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## ARTS

## Crafts and Design

Grades: 9-12
10 Credits
Year
Prerequisite: No prerequisites
This course is designed to develop student interest and understanding of many popular craft forms derived from cultures from around the world. It will introduce techniques, tools, and processes using the Elements and Principles of Design in the production of art that is both aesthetically pleasing and functional. A focus will be on learning about folk and craft arts from different time periods and cultures using a variety of media, including paper, fiber, metal, paint, and other materials. The course is aligned with the California Visual Arts Standards. Students will use creative problem-solving, and individual and group critiques with opportunities to describe, analyze, interpret, and judge their works of art.

## Agricultural Leadership

Grades: 11-12 10 Credits Year

5 Credits
Semester
