Session 1: June 1 – June 18 Classes meet Monday – Thursday Hours are 7:30am – 12:45pm Session 2: June 22 – July 09 Classes meet Monday – Thursday Hours are 7:30am – 12:45pm

NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. The application must be fully completed and signed by the parent and the guidance coordinator or the student will not be allowed to attend summer school.
- 2. Applications will be accepted until *March 20th*, 2020 and students will be enrolled as space is available. If they are not placed prior to the first day of summer school, they can check the final list that will be posted by 4 pm on the first day of each summer school session to see if we had any students who were "no shows" on the first day. Note: these students may only miss 1 hour of summer school for the remainder of the session. Applications will not be accepted on the first day of summer school.
- 3. Students must check the Summer School list posted on the Library Windows at PHS the last week of the regular school year to confirm their acceptance and room assignment.

Summer School Attendance and Behavior Contract

<u>Attendance Policy</u>: Summer School is an intensive and accelerated program. It is important to adhere to strict attendance and tardy procedures to assure sufficient instructional time.

- 1. Students who ARE NOT present on the first day of their summer school class will be dropped.
- Students will be dropped from a class and not receive credit if they are absent for more than six (6) hours (this includes tardies) regardless of the reason for each class.
- Tardy minutes will accumulate toward the total hours of absence. Students will be dropped for excessive tardiness.
- Excessive tardiness will be cause for removal of the student from the Summer School session. If a student is tardy four (4) times it will result in a referral to administration. If a student is tardy six (6)

What's AP



- APR courses are college-level courses offered in high school
- Courses reflect what is taught in top introductory college courses
- Students take AP Exams at the end of the course, measuring their mastery of college-level work
- A score of 3 or higher on an AP Exam can typically earn students college credit and/or placement into advanced courses in college

What are the benefits of taking an AP Class!!!

- **Stand out on college applications.** AP courses on a student's transcript shows that they've challenged themselves with the most rigorous courses available to them. And success on an AP Exam shows that they're ready for college-level coursework.
- Earn college credit and/or skip introductory courses in college. Most four-year colleges and universities in the United States—as well as many institutions in more than 100 other countries—grant students credit, placement, or both for qualifying AP Exam scores.

<u>Advanced Placement</u>



- Patriot offers 23 AP courses, AP Capstone Diploma, Honors classes, and Pre- AP classes.
- Incoming freshmen are allowed to take:
 - AP Computer Science Principles (AP Contract needed)
 - AP Human Geography (AP Contract needed)
 - Spanish Translation & Interpretation
 - Honors Math
 - Honors Biology
 - Pre-AP English

You will need to pick up an AP Contract if you are taking an AP class!

How to sign up for Honors, Pre Ap and AP Courses

- First check the prerequisite chart located on the back of the AP Contract or on the school website under AP Updates and make sure you meet the requirements.
- Next get the appropriate signatures
- You will need a signed AP Contract for the following classes: AP Computer Science Principles and/or AP Human Geography (you can pick up an AP contract in the office).
- You do not need an AP Contract if you are taking Honors or Pre-AP classes.

Many of the Honors, Pre-AP and AP courses have summer work, check with your front office the last couple weeks of school or Patriot High Schools website for AP Updates. <u>This is your responsibility</u>****

Patriot High School offers multiple support to our AP students:


- UCR AP Readiness program that provides supplemental instructional support to current AP students. Patriot offers transportation to UCR on Saturdays.
