The pupil is assigned to Community Day School, operated at the District Learning Center. This case will be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before January 19, 2010; Discipline Case #09-228 for violation of Education Code Sections 48900 (a)(1), (g), (k) and 48915 (b), (e) for the Spring Semester 2009 and Fall Semester 2009. The pupil is assigned to Grindstaff Community School, operated by the Riverside County Office of Education. This case will be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before January 19, 2010; Discipline Case #09-230 for violation of Education Code Sections 48900 (f), (g), (k) and 48915 (e) for the Spring Semester 2009 and Fall Semester 2009. The pupil is assigned to West County Elementary School, operated by the Riverside County Office of Education. This case will be reviewed for possible readmission to the Jurupa Unified School District on or before January 19, 2010.

The pupil will be assigned to Community Day School, operated at the District
