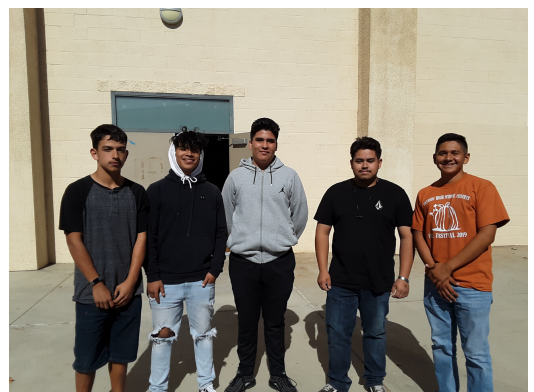

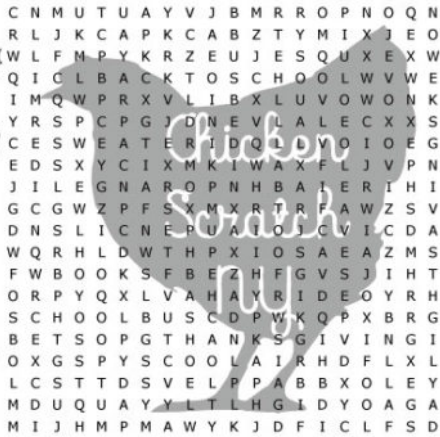

Chasing Trains in the Cajon

The Union Pacific is celebrating the 150th Anniversary of the Transcontinental Railroad by refurbishing the Union Pacific's Historical Big Boy Locomotive. There were 25 Big Boy Locomotives made, there are now only 8 Big Boy Locomotives left in existence. Out of the 8 locomotives left only one left. Big Boy No. 4014 is currently on its way around the United States. Its trek around the country started in Cheyenne, Wyoming going to El Paso, Texas; The Greater Los Angeles Area, California; Las Vegas, Nevada; and finally back to Cheyenne, Wyoming. Its journey will end on November 27, 2019 back in Cheyenne, Wyoming. This is the largest and most powerful train in the world. Attracting people from the East Coast, New Zealand, Germany, UK, Italy, Canada, and many other countries as well. No. 4014 came through the Cajon Pass on October 13, 2019 enabling these fantastic photographs to be taken by the famous Mormon Rocks.
