Summary of findings:

Student input on their current barriers to success and suggested supports that would help them be more successful.

Barriers	Supports
Academic Stress (60%)	Having someone to talk to (49%)
Athlete Stress (28%)	Subject specific tutoring <u>after</u> school (25%)
Family Stress (15%)	Family/Friend activities/Workshops DURING school hours (20%)
Communicating Needs (24%)	Free Food (like a food pantry) (30%)
Mental Health (24%)	Subject specific tutoring <u>before</u> school (7%)
Language Limitations(English Learners) (54%)	First language support (15%)



Community School Goals:

Students ranked Rubidoux success at implementing each of these goals on a scale from 1 to 4, 1 being the lowest and 4 being the highest. In addition, students were asked about

their preference for how Saturday School was structured.

Saturday School Structure	Study Hall: 28% Subject Specific: 21% Financial Literacy: 21% STEAM/Gaming/Coding: 30%

Things to note:

- Students care about their academic success
- Students struggle with finding a balance between academics, extracurricular activities, and family
- Students want a trusted person to talk to in multiple settings
- Students want better tutoring
- Students feel food insecure
- Mixed feedback on use of Saturday School- split between desire for study hall and structured academic supports
- It would be beneficial to have follow-up questions for the community school goals to give students a chance to explain their ranking
- How can we build on their desire for better connections?
