## A Capsule of the Board's Deliberations and Actions October 7, 2019

### **MOMENT OF SILENCE**

A moment of silence was held for Mr. John Wheeler, retired administrator, who passed away on September 17<sup>th</sup>.

### **RECOGNITIONS**

1. The Board recognized Best of the Best recipients for August and September.
2. Mr. Doubravsky reported on the following grants received:
  - 21st Century Community Learning Centers Program, in the amount of \$282,150.00.
  - Adult Education and Family Literacy Act Grant, in the amount of \$140,595.00.
  - After School Education and Safety (ASES) Program, in the amount of \$2,225,579.87.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS**

1. Mrs. Ford reported that the District has been notified by the Riverside County Office of Education that the 2019/2020 LCAP and 2019/2020 adopted budget have been approved.
2. Mrs. Ford presented a summary of the 2019/2020 intradistrict and interdistrict transfer requests by school site.
3. Mr. Doubravsky presented an update on the 2018/2019 Saturday School enrichment program.
4. Mr. Brooks reported that the Tentative Agreement with CSEA Jurupa 392 for the 2019/2020 school year was publicized this evening and he reviewed highlights of the agreement.
5. Mr. Duchon presented information on nominations for the Riverside County Committee on School District Organization. The Board nominated Trustee Bradford for the 2nd Supervisorial District.

### **PERSONNEL MATTERS**

1. The Board ratified the Tentative Agreement between NEA-Jurupa and Jurupa Unified School District for the 2019/2020 school year.
2. The compensation package for Certificated Administrators, Classified Management, and Confidential Employees, including a 2% salary increase and a Health and Welfare contribution increase to \$11,500 for 2019/2020, was approved.
