- In honor of School Board Recognition Month, the Jurupa Unified School District recognized our Board of Education. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

- The California Department of Education notified the district that 2025-2026 funding for the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA) and the Title II of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) has been awarded in the amount of \$351,813.00.
- The California Department of Education recently notified the district that 2025-2026 funding for the Career Technical Education Incentive Grant (CTEIG) has been awarded in the amount of \$882,428.00.
- The District participated in the 2025 SAFER (Schools Association for Excess Risk) Cybersecurity Awareness Month campaign and was selected as a \$2,500.00 educational grant winner from Keenan & Associates. By participating in this campaign, the district not only enhanced its cybersecurity knowledge but also demonstrated a commitment to a safer digital environment for students and staff.
- The California Department of Education notified the district that 2025-2026 funding for the Agricultural Career Technical Education Incentive Grant has been awarded in the amount of \$28,715.23.
- The State Office of Public School Construction notified the district that additional funding for the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Program Grant for the Pedley Elementary TK/K Classroom Building Project has been awarded in the amount of \$4,620,503.00.
