

Procedures to Apply for a Transfer

1. Intradistrict transfers are for students who reside within JUSD boundaries and are requesting to transfer to another available JUSD school. Intradistrict applications are only available via Parent Connect between **November 12, 2024 and January 17, 2025**.
Interdistrict transfers are for students who reside within JUSD boundaries and are requesting to enroll in another District. Interdistrict applications may be obtained at the JUSD Parent Center or online at jurupausd.org between **November 12, 2024 and January 17, 2025**.
2. Intradistrict applications can be completed via Parent Connect no later than January 17, 2025. Interdistrict applications must be submitted in person to the Parent Center 4850 Pedley Road, or via email, no later than Friday, January 17, 2025. Meeting the application deadline of Friday, January 17, 2025 is critical
3. Transfers and admission to the transfer school shall be granted if the school has available space to accept transfers by grade level and the transfer was received within the open enrollment period.
4. Parents will be notified by mail in May 2025 as to the status of their request. Transportation to the transfer school is the responsibility of the parent.

Enrollment Priorities

No student currently residing within a school's attendance area shall be displaced by another student transferring from outside the attendance area. (Education code 35160.5)

Important Dates

November 12, 2024 Intradistrict applications are available via Parent Connect. Interdistrict applications may be obtained at the JUSD Parent Center or online at jurupausd.org.

January 17, 2025 Deadline to submit applications for the 2025/2026 school year.

(A random, unbiased process will be used in cases where the number of applicants exceeds the available space.)

Before you Apply, Please Consider:

Parents who wish incoming kindergarteners to attend the same transfer school as other siblings **must** apply for a transfer. School(s) closed to transfers are also closed to siblings.

Any student entering 7th or 9th grade wishing to attend a school other than the school of residence must apply for a transfer.

If you are anticipating a move which will change your school of residence, and you wish your child to remain at their present school, you must apply for a transfer.

Secondary students should make every possible effort to apply during the open enrollment period. It is difficult to accommodate student schedules outside of the open enrollment period.

MEETING RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS: (Education Code 48204)

Students shall have complied with the residency requirements for school attendance provided they:

- a. are living with a parent/guardian or caregiver within the district, or
- b. are an emancipated minor living in the district, or
- c. are living in a licensed foster home, family home, state hospital, or licensed children's institution within the district, or
- d. are granted an interdistrict transfer based on the parent/guardian being employed within the boundaries of the school district.

Program Options in the District:

A variety of programs are available in the Jurupa Unified School District. A brief description of each program is provided below.

Career Pathways/ Project Lead Way – At each of our comprehensive high schools, Career Technical Pathways are offered that provide students the opportunity to gain specific training and skills in high demand careers that will enable them to either continue their education or seek employment after graduation from high school. Each high school provides various pathway offerings. Specific career options are listed under each high school.

Career Technical Education Programs – Various programs at different high schools.

STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) – STEAM offers concentrated programs in science, technology, engineering, arts & mathematics.

Integrated Music—Academic program is enhanced through daily music curriculum in Pre-K through 6th grades. Students study music appreciation, the history of music, classical and world renown artists, as well as, learn to read, play, and participate in musical performances. Offered at Pacific Avenue Academy of Music.

Instrumental Music/Elementary – Three instrumental music teachers provide band instruction to students in grades 4th thru 6th at each elementary school, each week.

Symphony/Elementary – String instrument instruction to students in grades 4th thru 6th at specific elementary schools, each week.

Dual Language Immersion – This is a unique educational program designed to develop bilingualism and biliteracy in English and Spanish, and is open to students who speak English only and students who speak a language other than English.

Alternative Bilingual Program (ALT) – A bilingual program for English language acquisition for pupils in which much of the instruction, textbooks, and teaching materials are in the child's native language. There must be 20 students per grade level or 30 at a school site in order to comply with this request. An application must be completed through the Language Services Department.

Structured English Immersion Program – English Language Learners (ELL) receive direct instruction and materials in a Structured English Immersion Program that includes content-based English Language Development (ELD), as well as Spanish support if needed by the teacher and/or tutor. Instruction is in English and based on grade level standards. This program is recommended for all English Language Learners whose overall English proficiency level is Beginning, Early Intermediate, or Intermediate.

English Language Mainstream (ELM) – Provides instruction in English only, and is based on grade-level state standards. Students continue to receive additional and appropriate instruction, as well as English Language Development (ELD), in order to meet the requirements to be reclassified as Fluent English Proficient (FEP). This program is recommended for all English Language learners whose overall English proficiency level is Early Advanced or Advanced.

Transitional Kindergarten (TK) – This full-day program is the first year of a two-year kindergarten program. A modified kindergarten curriculum that is age and developmentally appropriate for young students is provided. Students who turn five between September 2nd and June 2nd may enroll in TK.

Special Education – Language and speech services and some specialized academic instruction are available at each school for students with exceptional needs. Enrollment in these classes will be based on the student's Individualized Education Program plan and space availability.

Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) – This program serves eligible students at each school, who have been identified as gifted and talented.

AVID ELEMENTARY (Advancement Via Individual Determination College Readiness) – AVID Elementary focus on WICOR Strategies: Writing to learn, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, Reading, and explicit focus on high expectations, rigor, and developing a college readiness culture.

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) – AVID helps prepare students for success in high school, college, and a career, especially students traditionally underrepresented in higher education. AVID is offered at middle school and high school.

Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) – This state funded program serves grades transitional kindergarten through twelfth grade with assistance from local educational partners to determine local academic priorities to improve student achievement towards college and career readiness.

Title I – This federally-funded program serves grades pre-kindergarten through twelfth for students who need additional academic support in the areas of reading, language, or math and is available at all elementary, middle school and high school sites.

Think Together – JUSD contracts with THINK Together to provide after school programs in 17 elementary schools and 3 middle schools. Programs focus on academic support, enrichment, and healthy living. Elementary programs run daily from dismissal to 6:00 p.m. Middle school programs run daily until 6:30 p.m. Attendance is required daily for all Think Together Programs.
