's consideration of each item of



business to be discussed at regular or special meetings. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.3)

- 2. At a time so designated on the agenda, members of the public may bring before the Board, at a regular meeting, matters that are not listed on the agenda. The Board may refer such a matter to the Superintendent or designee or take it under advisement, but shall not take action at that time except as allowed by law. The matter may be placed on the agenda of a subsequent meeting for action or discussion by the Board. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.2)
- 3. Persons wishing to address the Board should complete and submit speaker request cards before the Board meeting begins.

The Board President may terminate public verbal comments when such comments become repetitious or when time is required by the Board for other business. To the extent time permits, the Board President will call on speakers who have completed cards requesting to be heard and will then determine whether to allow additional public comment time for other speakers. The President will determine when it is appropriate to defer comments about specific items on the agenda until the Board reaches those items.

Generally, speakers will be requested to limit their comments to five minutes. The Board Clerk will assist the President by monitoring each speaker's time.

- 4. A person wishing to be heard by the Board shall first be recognized by the president and shall then proceed to comment as briefly as the subject permits.
- 5. Without taking action, Board members or district staff members may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed by the public about items not appearing on the agenda. Additionally, on their own initiative or in response to questions posed by the public, a Board or staff member may ask a question for clarification, make a brief announcement, or make a brief report on his/her own activities. (Government Code 54954.2)

Furthermore, the Board or a Board member may provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, ask staff to report back to the Board at a subsequent meeting concerning any matter, or take action directing staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda. (Government Code 54954.2)

6. The Board president may rule on the appropriateness of a topic. If the topic would be more suitably addressed at a later time, the president may indicate the time and place when it should be presented.

The Board shall not prohibit public criticism of its policies, procedures, programs, services, acts or omissions. (Government Code 54954.3)

Whenever a member of the public initiates specific complaints or charges against an employee, the Board president shall inform the complainant of the Board's Public Complaint Procedure (Policy 1801), and request that the complainant utilize the process contained therein.

7. The Board president shall not permit any disturbance or willful interruption of Board meetings. Persistent disruption by an individual or group shall be grounds for the chair to terminate the privilege of addressing the Board. The Board may remove disruptive individuals and order the room cleared if necessary; in this case, members of the media not participating in the disturbance shall be allowed to remain, and individual(s) not participating in such disturbances may be allowed to remain at the discretion of the Board. When the room is ordered cleared due to a disturbance, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda. (Government Code 54957.9)

Recording by the Public

The Superintendent or designee shall designate locations from which members of the public may broadcast, photograph or tape record open meetings without causing a distraction.

If the Board finds that noise, illumination or obstruction of view related to these activities would persistently disrupt the proceedings, these activities shall be discontinued or restricted as determined by the Board. (Government Code 54953.5, 54953.6)

Smoking Prohibited

Smoking shall not be permitted in any meeting room or on the grounds of any school or facility of the School District during Board meetings or recesses.

The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board either before or during the public comments session of the meeting or just prior to the Board's consideration of each item of business to be discussed at regular or special meetings. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.3)
- 2. At a time so designated on the agenda, members of the public may bring before the Board, at a regular meeting, matters that are not listed on the agenda. The Board may refer such a matter to the Superintendent or designee or take it under advisement, but shall not take action at that time except as allowed by law. The matter may be placed on the agenda of a subsequent meeting for action or discussion by the Board. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.2)
- 3. Persons wishing to address the Board should complete and submit speaker request cards before the Board meeting begins. Members of the public shall not be required to place his or her name on such request.

The Board President may terminate public verbal comments when such comments become repetitious or when time is required by the Board for other business. To the extent time permits, the Board President will call on speakers who have completed cards requesting to be heard and will then determine whether to allow additional public comment time for other speakers.
