Advance Placement (AP) Overview

- AP[®] courses are college-level courses offered in high school
- Students are given the opportunity to learn how to handle the challenges of college-level courses
- Students take AP Exams at the end of the course, measuring their mastery of college-level work (score 1-5)



Most colleges will allow credit for a qualifying score on AP exams (typically a 3, but colleges differ in their requirements - (<u>link</u>)

Benefits of taking an AP Class

- **Challenge yourself.** Students learn to handle the demands of challenging course work. Prep for college.
- Earn college credit. (<u>link</u>)
- Taking an AP course and attempting the AP Exam is valued in the College Admissions process
- **Broaden college & career choices.** Take AP courses that will support your future career pathway.



- Administered in May 2021
- Typically 2–3 hours with multiple choice and free response
- AP exam measures student mastery of AP course content
- Score on a 1–5 scale. Goal: A score of 3 or above





• Every Patriot student taking an AP class will be taking the AP Exam

Cost: paid for by PHS & District, this year
Usually \$95/exam

Taking AP Courses

Myth	Reality
AP courses are for students who always get good grades.	AP courses are for any student who is academically prepared and motivated to take on the coursework. You have to commit to learning and preparing for college.
I have to take multiple AP courses so I can be accepted to college.	No. You don't want to load up on AP classes. Colleges are looking for students who specialize in courses that benefit a student's future career path, not some random AP load.
Taking AP courses could hurt my GPA.	AP classes earn an extra grade point. Taking an AP course shows colleges you're willing to take on an academic challenge
