### Features:

- The College of Court Reporting (CCR) is a leader in online court reporting programs and has the first program certified by the National Court Reporters Association (NCRA). They are also known for their ev360 Technologies software and the Moody Method of learning.
- CCR's online program has also been accredited by The Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools (ACICS) and federal financial aid is available for those that qualify.
- The online degree program can be finished in 28 months with full-time enrollment.
  - Students must take a minimum of 20 months and no more than 44 months to complete the accredited program but the time frame will depend on the student's progress.
    - CCR is on a semester calendar in which 15 academic weeks make up one semester. That is approximately 4 months and a total of 3 semesters per year beginning in October, February and June.
  - Online students will spend about an hour a week in a live, online class for every course they are taking. Additional class time will consist of an additional 18 hours of live or recorded classes weekly.
    - Students need to be spending 3-4 hours a day, 6-7 days per week practicing their machine work with classes counting towards the 18 hours requirement.
    - The college stresses that online students must have a high level of discipline to commit to the time requirements and schedules. Knowledge of computers and keyboarding are also encouraged to be successful.
    - Students are provided an email and 24/7 access to the two platforms that deliver instruction (ev360 and Blackboard Collaborative).
  - Online students are required to purchase equipment or own the technology necessary for their training. This includes approved computerized steno machines, specialized software, an internet connection, an approved Windows computer and other supplies.
  - Online students are also asked to contact a local court reporter in their area to be a mentor and proctor examinations if the student cannot test on campus.
